

Public Increases Stock Market Action

By GORDON J. TOLL er. Security Associates, Inc.

The prospects of further labor trouble in January, or of tighter money, or of congressional airing of questionable sees, don't seem to deter the American public from confewed participation in the stock market. Mutual fund sales have been high and rising all year. The public seems to be mying that stocks are continuously going to be preferable to ads, even with the highest interest yield in nearly 30 years—and such public conviction can go'a long way toward making it come true.

D. Moreau Barringer of Delaware Management Com-nany, Inc. reveals the fund completed three new positions lately in common stocks. They are: Eastern Air Lines, American Airlines, and Phillips Petroleum. The reasons for the above purchases were: Eastern and American have been suffering from the heavy costs of buying and integrating jet planes into their operations, a process which largely will be completed during 1960. "As the traffic builds up to occupy the extra seats thus made available, and the break-in costs are remained it is expected that asymings of both times will are completed, it is expected that earnings of both lines will show a smart recovery." The reasoning behind the Phillips Pets purchase was this: the stock had come down over 20 per cent from its 1959 high point, and the yield had risen to 4 per cent (a well-known low paying stock). The petroleum giant has been spending practically the whole of its cash cornings in development for the past eight years; "Indications are that such investments are nearing completion, and e company's earnings will get a chance to expand importently in the next few years." There are many question marks about the future of the oil industry but in some cases the owered prices of the stocks had satisfactorily offset the worsened outlook.

At the 20th annual meeting of the American Petroleum Institute recently, the following was disclosed: The Russian potential in future oil markets was discussed by Theodore shahad, specialist on Russian affairs, foreign news section, New York Times. In his address he stated that by 1965 Russie would have about "500,000 barrels per day available for export. The rapid expansion of Russian oil production is demonstrated by the 15 per cent annum increase over the past ten years. In 1950, exports were 22,000 barrels per day, or about 8 per cent of production, of which some 80 per cent went to other communistic countries. In 1958, exports rose to 60,000 harrels per day, equivalent to 16 per cent of production, and ever one-half went to countries outside the communistic bloc. It appears inevitable that Russian exports of ell by 1965 will be of major significance in adding to world

The article, "Eye Health Program in Public Schools" was writon by Drs. Lawrence J. Lawson Jr. and Robert A. McGuigan and Irma B. Fricke, a registered nurse. All three are associated with the Northwestern University Medical School and Evanston Hospital. Their findings were based on a study of 15,801 children in the Evanston Community Consolidated Schools.

While the researchers found 17 per cent of the children in need of eye care, they discovered an even higher percentage with some degree of mear-sightedness. They estimated that mear-sightedness among school children ranges from 20 per cent among kindergarleners to 77 per cent among ighth graders.

The article advised prompt treatment of eye conditions among school children to avoid psychological - maladjustment and long therapy. It suggested that school systems set up a program for early recognition of eye defects that require professional care.
