



opinion on its ruling that the basis for the ruling wasn't im mediately known "It means, in the minds of the Supreme Court," Markey said, "that Circuit Judge Joe A. Cowart's actions to this point haven't been such as to invoke the extraordinary power to stop

On Dec. 3 Cowart received the Seminole Grand Jury interim report and four indictments and immediately ordered them sealed. It is believed that the sealing of indictments is without precedence in the state. Markey said Herring "can always seek new indictments to

eliminate any deficiencies that judge Cowart may have found in the original indictments.'

He also said Herring "may also file direct information: charging persons who were named in the original indictments. I'm confused," Markey said, "because this docsn't follow normal rules applicable. I don't know - I'm sort of guessing who goes next."

The Supreme Court ruling immediately gave rise to local speculation that the Seminole County Grand Jury may go back nto session Monday or early next week concerning the reported county government probe and indictments Judge Cowart Jr. wasn't available at press time for com-



# Senator Claims Kissinger

# May Have Perjured Self

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate intelligence committee's investigation of U.S. /overt operations in Chile "indicates that perjury may have been committed" by Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and three other present or former top U.S. officials, according to Sen.

Gary Hart. Hart, a Democrat from Colorado, stopped short of calling any of them a liar. Instead, he cited examples of their statements to other congressional committees "which appear to be misleading at best, or, perhaps, perjurious."

The other three mentioned by Hart are former CIA Director Richard M. Helms, former U.S. Ambassador to Chile Edward Korry and Charles Meyer, assistant secretary of state for inter-American affairs.

### Ford, Congress Battle

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford and Congress are girding for a veto battle that will determine whether Americans find their income taxes increased by about 8 per cent on the first day of 1976.

A bipartisan group of senators met with the President late Thursday to discuss differences on legislation to extend last year's tax cuts into the new year, but the session ended in a deadlock. Sen. Russell Long, DLa., told reporters after the meeting with Ford, "We were unable to agree on anything."

Ford told the lawmakers he will y measure if it is sent to him without an attached spending ceiling of \$395 billion for the next fiscal year.

## **Governor Gets Carter Report**

TRENTON, N.J. (AP) - A state assemblyman who studied the Rubin "Hurricane" Carter case says "there's a lot more going on than people think."

Assemciyman Eldridge Hawkins, D-Essex, reportedly uncovered a previously unknown witness to a triple slaying in Paterson, N.J., for which Carter, a former ranking middlweight boxing contender, and John Artis were given life sentences.

Hawkins turned his report over to Gov. Brendan T Byrne Wednesday night, but the New Jersey governor refused Thursday to disclose the contents of the report or indicate what influence it will have on his decision

### **Postal Loss Underestimated**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The financially ailing Postal Service says it lost \$161 million more during the last fiscal year than the record deficit officials had earlier an-

The Postal Service severely underestimated workers compensation payments to employes injured during the fiscal year, a spokeswoman said Thursday. The service only recently learned of the higher workers

compensation costs from the Labor Department, making the Postal Service deficit \$989 million for the last fiscal year instead of the previous estimate of \$828 million, she

### **Hoffa Probers Search Dump**

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) - Federal investigators are eadying equipment to dig up a Jersey City refuse dump in a search for the body of an underworld figure and, sources say, the body of former Teamsters boss James R.

Officials refused to say, however, when the excavation would begin at the 60-acre site known as Moscato's Dump, a landfill that has not been used for years.

Sources said the informant who supplied t formation was a convicted member of organized crime who may be trying to trade information about Hoffa in return for leniency in an unrelated case.

## **Offshore Drilling Approved**

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The sale of leasing rights on about 70 offshore oil drilling tracts has cleared the way for new coastal wells, but environmentalists say they're undaunted in their resolve to fight further leases.

Though they failed to block the Interior Department's aucton of drilling rights on virgin offshore oil land, the opponents of the program may have had some hand in the lower-than-expected bidding.





Daniel Patrick Moynihan, in a riposte to the General Assembly's adoption of a resolution equating Zionism with racism, has proposed a worldwide amnesty for political prisoners.

Even though Moynihan's resolution was withdrawn it had real merit. He counseled the nations that voted to

denounce Israel to look to the condition of human rights in their own countries. The Soviet Union, for example, voted for the

Zionism resolution. Yet Amnesty International, based in London, reports that there are "at least 10,000 political and religious prisoners" being held in Soviet prisons and all are being mistreated. Brazil, which voted for the Zionism resolution,

is under a military dictatorship which has refused to tolerate peaceful dissent. A Roman Catholic bishop recently led two million protestors in a fast against the imprisonment and torture of political prisoners in Brazil and other countries.

India, which also voted for the Zionism resolution, is under emergency one-woman rule. The government has imprisoned thousands of its opponents.

There cannot be a selective standard of international morality, either for the United States or the United Nations.

We must not smile upon dictators who practice repression and approve them as "good guys" simply because they are "our guys."

By the same token, the U.N. majority must not criticize the Israelis for what it calls offenses against human rights while condoning far worse offenses in Third World and Communist countries. As Moynihan said, unless we care about human

rights everywhere, we don't really care about them anywhere. Concern for human freedom is the highest ideal to which humanity can aspire.

There cannot be a double standard.

three months. These are ugly doings, and even worse is the violence in Northern Ireland itself. No thoughtful American can condone this business, much less encourage it.

# Amnesty In Spain

King Juan Carlos I has taken the first tentative step toward reconcilation in Spain. He has granted a general amnesty for political prisoners to celebrate his ascension to the throne after the death of Gen. Francisco Franco.

Some prisoners will be freed immediately. Others will have their terms reduced. None will be executed for crimes committed before Carlos was sworn in.

# DON OAKLEY **Report Nips** The Doubts **On Assassin**

cent of the American people now believe the report of the Warren Commission - that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in the assassination of John F. Kennedy.

Yet, strangely, only 45 per cent think the investigation should be reopened. In other words, while 85 per cent of those polled don't believe they have been told the full story of what happened in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963, something like half of these non-believers do not support the growing chorus of calls for another official examination of the tragedy. There may be a number of explanations for

this seeming paradox. Either many people do not care, or no longer care, about what happened to the 35th president. which does not seem likely.

Or, more ominously, many Americans have grown to distrust their government so much that hey believe another investigation of the assassination would be no more trustworthy than that of the Warren Commission, upon which the critics have been heaping doubts and scorn d. for more than a decade.

Or, as seems more probable, many people may simply believe that if the Warren Commission did not arrive at the complete, undisputable and uncontradictable truth about the Watch out that some special interest group is assassination, it came as close as it was possible

# **Released From Spanish Jail**

MADRID, Spain (AP) - Spain's top Communist labor leader Marcelino Camacho was released by court order today from prison, where he had been held without charge since Sunday.

The 57-year-old Camacho had been pardoned from prison Nov. 29 but was rearrested Sunday at the time of a scheduled demonstration called by the outlawed Communist party to demand amnesty for political prisoners. The demonstration was not held as scheduled outside Madrid's Carabanchel Prison, but 150 persons were reported arrested in the area.

## Angola Spending Cited WASHINGTON (AP) - The United States has spent

nearly \$50 million in aiding two antiSoviet factions in the Angolan civil war, The Washington Post said in Friday's

In a story that quoted unidentified informed sources, the new spaper said the bulk of the U.S.-supplied military equipment has been sent to the former Portugese African colony in the last six months and that most of it is being funneled through neighboring Zaire. Recipients of the reported aid are the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA) and the National Front for thr Liberation of Angola (FNLA), which are battling the Soviet-backed Popular Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA).

# Moslems Besiege Christians

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Leftist Moslem gunmen besieging the last major Christian position in the heart of Beirut vowed today to ignore all cease-fire agreements until they drive their foes from the downtown hotel district.

"The cease-fire is not binding until the Phalangists get out of the Holiday Inn," said a Nasserite lieutenant running an operations room in the Palm Beach Hotel. "We will not lay down arms until the district is purged of Phalangists, even if the state and the army threaten us. When the area comes under our complete control, it will be reopened to tourism and business."

# Inflammation Of **Prostate Gland**

By Lawrence E. Lamb, M.D. DEAR DR. LAMB - What is prostatitis? Why does a young man in his mid 20s get this? My mother says a man is running around with other women, straining his prostate gland which results in the prostatitis. Please help to clear this up one way or the other. It's on my mind quite

DEAR READER - Your mother may mean well, but she is misinformed and her statement could be causing a ot of unnecessary trouble. She is repeating a frequent misconception that has caused other people a lot of unhap-

Prostatitis means inflammation of the prostate gland, just as the ending "itis" means inflammation as applied to appendicitis. bronchitis, laryngitis, gastritis, cystitis and so on. The inflammation can be,

and in the the case of a young man usually is, caused by some bacteria. The bacteria involved in most cases is not one that is transmitted by sexual activity at all. A common source of the infection is one of the bacteria in the colon which some way escapes and lodges in the crypts of the prostate gland. Some urologists believe that such an infection is more likely to develop in a person who is not having as much sex as might be optimal and the overdistended prostate gland gets boggy and is more likely to

become infected. It is true that the prostate gland can be involved in a venereal infection, but, again, the bacteria commonly involved in most cases of prostatitis are different ger-

ms entire'y. The kind of prostatitis that a nan commonly gets when he is older is often related to enlargement of the gland. This may be from some hormonal imbalance or from chronic infection.
