**Food Prices Will Spiral**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Government experts are having second thoughts about their previous optimistic forecast that the increase in food prices this year might be held to between 2 and 2.5 per cent.

The Agriculture Department is in the process of re-examining its earlier projection, "and it may be that we'll find the outlook for food prices will rise as much as 3 per cent over last year," an official said. This still would be an improvement over last year when food prices soared 4.5 per cent.

The department is scheduled to issue a summary report on the national food situation May 1. Sources say the revised food cost analysis to be included in the report will reflect a larger gain than previously expected.

Last week it was reported that food prices went up four-tenths of one per cent in March — a month in which grocery prices normally remain level. The previous month had shown a drop of two-tenths of a per cent.

**Solons Suddenly \$\$ Conscious**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate has backed away, at least temporarily, from approving extra pay raises for congressional officials after questions by some members about why they should get less money than their leaders.

When the bill calling for raising the leaders' pay as much as \$12,500 a year reached the Senate floor Tuesday, Sen. John C. Stennis, D-Miss., objected. "I don't think it costs the speaker (of the House) any more to live in Washington than it costs me," he said.

The bill, already passed by the House, would raise the pay of the vice president and House speaker from \$13,000 to \$20,500 a year. The president pro temp of the Senate and the majority and minority leaders of both the Senate and the House would get pay raises from \$12,500 to \$15,000 a year.

Caught in the middle when the dispute broke out unexpectedly was Vice President Spiro T. Agnew, whose pay raise wasn't opposed. In fact, Pastore suggested that only the vice president get the raise.

And indications of agreement from other senators, Sen. Peter Dominick, D-Colo., made a formal motion to give only Ag-

new a raise.

Sen. Gale McGee, D-Wyo., interrupted and asked that the bill be recommitted to his Post Office and Civil Service Committee which had approved the measure.

That motion carried, 41-21.

Earlier this year, Congress raised the President's pay from \$100,000 to \$200,000 a year.

Shortly thereafter, members of the House accepted for themselves a \$12,500 annual increase that sent their salaries to \$42,500.

That boost, which also saw substantial raises go to federal judges and top officials in the executive department, was the first under a new procedure that does not require a direct vote by Congress.

Unless either the House or Senate vetoes the raises, they take effect automatically 30 days after the President recommends them.

Joining Pastore were several economy-minded senators, including Sen. Harry F. Byrd, D-Va.

"The first thing we did this year was to double the President's salary and the second thing we did was to raise our own pay," Byrd said.

"And while we are doing this we are asking the taxpayers of this nation not only to cope with this terrible inflation but to pay a 10 per cent surtax that we tell them will cure this inflation."

**Minimum Cop's Pay**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — A minimum foundation program for law enforcement officers which would guarantee policemen a minimum \$8,000 annual salary was introduced in the Legislature Tuesday.

The bill provides a formula for distribution of \$2 million in state aid for the first year, according to the sponsors — Senate President John Mathews, D-Jacksonville, and Rep. Joe Chapman, D-Panama City.

Law enforcement officers taking part in the program would be required to meet minimum education and training requirements.

"It provides us with a good running start at the root of where our law enforcement begins, the local level," the lawmakers said.

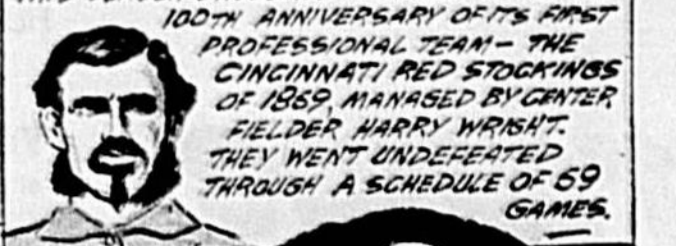
