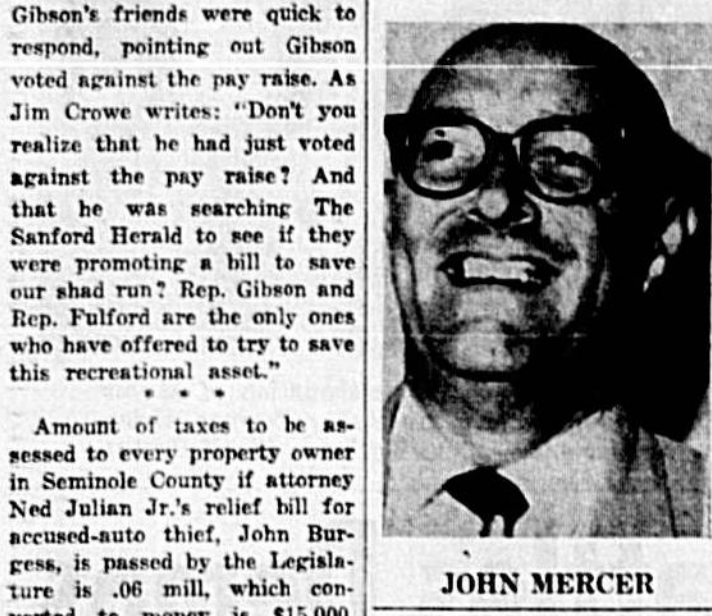

Sanford Manor Opens New \$360,000 Wing

High demand for the rehabilitation and convalescent facilities of Sanford Manor Inc., an extended care center completed only nine months ago

The original building, completed last August, was completely filled in the first 45 days of operation," says administrator John V. Jenkins. "That's why we had to add 50 more beds in three months."

The wing, which will accommodate 56 more beds in three semi-private rooms, has been color coordinated with the rest of the Manor to carry out the home-like atmosphere. Each room is equipped with a complete bath and two lavatories, and the extremely wide air-conditioned and heated connecting corridor has been provided with comfortable benches for the patients.

Additional benefits of the new wing are provision of a new generator for emergency electrical power, as well as the addition of a new all-faith chapel in the original building, made possible by the remodeling of space provided by the new facility.

As in the rest of Sanford Manor, doors are electronically controlled, allowing patients continuously for one hour on all four sides, would still be stronger than a 8-1/2 inch board never touched by fire. Even when exposed to fire, thick wood members retain their strength for long periods of time.

The 62 employees in Sanford and 80 at DeBary Manor bring a weekly payroll of \$20,000 to the area, and more employees will be hired as the new wing is filled and facility enlarged.

The wing is Step Two of a master plan to bring the capacity of Sanford Manor to 500 beds in the future.

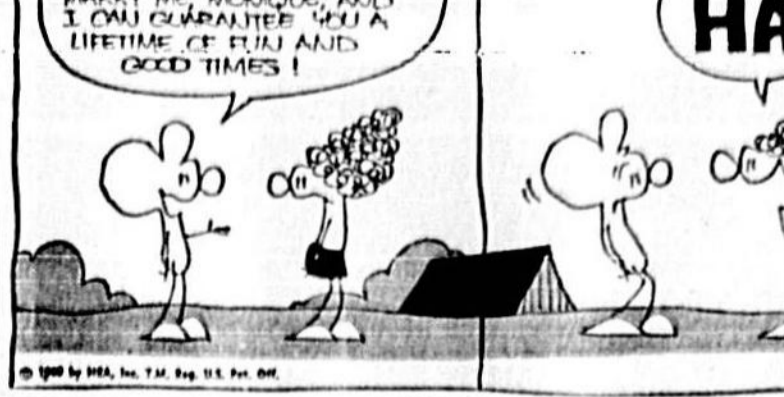
