





Unleaded Gas: 'Tilt' **Upward?**

United Press International U.S. energy officials oday announced a new fuel pricing plan that could drive up gasoline prices more than 12 cents a gallon in two years. The United States also joined 19 other countries in pledging to cut oil consumption by 5 percent this year as a

hedge against anticipated shortages.
The Energy Department said its "gasoline tilt" pricing plan could let average gasoline prices rise as much as 12.4 cents a gallon in the next two years and may help push unleaded gas prices to \$1 a

Soviet President Leonid Breshney today demanded an immediate halt to China's war with Vietnam and pledged anew that the Soviet Union would honor its treaty commitments to Vietnam.

He called Peking's policies the "gravest threat to world peace. Breshney made his demand in a Moscow speech shortly after Vietnam rejected a Chinese call for negotiations to end their 14day-old war as "deceit," insisting that China withdraw its troops pefore talks can be considered. Breshney, whose speech to an election meeting in Moscow was circulated in advance by Novosti Press Agency, did not appear to make any specific threats of Soviet retaliation against Peking.

"The Soviet people, together with all peace-loving nations of the world, demand an immediate end to the Chinese aggression against Victness and the withdrawal of all interventionist troops o the last midler from Vistnamese land," Breshney said. "Our friendship with freternal Vietnam has been tested in practice for many years. Now, too, at this difficult hour for the Vietnamese people we wholly and entirely identify ourselves with

He called Peking's policies "the gravest threat to world peace." Breshnev's remarks followed a Soviet warning Thursday that the Soviets will not abandon Vietnam "in a time of distress." Begin On Carter Parley:

'An Encouraging One'

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Carter and Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin had two meetings on tap today, and will wind up the day with the president attending a Jewish Sabbath dinner hosted by Begin at Blair House. The two leaders today were pursuing last-ditch peace talks that began with a harsh warning against trying to pressure Israel into signing a "sham" treaty. and ended in a lovefest

Begin, who came to Washington breathing fire and began his visit with a harsh warning against trying to pressure Israel into signing a "sham" treaty, ended up, after a two-hour meeting with Carter, all sweetness and light. He told reporters, "...It was an excellent meeting — an encouraging one. There has not been one difficult moment. It has been one of the most important conversations I have had with the United States."

Iran 'Parallel' Regime Ends

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) - Premier Mehdi Bazargan says Iran's revolutionary councils will be absorbed into the government and his deputy announced an end to private trials. The moves to end Iran's "parallel government" and halt trials by secret tribunals are two more steps to return Iran to normalcy following the turmoil of the successful Islamic



Overtime Pay Ruling In Limbo In Lake Mary

The Lake Mary City Council voted 4-1 Thursday to pay Alford \$366.30 for 66 hours of over-time he had built up over the past year.

City Manager Phil Kulbes recommended the payment. "I personally believe Mr. Alford should get this pay," Kulbes said, " because he could have taken this time off during the last two weeks he was here, but was asked to stay on and work during Only Councilman Pat Southward voted against Kulbes'

She said her vote was an effort to maintain the council's policy

of paying only up to 40 hours for compensatory time. "Reggie did a good job," commented Mrs. Southward, "but a policy is a policy. If we talk to Chief Benson about staying within that policy. I don't see how we can turn around and grant Reggie's

Dim Outlook For The Poor

That ugly word has invaded our consciousness **Conce** again: Recession.

The Index of Economic Indicators, compiled ach month to gauge the direction of our economy and issued Thursday, has given rise once again to Fears of such a sad state of economic affairs.

According to most economists, three conecutive months of declining rates signal an approaching recession. And that's what we have had. And who is hurt most by the continuing downrend of our economy? Members of our lower socioeconomic structure.

No wonder black leaders are standing in line to take potshots at President Carter's willingness to sacrifice social programs in the name of economy and inflation-fighting.

The economic indicator news came right on the heels of similar accusations made by congressional black leaders and representatives.

It's a familiar refrain, and follows by only several days suggestion by Vernon E. Jordan Jr. president of the National Urban League, that 1979 is "a year of crisis for America's black people."

He has a point. Tighter welfare and social service budgets in Washington and elsewhere in the country may be debated on a philosophical level by the stillcomfortable middle class.

But for the poor, including a disproportionate share of blacks, these cutbacks can represent painful reductions in already-stretched family

Fattening the federal budget is no answer. All economists agree that fiscal austerity is absolutely essential if inflation is to be checked. And, as President Carter noted recently, inflation savages the poor and those on fixed incomes far worse than those whose relative affluence provides some

The fact is, the inflation of recent years has been at least partly responsible for the decelerating pace of black economic gains.
The solution, for blacks no less than others, lies

in John F. Kennedy's sage observation that "a rising tide lifts all boats.' Without economic growth, the upward mobility

and opportunity that are the historic strengths of our economic life are necessarily curtailed. Whatever 1979 holds for blacks, real and

sustained economic growth in the 1980s is the key to their aspirations for the future.

Carter's Current Complexity

WASHINGTON (NEA) - President Carter, in a scramble to recapture respect at home and abroad for his foreign policy leadership, has taken to preaching the virtues of reason and restraint in a complex and changing world.

It is not a message to stir the blood, and it is not what his critics are clamoring to hear, but the new Carter sermon contains the seeds of a longoverdue and badly needed clarification of the philosophic underpinnings and practical objectives of this administration's foreign policy. Carter, as usual, has no one to blame but himself for the confusion which has led so many Americans, and perhaps foreign leaders as well, to question his grasp of world affairs and his capacity to cope with them.

In his two years as president, he has failed to articulate in a clear and comprehensible fashion exactly what he believes the United States can realistically expect to accomplish on the world

Carter does not try to use the White House as a 'bully pulpit." Lacking eloquence, he simply abdicates his role as educator and opinionshaper - creating a vacuum his critics hasten to fill. He thus pays a heavy price, as he is doing now, when the public fails to find the wisdom of

Twice in the last week - at Georgia Tech on Feb. 20 and here in Washington on Feb. 22 before LIGHTER SIDE a conference of editors and broadcasters Carter finally started to explain his view of the U.S. role in world affairs.

He was driven to speak out by the rush of events in Iran, in Afghanistan, in Southeast Asia which appeared, on the surface, to embarrass and perhaps even threaten this country and its

What he said at those gatherings made pretty good sense. Carter cautioned against oversimulification, a tendency to "see all change as

From Home In N.J. Blaze

TRENTON, N. J. (UPI) - A fire in a blocklong industrial complex forced the evacuation of about 1,000 people from the area because of fears of toxic fumes, officials said, but the gases later were found to be harmless.

Officials initially feared the burning plastic in one building in the complex was producing hydrochloric acid and deadly phosgene gas, one of the nerve gases used by Germany in World War I.

(UPI) - Stage and silent screen film star Dolores Costello, the third wife of the adventurous "Great Lover" John Barrymore, died Thursday at Fallbrook Hospital after a brief illness. She was 73. Miss Costello had been living in retirement for several years at her avocado ranch in San Diego County. Funeral arrangements were incomplete.

Gas Shortages Overstated?

By UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL In such widely diverse places as Philadelphia, Tulsa, Okla., and White Plains, N.Y., among others, various oil companies have announced the allocation of gasoline supplies and the cutting of hours at service: stations to offset the tight supply situation created by the Iranian cutoff in oil imports Paradoxically, an analysis by the Library of Congress, commissioned by Rep. Albert Gore. D-Tenn., says the current worldwide oil shortage has been overstated by about 700 percent. The Energy Department termed the analysis faulty because it compared present oil production estimates with last year's abnormally low production period. One energy official called the study"flat wrong, just dead wrong. It's preposterious."

Voyager 'Closer' To Jupiter

PASADENA, Calif. (UPI) — Voyager about 2.5 million miles from Jupiter today, will pass within 172,000 miles of the planet Monday and then examine its satellites, Io, Ganymede, Europa and Callisto, before racing on to explore the ringed planet Saturn in November 1980. "In the next few days, we'll explore four new worlds," said Dr. Laurence Soderblom, a project geologist, Thursday.

Ice Mass Creeps Toward Town

SAGUACHE, Colo. (UPI) — A 6-squaremile mass of ice is creeping along Saguache Creek on the southern border of the small town of Saguache at the rate of about 1 mile a week and also is spreading sideways from the creek. It could reach occupied areas in two to three weeks. County Administrator Michael Wynn says the town may be destroyed when the ice hits those occupied areas. And, he says, "If it thaws, we're finished. The ice is bad enough, but that amount of water released all of a sudden would be a major catastrophe. Parts of Saguache are 50 feet below water level, and a runoff would sweep through the town like a tidal wave."

200 Flood-Routed Relaxing


