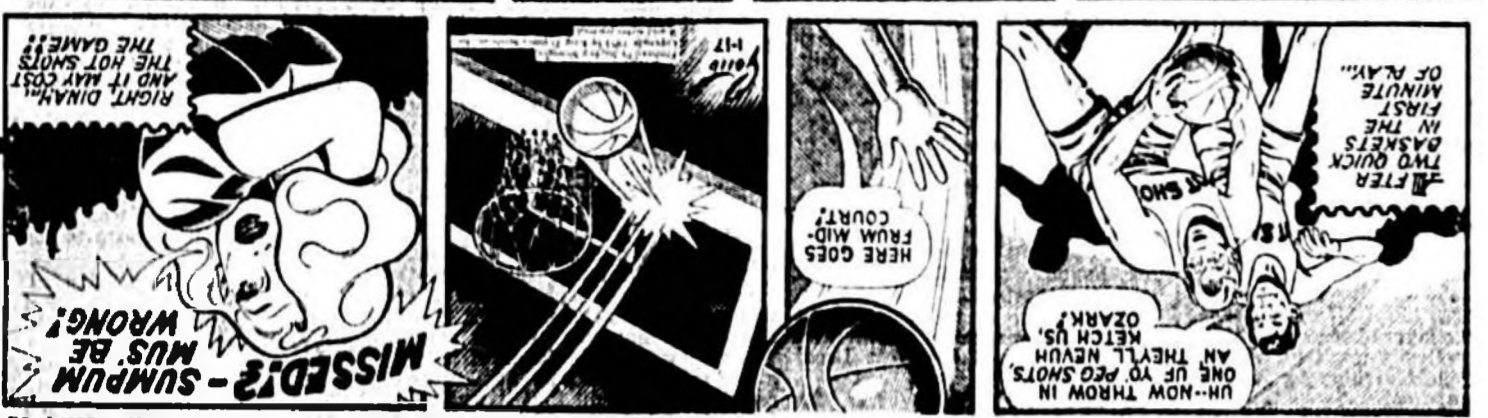

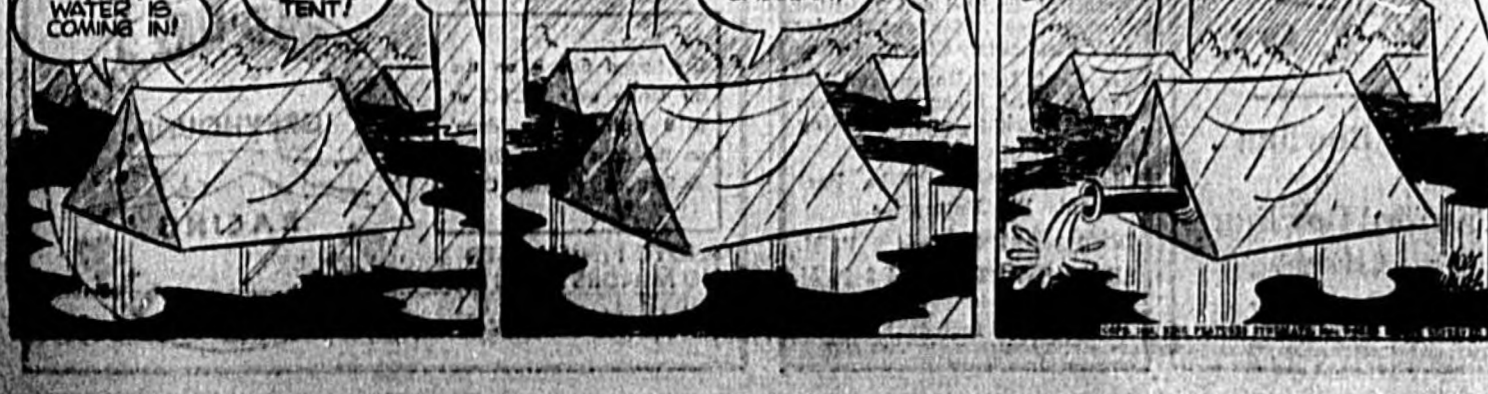

Convicts Defy Jail Officials In Angry Riot

Hundreds Of Police- men Ring Prison As Inmates Continue Riotous Activities

PITTSBURGH — Rioting convicts, who set fire and caused havoc in the western Penitentiary today defied officials backed by the armed might of Pennsylvania. The cold and hungry convicts, who were taken to five jails captured originally and angrily shouted for prison reform. They smashed windows and opened police who stood with tear gas and machine guns ready to mow down and prisoner break-up call blocks.

After William and Claudy confessed, other officials said a number to force the convicts to surrender is expected before the arrival of William B. Brown, state secretary of welfare, director of prisons, and District Attorney James Malone. Both were reported en route by plane from Washington.

Oviedo Bank Has Gain In Deposits Of Over 25,000

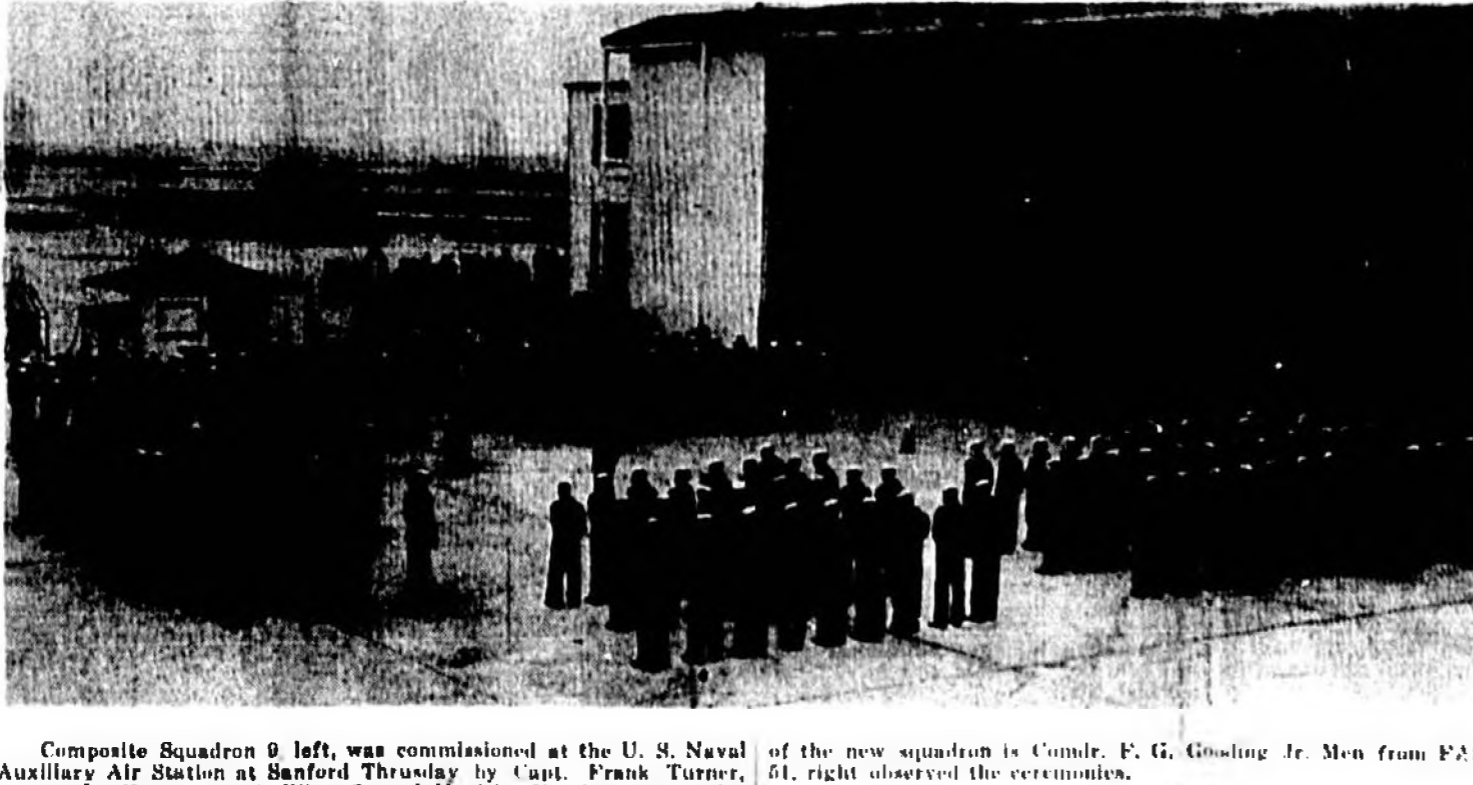
