





The Wage-Hour Bill

Indicating that the wage-hour bill which was nated in the special session of Congress lastsmonth ot a dead issue, and suggesting that the measure is spired primarily by communistic and radical agitators, Senator Pat Harrison of Mississippi, in the current issue of Collier's magazine, declares his intention of opposing it to the bitter end.

President Is Not E pected To TakePa

"Southern workers prefer to work out their wage problems through their own co-operation, not influenced or dictated to by the Communist, radical or extreme agitators," says the Mississippi Senator. "They are not for-setful of what happened to the goose that laid the golden erg." Pointing to the abundance of natural resources that are to be found in the south and the forces that have been at work in developing them, he says that any interference at this time will destroy all of the progress

that has been made so far. "The star of industrial hope has just begun to shine in the South," the Senator writes. "Hundreds of thousands of people are employed in the oil, lumber and cotton textile industries. And these are only a few of the many. The South is fearful of any move that might destroy, retard or affect an industrial position that has been gained through long years of weary waiting and Herculean efforts." DAY, JANUARY - 24- 1938

To support his claim that in many cases low wages and longer working hours are both fair and satisfactory to the workers in the South, he says that living conditions are cheaper than in other parts of the country. Also the Senator argues that the government itself realized the justice of this issue when it established differential rates in the disbursement of public relief funds.

Thus because a farmer on relief in the South could live more cheaply than a city dweller in the North, his WPA relief checks were lower than the northern relief worker's. Sometimes the discrepancy was as much as forty percent of the pay issued. The Mississippi Senator asks why if the Government itself accepted this fact, it now objects to a similar condition arising in industry?

Because of the many advantages that the South offers industrials in the way of proximity to raw material and cheap labor, southern states are just entering an ers Harrison. At the present time many of the budding in-dustries are struggling for their very existence. To force them to accept wage-hour legislation and the additional financial burden that such legislation would entail would plunge many of them into bankruptcy.
