

# Voters Dunk Askew's Hopes With Anti-Busing Returns

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)-Floridians have had their first falling out with Gov. Reubin Askew, dunking his vice presidential possibilities in a floodtide of antibusing votes.

All the Democratic presidential candidates who said during the Florida primary campaign that Askew would make "a fine vice president," can hardly afford to pick a governor who could be in serious trouble in his home state and throughout his region.

Askew, is in after raising \$46,000 in two weeks and stumping the state against the antibusing proposal that passed with 74 per cent of the vote Tuesday

Just four months ago, Florida's voters gave Askew a 7-3 margin on his corporate income tax.

"I think that with the Florida primary being over that the talk about who will be the vice president will be shifting to Illinois, then on to Wisconsin and then on to California." Askew said.

He reiterated previous statements that he is not interested in being vice president.

But Askew could be a factor in national politics in the future if he can mend his fences in Florida. House Speaker Richard Pettigrew, D-Miami, said the public recognizes the governor's support of busing came from 'great personal conviction."

"They have tremendous confidence in the governor and the fact they disagree with him on one issue is not going to hurt him," Pettigrew said.







## **Editorial Comment**

# Make "Accountable" Your Vote Test

As voters start their "long march - (bows to the Nixon-Mao dialogue)" to the polling booths with the end for Sanford citizens hid in the mists of December and the municipal election, there is one word which they should keep in mind.

This is "accountable." Webster defines it as "liable to be called upon to render account." It is such common sense, when applied to elected officials, and so definite that the political process has evaded its application, wherever and however possible.

Florida has now the opportunity - indeed the inescapable obligation - to re-destrict and apportion its representation in the legislature so as to make the legislator accountable in fact, as he is in theory, to the ones who put him on the public payroll by ballots.

Boiled down to its essence, this is why we believe that only by giving Seminole County the status of a single district can true accountability be afforded the taxpayers of this growing and vigorous county.

Even while the presidential primaries have been taking — quite properly — the headlines as Florida undertakes to show its value as a reliable political weathervane - the groundwork for this re-districting has been going on in Tallahassee.

It will emerge as one of the most important actions the 1972 state legislature can take. If it fails to meet the requirements - for congressional districts, a population of 452,729 and for legislative (if the 120-seat House is approved) 56,591 - then it goes to the courts.

In advocating a single district for Seminole County we are moved by a conviction that only by this means can the voter be assured that his vote is more than a meaningless gesture which has, within itself, no power of demanding responsiveness and accountability.

With these, the voter (and many who do not now exercise this civic privilege) would be given a means to rouse out of apathy the non-voter and gain the self-confidence which would make the roots of democratic government deeper and

Politicians, of course, are not the only ones who shun this standard of accountability. It is rampant in every area of human activity. Looked at with the broadest application of its importance, it can be defined as the spur which now is pricking at big business and big labor to get on with some self-cleansing.

To be sure the further away the governmental operation is being performed, the harder it is for the voter to see what is going on and apply this yardstick of accountability.

# Soviet Bases In Cuba Worry U.S.

GOLD ON THE HOOF

Copley News Service MIAMI - Traffic of Russian warships, submarines and spy planes between the Soviet Union and Cuba has become brisk, and some of it nears U.S. shores, spilling into the Gulf of Mexico.

That is the testimony of U.S. Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) officers before the House subcommittee on Inter-American affairs.

DIA witnesses detailed six Soviet naval deployments to Cuba, starting in July, 1969, when a guided missile cruiser, two destroyers, two submarines and a submarine tender steamed into Cuban ports. Maj. Gerald Cassell, DIA Cuban

area analyst, testified also: "The combatants conducted antisubmarine warfare exercises in the Gulf of Mexico." It was DIA detection of naval movements to Cuba plus construction activity in Cuba's Cienfuegos harbor area that led to the 1970 mini-crisis between the United States and the Soviet Union. The Soviets were believed building a nuclear

submarine base in Cienfuegos. The fifth Soviet naval contingent to Cuba began arriving in Havana Feb. 10, 1971, Cassell testified. "the cruiser (one of the vessels involved) left for Havana the 15th of February and completed a circuit of the Gulf of Mexico, passing to within 50 miles of the Louisiana coast," he said

"The cruiser proceeded to Cienfuegos to join a . . nuclear-powered attack submarine which had been in that port since Feb. 14." Cassell also reported that two Soviet hydrographic ships "are currently operating in the Gulf of

The subcommittee hearing on "Soviet Naval Activities in Cuba" began Sept. 28. A transcript of the testimony, with many security deletions, was released recently. Regarding the hydrographic vessels, Cassel said, "The Soviets have been conducting research in the Caribbean and

the Gulf of Mexico on currents, temperatures, salinity . . . Certainly the Soviets must have the types of information outlined . . . if they plan submarine operations."

The sixth Soviet flotilla movement to Cuba, on May 25,

missile submarine and a submarine tender. The officer said a Soviet intelligence collection ship joined the tender on June 6. "This was the first time such a unit has called at any Western Hemisphere port,"he said.

The spy ship, he testified, "had been operating off the U.S. Subcommittee Chairman Dante Fascell, a Florida Democrat, asked the range of missiles carried by the Echo 2. but the answer was deleted for security. Other informed

sources say the Echo 2 carries eight nuclear - powered missiles with 500-mile ranges. Meanwhile, in mid-January, Soviet tugs towed two 200ton missile - firing patrol boats to Cuba. The vessels Cuba received were of the OSA class, which have a speed of 35 knots and mount four Styx missiles with high - explosive

warheads and a range of 15 miles. It was a Styx with which the Egyptians sank an Israeli destroyer in 1967. Rep. Claude Pepper, a Florida Democrat, and as is Fascell, a Miamian, said Cuba's new gunboats carry missiles with "ample power to reach not only Homestead Air Force Base but even the President's vacation compound in Key Biscayne." Homestead, where Nixon customarily lands on his flights to Florida, is off the Atlantic, south of Miami. Key

Biscayne is on Biscayne Bay. Pepper said the Soviet Union "for all intents and purposes has a permanent naval base in Cuba. The warships and submarines come and go, but the shore facilities they require are permanently established (in Cuba)."

Cassell told the subcommittee: "We see the naval visits to Cuba as part of the larger Soviet goal of achieving a worldwide naval capability.'

He added: "The Soviet Union has a deep involvement in Cuba. It seems committed to insuring Cuba's eventual economic success in Cuba and to providing a suitable amount of arms for its defense. In return, the Soviets obviously look to Cuba for support of naval combatants as well as a showplace for communism in the Western Hemisphere."

# Constitutional Amendments Carry Easily

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - Florida voters mandated the streamlining of the state's jerry-built trial courts system Tuesday, and approved a \$40

million pool which would give some 15,-000 college students loans beginning this fall. Near complete returns showed the two proposed amendments to Florida's 1968 Constitution passed by wide margins. The judicial proposal with 70

Roughly 40 per cent of those in the part-time labor force oluntarily are married women living with their husbands. In the past decade those voluntarily looking for parttime work have increased 103 per cent. The full-time labor force (those employed full time and those looking for fulltime work) by contrast has increased only 39 per cent. It thus turns out that those voluntarily looking for parttime work now comprise 15 per cent of the civilian labor force, contrasted with 10 per cent a decade ago.

If those in the work force today working part time voluntarily or seeking part-time work were the same percentage of today's work force as a decade ago, the A nation's unemployment would be close to 5.4 per cent. If the unemployment figures listed only the unemployed among those seeking full-time work, the unemployment rate would be around 5 per cent today.

This is not to suggest that the men and women seeking part-time employment don't need work or that they can be ignored. It is to suggest, however, that this may be a very special type of problem. It is to propose that normal economic growth as presently conceived will not provide enough jobs for the number of part-time workers without creating heavy labor shortages throughout the economy in a wide variety of fields-a situation which would inevitably result in most serious inflation.

Many part-time workers have limited mobility in the usual meaning of the word. If attending college, they are tied to the college areas except in summer, their hours are determined by their studies.

If housewives, they usually must conform to the schedules of husbands and children. They normally cannot move to another city, or work at a considerable distance away in the same city without disrupting home life. But part-time workers are not the only specialized group among the unemployed. Another 10 to 12 per cent of the unemployed are young men and women 16-19 not going to school and looking for full-time employment. There are other special groups-those so discouraged they are not even seeking work, the infirm and the handicapped, the aged, the severely uneducated.

Vietnam era veterans form a very special group. It is obvious that the number of people wanting employment, and their locations, training and ability can never precisely match the available jobs-and that this disparity is sizable even in a prosperous economy.

Hidden Problems In Legalized Pot

A growing chorus of prestigious voices is calling for a change in this country's legal posture toward marijuana. Dr. Bertram S. Brown, director of the National Institute of Mental Health and officially the nation's top psychiatrist, urges that penalties be eased. While deploring the spreading use of marijuana among the very young, he argues that penalties for possession and use of the drug are "much too severe and much out of keeping with knowledge about its harmfulness." We are still several years away from being able to

judge the long-term psychological and physical effects of marijuana use, but almost every study has shown that for everything bad that can be said about pot, worse things can be said about alcohol. John H. Finlator, retired deputy director of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, calls the prosecution of marijuana users "just as wrong as hell." He says his opinion was muzzled while he was with the bureau.

The 13-member National Commission on Marijuana and Drug Abusa, appointed by Congress in 1970, is expected to recommend that possession and use of marijuana in the home be made legal. The panel will make its final report in late March. None of these authorities advocates the complete legalization of marijuana. Yet if recent history in the field of

pornography is any guide, it is difficult to see how this can long be avoided once the first step is taken toward acceptance of marijuana. When courts held that a person had a constitutional

right to private possession of pornographic materials, the next logical argument was that this right was meaningless if he did not also have a constitutional right to obtain such materials. Since the courts have so far failed to face this issue squarely, pornography has virtually become legal by default.

# A Close Shave, but FTC Wins

It warms the heart to know that as consumers we are being protected. At least it warmed my heart when I learned that the Federal Trade Commission ordered manufacturers to substantiate advertising claims that an electric shaver has "no blades of steel to be used against your skin (so) it will not cut and nick."

I like to know the agency is on the job. It seems only yesterday that it saved us from what has been called in some circles The Great Sandpaper Shaving Fraud, which stemmed from an advertisement on television showing that ordinary sandpaper could be shaved with a quick whisk of a razor.

The FTC proved this could not be done! This ad must not be confused with the one showing the shaving of a peach with a quick whisk of a razor. As far penditure of funds deter our FTC from rooting out evil as I know, nobody has investigated this ad and nobody wherever it finds it! has prepared a vast number of reports showing whether

Those of us who shave peaches, therefore, are on our own. Those of us who shave sandpaper have been saved

from utter disappointment. If I remember correctly, the shaving cream company went so far as to take its case to the Supreme Court, but the ad was stopped. This saved sandpaper shavers from spending fruitless hours creaming and soaking their sandpaper to no avail.

But, to bring us up to date, the Federal Trade Commission has released documents from shaver manufacturers acknowledging that blades do usually give a closer shave than one can get from an electric shaver. The same documents backed up the companies' claims that one can get nicked by a regular blade but not by their electrics. So goes the latest skirmish in the endless battle to protect us from hoaxes and fraudulent claims. Let no ex-
