Therefore, the seven-pound bass caught last night often turns into a four-pounder by morning. Actually, night fishing is one of the more enjoyable summer-

time methods. The sun is gone and cooler temperatures assure anglers of more comfortable fishing. Another night fishing bonus is that the wind usually drops
