



Why Canadians Get Furious At U.S.

The recent tit-for-tat series of import limitations imposed on each other by the United States and Canada caused much bigger headlines north of the border than they did here - and thereby hangs most of the tale.

Canada, with a population of some 22 million, simply cannot avoid spending more time brooding over the United States than we do brooding over her. It's nobody's fault; it's just a fact of life. Even a casual look at that big and beautiful land reveals at once its inevitable dependence on its huge southern neighbor. A population density map shows the Canadian people strung out along the U.S. border like a bunch of black dots trying to get in. A ride along any Canadian highway takes one past sign after sign proclaiming the "Ford Motor Company of Canada" or something similar galling reminders, to every patriotic Canadian, that immense chunks of his country's economy are

mere subsidiaries of U.S. corporations. If he picks up a magazine, or goes to a movie, or switches on his television set, chances are that he will be looking at something "made in U.S.A."

If he glances at a globe, he will realize gloomily that, from a strategic standpoint, the United States and the Soviet Union must both regard Canada as simply a large piece of real estate situated, con veniently or otherwise, beneath the route their missiles must take on the way to each other's major cities. As part of the Western world, moreover, there can be no question where Canada will stand if push comes to shove: with the United States, of course.

It is bad enough to be that dependent on any foreign power; but to be that dependent, and to be disregarded or taken for granted into the bargain, is sometimes more than flesh and blood can bear. So there has always been a flourishing market for anti-Americanism in Canada (along, of course, with a great deal of pro-American sentiment, too). Almost every Canadian national election, for example, inspires a revival of the famous Mystery of the Missing Freight Cars. One party or the other, usually the Outs, suddenly discovers that thousands of true-blue Canadian freight cars have thousands of true-blue Canadian freight cars have
been spirited away by those rascally Americans.

If it were not for the guerrilla war waged by
the IRA against the British, for example, there And sure enough, rail freight procedures being what they are, hundreds of Canadian Pacific boxcars are invariably found and photographed on sidings all over the United States. the hullabaloo, if properly timed, lasts till just after Election Day.

From the standpoint of the United States things naturally look a little different. As one of the world's two major powers, it has to keep a sharp eye on the Middle East, soothe the sensibilities of Palestine.

Says Time. It is quite possible that statues will one day be erected to Arafat in an independent Palestine.

RAY CROMLEY its European allies, shore up its friends in Southeast Asia, keep Japan reasonably content, and negotiate warily with Peking and Moscow. It is frequently at a loss over what to do about Africa, and practically always stands accused (rightly) of disregarding Latin America. As a result, this country often goes whole weeks at a time without scarcely forsworn terrorism, yet they have won even thinking about Canada, and when it does pause to give it a thought it is usually just to be grateful that Canada causes so little trouble.



TOKYO (AP) - Takeo Miki, 67, Japan's next prime minister, today promised a vigorous program based on social justice and reform of the ruling Liberal-Democratic party. Miki said he will make an early public statement about his personal wealth, the issue that brought about Kakuei Tanaka's resignation as prime minister. Miki will be formally elected to head the government Monday at a special session of the Diet, Japan's parliament.

Arabs Buy French Tanks

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Saudi Arabia has concluded an \$860 million deal with France to improve its tank corps and is shopping in the United States for other arms, the Saudi defense minister said in an interview published today. The equipment reportedly will include Frane's AMX tank and an antiaircraft missile. Diplomatic sources said the Saudis went to the French after the United States, heretofore the chief supplier of arms to Saudi Arabia, refused to sell them its newest model tank,

JERUSALEM (AP) - Foreign Minister Yigal Allon told the Israeli parliament that Egypt in a secret annex to the disengagement agreement last January agreed to let Israeli ca go and foreign ships bound to and from Israel to pass through the Suez Canal as soon as the waterway is reopened. Allon said that Israeli ships would be allowed to use the canal only after a permanent peace settlement is reached. Egypt has never allowed Israel to use the canal. contending that the two countries have been in a state of war since the 1948 Palestine war.



BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) - A disenchanted bunch of Birmingham Americans has reversed field and agreed to play in a World Bowl overflowing with ill will.

Florida's Blazers, who have not been paid in months, say they won their berth in the World Football League's first championship by beating Memphis out of anger at what they saw as a "setup" BirminghamMemphis finale.

And the Americans, who walked away from a scheduled practice Monday and threatened not to show up for Thursday night's championship game, said at a Tuesday news conference they would play despite their anger over missed paydays.

At least player representative Charlie Harraway

said most of them will show up. Harraway said a players' meeting at which the decision was made to play was "very heated. "A couple of guys got up and wanted to fight," he

said. "I don't know if we're going to have 100 per cent of our players but we'll have enough to play.' Harraway said the Americans are "quite disenchanted" and have not been paid in five or six weeks. Linebacker Ross Brupbacher said it had been eight weeks since the players got paychecks. Several of the veterans negotiated late into Monday night with owner Bill Putnam, and a player who did not want to be identified said:

"We don't want to be negative at this time, but it really looks like the game won't be played. The team has poured millions into the economy of

Birmingham but no one wants to come forward and help us financially." But Harraway, a running back who is also the WFL Players Association president, said Tuesday the Americans will play the game "for the citizens

of Birmingham and for our pride.

"We're not playing for back pay ... We are playing for the championship." Putnam has said it would take \$750,000 for the team to pay its back taxes, bills and back salaries and that he has had trouble borrowing the money or finding substantial investors. He said Tuesday he had no comment on the players' decision to play.

The Blazers have gone virtually unpaid for nearly 14 weeks and say they beat a stacked playoff deck to gain a shot at the World Football League championship. And they say they're determined to beat

Birmingham as a matter of personal "We're so angry that we want to win the World Bowl even if we have to eat crackers," said reserve quarterback Buddy Palazzo, who came off the bench in the second half last week to lead the Blazers to an 18-15 semifinal

playoff victory over Memphis. "We're supposed to be playing for a living and we're not getting paid," Palazzo added "This knocks down the theory about spoiled high-salaried athletes."

Blazer players made a pact to "spit in the eye" of the WFL after league officials gave both Memphis and Birmingham first-round playoff byes while forcing the Blazers to play hapless Philadelphia. "The league tried to set the World Bowl up

for Memphis and Birmingham," said running back Tommy Reamon, the WFL's top rusher. "But we fooled them by beating Memphis and we're going to beat Birmingham, too." Coach Jack Pardee calls the Blazers "a team of destiny that's destined to win the World Bowl."
