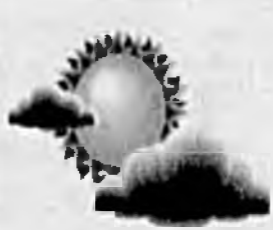

**LAKE MARY** — It's official. Seminole County Sheriff Don Eslinger will have a heavy-weight challenger in his bid for re-election.

After months of speculation, Lake Mary Police Chief Richard Beary announced Thursday he is running for the position Eslinger currently holds. The newest candidate said he is running as an independent, which guarantees he will appear on the Nov. 7 general-election ballot.

"In the past, a whole group of people

have been locked out of the sheriff's race," Beary said. "The sheriff has to represent everyone in Seminole County. The political establishment clearly has a candidate, and I am not it. That's why I am running as an independent."

"It's time for a change." Beary made his announcement yesterday during a meeting with his fellow

officers and city officials. Many were surprised, and a few tears were shed.

However, Lake Mary Mayor David Meador said he was also disappointed to hear the news.

"I was surprised," Meador said, "because he told me he wasn't going to run, and I'm disappointed because Don Eslinger has done a wonderful job as sheriff of this

county."

Beary, 41, began his law enforcement career 23 years ago today as an officer in the Altamonte Springs Police Department. He became Lake Mary's police chief on Jan. 3, 1993.

A fourth-generation police officer, Beary's grandfather and great-grandfather were officers in Buffalo, N.Y. His father, Ray, served as a Winter Park police chief, and his brother, Kevin, is the Orange County sheriff. His sister, Noel Niquest, is also a deputy for Orange County.

# Beary vs. Eslinger

## Commission has tough questions for police chief

**SANFORD** — It was scheduled as a hearing on the Sanford police budget, but the afternoon workshop quickly evolved into a forum on police policy.

Sanford City Commission, led by Mayor Larry Dale and Commissioner Whitey Eckstein, pointedly questioned Police Chief Brian Tooley and City Manager Tony VanDerworp about the department's policies and procedures.

The workshop comes at a time when the city is expected to increase the police department budget by almost \$1.5 million, as well as add 10 new officers to the force.

Eckstein had requested the workshop so commissioners could deal solely with police department issues. A similar workshop is also scheduled for the Sanford Fire Department.

At times the debate became heated, as Dale and Eckstein, with consensus from the other commissioners, focused their attention on the department's

scheduling policies, clearance rates and responsiveness to citizens.

"Can somebody please explain to me why when one of our citizens gets their home broken into it takes our investigators three days to get back to them?" Dale demanded.

Both Dale and Eckstein were critical of the department's 12-hour work shifts, noting it sometimes takes three or four days for officers to follow-up with crime victims after the initial police contact.

During a typical two-week pay cycle, an officer would work two days, take two days off, then work three days during the first week. The second week, the officer would have two days off, work two days, and then have three days off.

"How much work can a man get done when he only works two days a week?" Dale asked. "The department comes to a complete stop when these guys take off. Nothing happens on the cases they're working on. What

## City has three options available to renovate Mckibbon Park

**SANFORD** — A park in west Sanford will soon receive renovations.

The city is preparing to make repairs to Mckibbon Park, located on the south side of 25th Street near Hartwell Avenue.

The 30-day project is expected to start by September, although no firm date has been set, said city engineer Bob Walter.

A study indicates depressions caused by decaying organic debris have appeared in the ball fields and pathways at the park. The area in past years was used as a dumping site for organic debris.

The city hired a consultant to explore the surface and sub-surface of the areas and recommend remedial action to reconstruct and stabilize some areas of the park. The consultant used three standard penetration borings, soil, organic, and surface analysis to determine the materials that are present.

The materials, consisting of wood, palm roots, branches, carpet, concrete, and glass, were buried below a layer of about four- to seven feet of fill.

The organic material over time has deteriorated and compressed, causing the depression as ground water worked its way into the voids, said Chris Smith, an engineering assistant for the

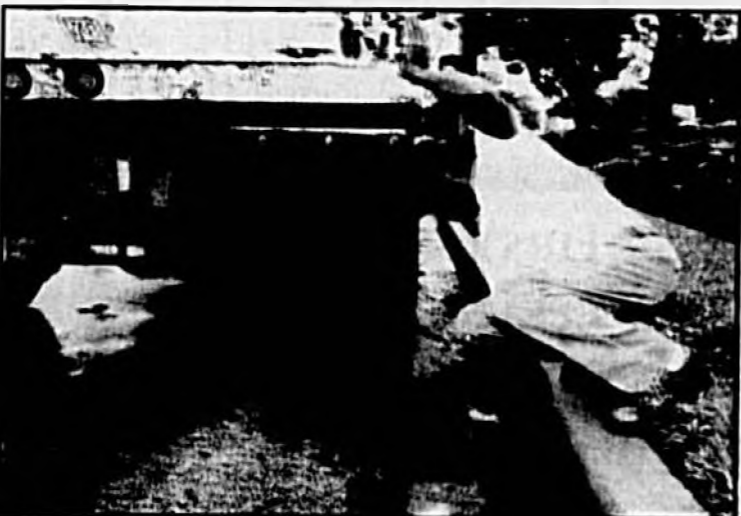
city. Recommendations from the consultant's report indicate three options for the city to consider. One option would be to provide an asphalt structural leveling course beneath the playing fields and pathways.

A second option is to reconstruct the playing fields and pathways using a structural soil mat. Finally, the city could remove the fill and the organics and replace them with clean structural fill.

The city's Parks department will recommend an option to the City Commission.

The park is named for Cliff Mckibbon, founder of a local insurance agency.

Kevin Beary and Richard Beary are as close as brothers — in law — can get. K.B. is the sheriff of Orange County. R.B. is running for the Seminole County's sheriff's job.

Beary's candidacy has been speculated for months (perhaps, years). He and his brothers are fourth generation Irish cops. Enough said about honor,

duty. Eslinger-Beary for sheriff is the law enforcement buzz today throughout Seminole County. Has anyone told Joe Becker?

OK, Joe knows. He's been smarting since the 1996 pasting Eslinger dealt him in the

sheriff's race. Joltin' Joe raised enough money to run for president and lost big. He'll be giddy now, perhaps taking credit for coaxing Beary to run. I have to think Richard Beary relied on his own judgment, however. If he asked for advice, he had brother Kevin. Best that Becker can do for Beary is back away — watch from a distance.

"The fact someone is running is good news in itself," County Commissioner Grant Maloy said Thursday. "Until now, none of our constitutional officers were challenged. I've only met Chief Beary a couple of times. I know he's well respected."

"He (Beary) couldn't pick a tougher man to challenge," County Commissioner Randy Morris said. "He's up against the most popular elected official in the county. That's a load."

Sandra Goard, Supervisor of Elections, doesn't have

Beary's papers, yet. He has until next Friday (July 21) to qualify. He has chosen to run as an independent. Eslinger is a Republican — has the party's clout in his favor.

Eslinger said Thursday he is eager to debate Beary and to talk about law enforcement in Seminole County.

As you know, Eslinger was the first pick of the late John E. Polk to succeed him as sheriff. The year was 1990. George Bush, Sr., was president. No one can remember the men who ran against Eslinger in 1992. Becker was the lonely loser in 1996.

We've heard horror stories about sheriff's races in other locales — trash-talking shout-outs, nasty, mean-spirited. I wouldn't expect either Sheriff Don or Chief Richard to stoop to that kind of race. Gentlemen, tell us what the law is. Tell it to us gently.

## American Red Cross to offer free child CPR education

The American Red Cross of Central Florida will hold free infant and child CPR and water safety education in con-

junction with its year-round drowning prevention program, Safe Swim. The classes will be taught July 22 at Eatonville Recreation Department.

Florida Hospital recently donated \$15,000 to fund the Red Cross Safe Swim program, ensuring Central Florida children are safe in the water this swim season. Safe Swim was developed last year to help reduce the high number of drownings in the Orlando area. The program reached 300 children last year.

The free CPR and water safety education program will feature training for adults (13 years and older) and children (6 to 12). Adults will have the opportunity to receive free infant and child CPR certification and participate in water safety education program. The water safety education program includes basic tips in keeping children safe around water, how to create a safe swimming environment in a variety of water settings and

non-swimming rescue techniques.

Children will have the opportunity to learn basic first aid and water safety education.

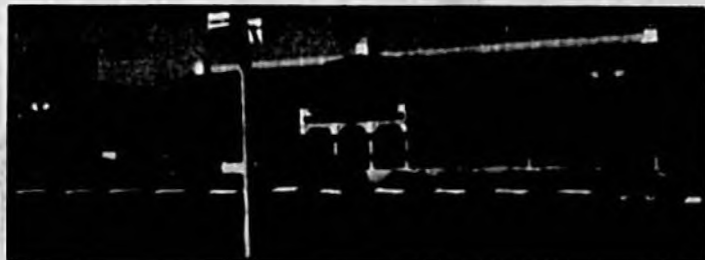

# Admiration and respect can hide flaws

We are inclined to say that there is nobody worse than a person we can't respect. We may be wrong. Often, it is the person whom we do respect that we have to look out for.

When we are looking for examples, Watergate comes to mind.

The late syndicated columnist Joseph Kraft wrote, "The striking thing about the chief figures of Watergate is that they were not sleazy characters trailing clouds of Mafia connections. They were loyal, hard-working, disciplined, patriotic family men."

"President Nixon's chief of staff, W.R. Halderman, was a dedicated, selfless man who didn't drink or smoke. But this very model of a modern major

executive was central to the large-scale effort to sabotage the Democratic Party that led to the Watergate scandal."

On the surface, Daniel Wiant didn't fit the mold of a "sleazy character trailing clouds of Mafia connections." When he was accused in June of embezzling \$6.9 million from the American Cancer Society, he was chief administrative officer for the charitable group in Ohio. In addition to holding this respectable position, at 6 feet 4 inches tall, he cut an imposing figure wherever he went.

But some things in his past weren't matters to laugh over. He had served a prison term in Hawaii for credit card thefts and other charges. Knox

County Sheriff David Barber said, "He definitely had charisma." The prosecutor was quoted as saying, "He was a young (35), bright, flimsy man with a sense of humor, who didn't seem to fathom the trouble he was in." According to newspaper accounts, he also had had brushes with the law in California.

I once gave a speech to a women's club in which I spoke of the tendency many of us have to pad our standings in the community by associating with worthy causes like the church or charitable organizations.

I told the story of a big-business tycoon who was sentenced to jail for price-fixing. The federal judge who sentenced him said, "This man was torn between conscience on one hand and, on the other hand, the rewarding objectives of promotion, comfortable

security and a large salary. He sought to advance his career by illicit practices."

He wasn't a Mafia man any more than the principals in the Watergate scandal were — although the reprimand the judge went on to give him sounded like something prepared for a character of the underworld.

Who was this man? He was a family man and a churchman. He was a senior warden of the Episcopal Church in his community — the highest lay office in an episcopal congregation. On the day before he was sentenced, he was re-elected vice president of the United Way in his hometown. Earlier that year, he had received a citation for his work with crippled children.

Even after he was sentenced to prison, his friends found it impossible to believe anything but good about him. His cler-

gyman said, "The vestry still feels he is a man of high integrity, and we have every confidence in him."

Someone associated with this pillar of the community said, "I think the only thing John could be guilty of is doing his job with the same conscientious attitude with which he goes about anything he undertakes."

After my speech was over, a woman in the audience came up to me, quite disturbed, and asked if I knew this man personally. I said I didn't.

"Well," she said, "I know him intimately. You have done him a terrible injustice. He is just the most wonderful human being. Nobody in his community is held in higher respect."

Of course, I had just finished saying exactly that, but she had missed my point.

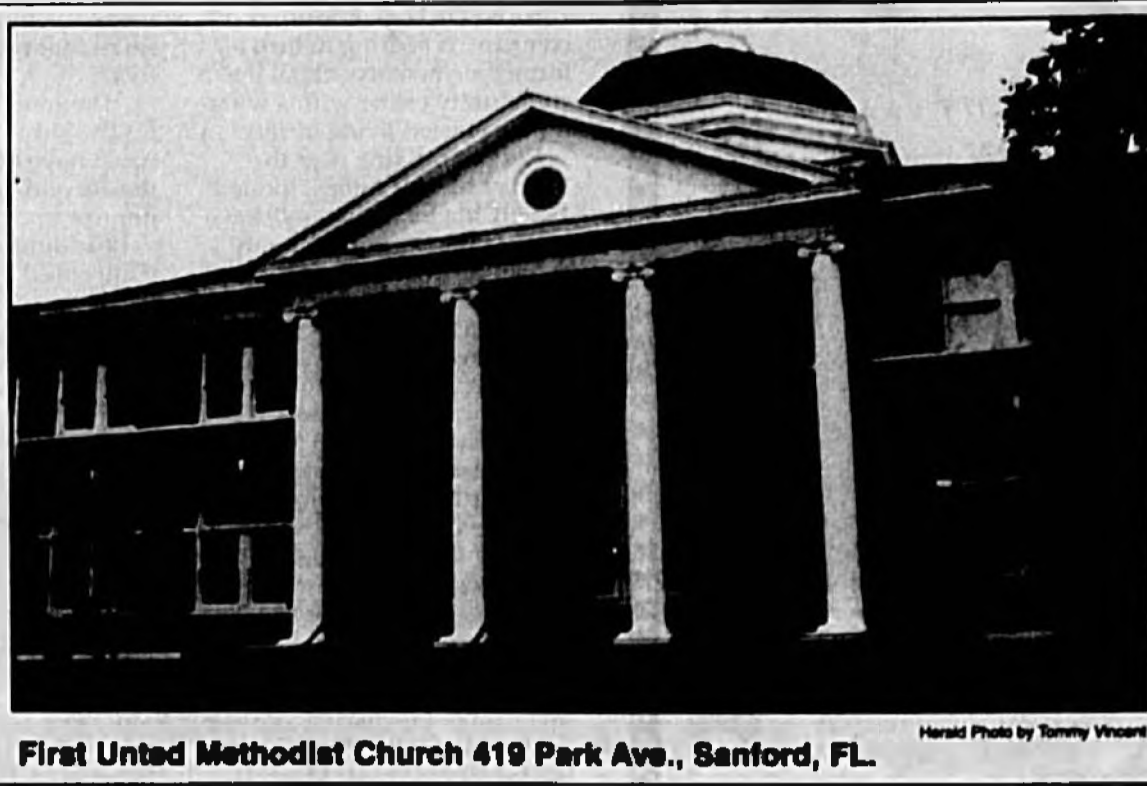

# Sanford company wants to purchase annex center

**SANFORD** — A Sanford company is seeking to turn a former elementary school into a community center with a wing for an assisted living facility.

Residents living near the Velma Mitchell Annex, located at 1401 Magnolia Avenue, have lobbied the Seminole County School Board and the city of Sanford for the building to be used as a community center.

However, members of the School Board are likely to turn down the company's initial bid to purchase the Velma Mitchell Annex, because it is less than one-fourth of the property's appraised value. The board will consider the bid during Monday's 3:30 p.m. session at the Educational Support Center in Sanford.

Sanford-based IRN of Central Florida, Inc., a company involved in purchasing and renovating properties, is the only bidder on the Velma Mitchell Annex, located next to Red Barber Park.

The building was first constructed in 1922 as Southside Elementary School. It is currently used by the school-district for office space.

James Lee, owner of IRN of

Central Florida, said he proposes to use the building as a community center with areas for theater, youth activities, and a small cafe with a computer room.

"The community needs this for the kids," Lee said. "We could have live theater and improv."

In addition, if approved by the city's Planning and Zoning Commission, a wing of the annex could be used as an assisted living facility in order to generate revenue, Lee said.

"It could be for the elderly or for the young," Lee said. "This is very early in the process. But, we do need to generate some revenue to cover our overhead. The key will be to keep the overhead down."

Lee said IRN may be willing to make a higher bid for the building. But, he declined to make a commitment.

"We're the only ones to put in

a bid," Lee said. "That should tell you something. A lot of expensive repairs will need to be made."

The company's bid is \$100,100. However, an appraisal performed for the school district established the fair market

value of the property at \$435,000.

Superintendent Paul Hagerty is recommending that the School Board reject the company's bid. Board members Sandra Robinson, Larry Furlong and Jeanne Morris each said the bid is too low.

"I think that was kind of an insult," Morris said. "It's such a pretty area of Sanford. But,

whatever use is approved, should be compatible with the area."

Meanwhile, board member Bob Goff questioned whether the Velma Mitchell Annex property is actually worth \$435,000. The building is in need of more than \$500,000 worth of repairs, according to the district's appraisal.

"It never ceases to amaze me," Goff said. "You're looking at \$435,000 for a building that has a swimming pool worth of water in the basement. I think some people just don't want the building to be sold."

Recommended repairs to the Velma Mitchell Annex would cost about \$524,000, according to the school-district's consultant, Orlando-based Law Engineering and Environmental Services.

The needed repairs include replacement of floor tile, plaster, the cement roofing panel, and the suspended ceiling and grid. In addition, the consultant recommends replacing cement shingles with asphalt shingles.

The wall, ceiling plasters, and floor tile in the building contain asbestos. However, removal of the asbestos is not required by federal standards unless disturbed by maintenance, renovation or demolition, according to the consultant's report.

The total cost of asbestos abatement and restoration is estimated at about \$605,000.

In May, the market value of the Velma Mitchell Annex property was reported to be \$1.4 million, free of asbestos. The property is valued at \$435,000 if the cost of repairs and asbestos abatement is deducted, according to the school-district's property appraiser, Pinel and Carpenter, Inc., of Orlando.

The property consists of two separate parcels, with the main building located on about 1.4 acre of land. The small separate parcel consists of three platted residential lots located at the corner of Palmetto Avenue and 15th Street containing about .4 acre of land.

The structure of the 28,600 square-foot main building consists of wood frame set on raised piers.

The building has an auditorium and partial open basement below, and is arranged around a central hallway corridor with classrooms or offices. The classrooms have been subdivided into smaller office spaces with interior partitions.

"He's a cop at heart, and it's in his blood," Lake Mary City Manager John Litton said.

However, Litton admitted he, too, was surprised to hear Beary made the decision to run for sheriff.

"He's talked about it on and off for years," Litton said. "I really didn't expect it now. But, it's his decision, and it's something he's always aspired to do."

"Richard's done a good job for the city," he said. "He's built a department with little respect into a department with a lot of respect. He will be hard to replace."

During his tenure as police chief, Beary has seen an increase in personnel from 23 sworn officers in 1993 to 33 today. He has assisted in numerous projects, including the creation of a

DARE program in Lake Mary, county-wide police radio

Litton said he does not plan on beginning the search for a new police chief any time in the near future. Beary's resignation will take effect on Dec. 31, and state law will not allow the police chief to withdraw his resignation if he loses the election.

The city manager believes Beary's campaign will not be a no conflict of interest as long as his campaigning is not done on city time. The police chief said he has no plans of overlapping the two.

"I've got a lot of vacation and leave hours I can use to campaign," Beary said. "If I can't effectively maintain a campaign on my own time, I will move up my resignation date."

Beary said he realizes he doesn't have a lot of time to

campaign — he's got 116 days until the Nov. 7 election — but he isn't discouraged.

"I am clearly the underdog, some people don't think I have a chance, and I know it's going to be a challenge," he said. "But, I heard that about my brother's campaign, and he's now the Orange County sheriff."

And, Beary is optimistic about his chances of winning.

"I am compelled by honor, and I believe the people deserve a well-trained law enforcement leader," he said. "I've always followed what my father once told me, 'serve with integrity, compassion, commitment and courage.'"

"When I become sheriff, the only change people will see in me is the change from a blue uniform to a green uniform."

## Police identify two killed in crash

**OSTEEN** — The identities of the two people killed in a crash when their motorcycle was struck by a van Tuesday on the Douglas Stenstrom Bridge over the St. Johns River were released Wednesday.

Robert W. Reichenbach, 58, of Oviedo, and Beverly E. Deter, 60, of DeBary, were killed when the 1994 Kawasaki motorcycle driven by Reichenbach collided with a 1992 Dodge Van. Deter was riding on the back seat of the motorcycle.

The crash occurred at about 9:20 p.m. Tuesday just north of Celery Avenue at the Volusia-Seminole county line, according to a spokesman for the Florida Highway Patrol.

The driver of the van, 64-year-old Albert T. Christian of Deltona, remains in Orlando Regional Medical Center with severe trauma caused by the crash.

The motorcycle was heading south on State Road 415, traversing the bridge over the St. Johns River.

The van was heading north on the south-bound travel lane, moving left-to-center, when it struck the motorcycle head-on, troopers said.

Both the Reichenbach and Deter were ejected. They were wearing safety helmets, but the injuries from the crash were too severe.

The Florida Highway Patrol is conducting a traffic accident and homicide investigation. It is not yet known whether alcohol was involved in the crash.

kind of message does that send to our citizens?"

Tooley agreed there are issues that need to be looked at regarding scheduling, and said based on the commission's discussions, he intends to provide a plan within 60 days.

"The shifts should be based on when you have the calls coming in," Tooley said. "You want to have the most manpower, when you receive the most calls."

"The 12-hour-shift is very popular with the officers because it gives them some time to decompress and spend some time with their families," Tooley

said. "But we are not married to any one shift. We want to do whatever serves the best interests of the citizens of Sanford."

"I can say this, we've got a number of vacancies in the department, and a 12-hour shift is probably the best way to deploy your manpower in that situation. But we want to provide the service that meets the needs of our citizens."

Eckstein said that's the bottom line in his opinion.

"The citizens demand a certain amount of accountability from their police department," Eckstein said. "We've got to give it to them."

A 14-year veteran of the city

commission, Eckstein said he was pleased with the discussion generated during the meeting.

"This is the first time we have been able to do this," Eckstein said. "I've done entire city budgets in three hours."

Eckstein said by having discussion about police policy, "It gives (the police administration) a chance to see the direction the commission wants to go."

"Do we go with a (New York Mayor Rudy) Giuliani style approach, where we demand results and accountability, or do we go along as usual with the status quo?" Eckstein said. "That's what they need to know."

Saturday's game with the Bobcats (3-9) will be played at the National Car Rental Center starting at 7:30 p.m.

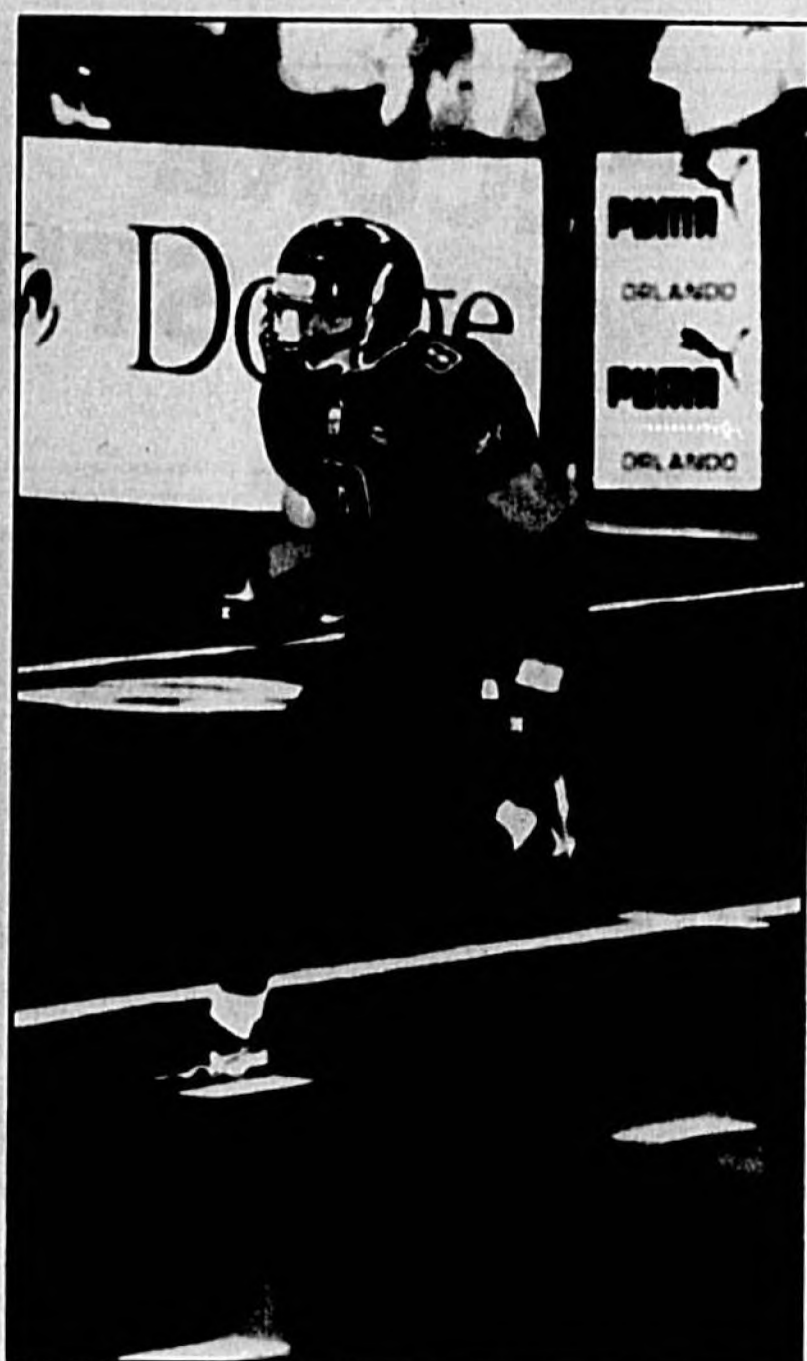
The game will be televised by Sunshine Network with Rick Pecham and Fran Curci calling the contest.

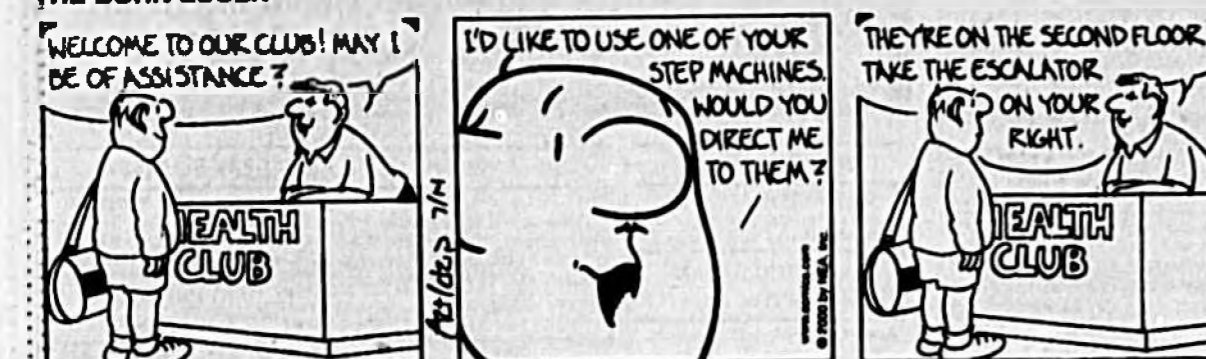

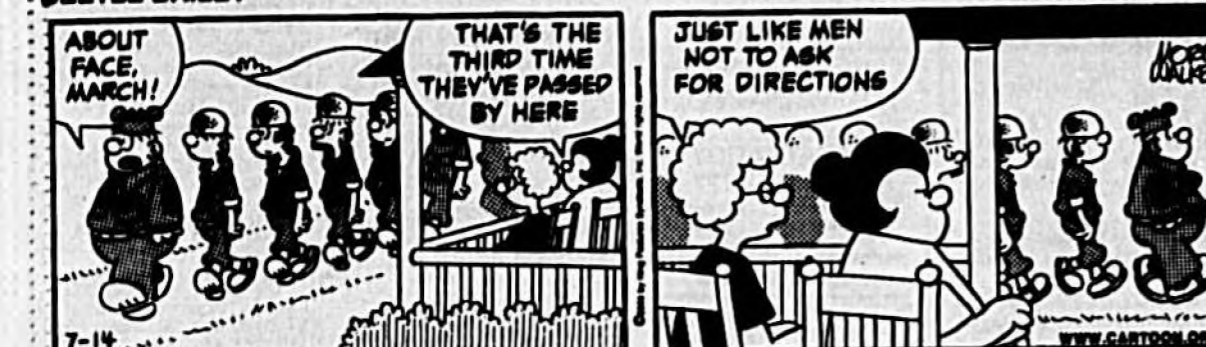
