

Cut Your Own Taxes— Claim Legitimate Business Expenses

In many occupations an employer uses their personal funds in the regular conduct of their business. This is particularly true of salesmen.

The tax form provides two sections where such expenses may be claimed. The first opportunity is on Page 2 of Form 1040 in the section headed "Adjustments."

Double the amount of the deduction. This is the maximum amount that can be deducted for such expenses.

Understand the distinction. Consider the expenses of two men each earning \$10,000 annually. Only one of them qualifies as an outside sales-
