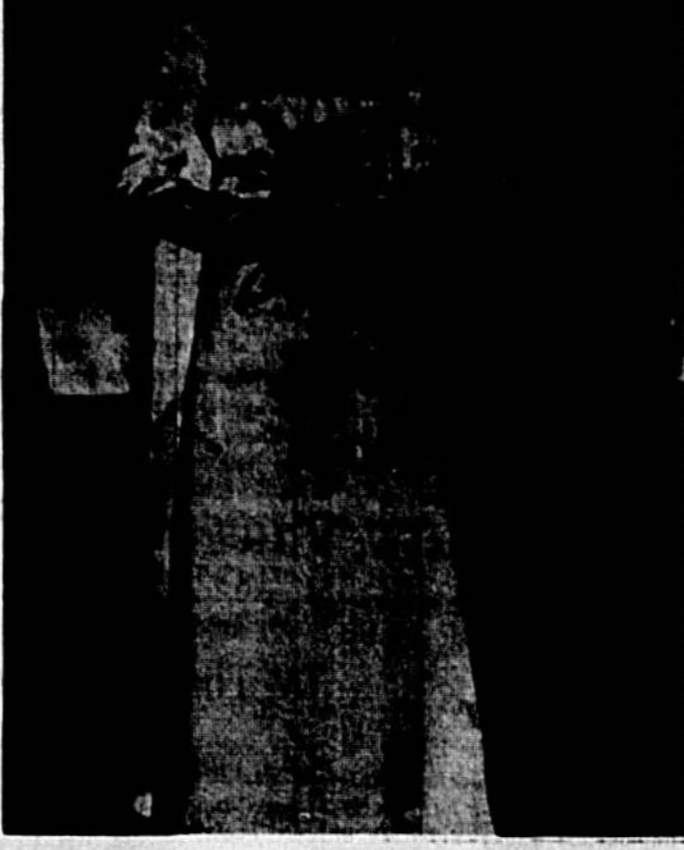

Pushing for the New Year's eve opening was Earl Higgins, who emphasized "you won't stop drinking one ounce by closing the bars." Higgins, however, said he would like to see the bars open on Sunday, Christmas eve.

Dr. Roberts stressed that the House of God on the Saturday of the New Year's Eve is open on Sunday and the closing of other bars would be discriminatory. The religious observance is protected by an ordinance which allows them to serve liquor on Sundays.
