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

Admiral Says Coast guard Aviator Saw U-Boat About 200 Feet Under Water

WASHINGTON, Jan. 23 -(A) Congress learned today one of the bmarines reported off the Florida coast in the early days of the neutrality patrol was spotted 200 feet below the surface of the ocean by a coast guard aviator. Admiral R. R. Waesche, coast guard commandant, told the House appropriations sub-committee the report "caused some excitement," and that the aviator was called subsequently by telephone for a detailed account. He phone for a detailed account. He said the aviator gave an accurrate description. He did not identify the submarine.

Wassche said the coast guard's neutrality patrol work had been hampered by lack of underwater sound detectors on surface ves-




