






County Greets Proposed Tax Cut With Glee, Gloom

'Furloughs' Begin For Stromberg-Carlson Employes

Stromberg-Carlson Corp. furloughed 575 employes today for two-week period, leaving the telephone equipment manufacturing firm with a 225-man work force to handle only present commitments and emergency service, a company's spokesman an-

The furloughed employes were primarily production line personnel and will return to work at the Sanford company on Jan. , said Joseph Hartwig, industrial relations manager.

"We are in a situation where we are trying to meet customers' commitments we have on hand and any emergency type service that would be required," Hartwig said. The company laid off 95 employes indefinitely during the first

Hartwig said that he does not foresee any more layoffs "at

Hartwig said the furloughed employes will "all be paid for at this time," but that future cutbacks will depend on the economic rate improvements," Hartwig said. least three days of holiday pay and retain company benefits." Tax Cuts Are Urged

WASHINGTON (AP) - Tax cuts of up to \$12 billion a year have been urged by the congressional Joint Economic Committee to help pump up the economy and head off what the panel called possibly the worst recession in more than 35 years. At the same time the committee urged Congress to consider enacting a gasoline tax increase to help force a reduction in demand. As an example, it said a tax of 30 cents a gallon would cut gas consumption by a 8 per cent or 500,000 barrels a day during the first year. The federal gas tax now is four cents

Sunday's conversation lasted eight minutes and included a personal chat between Mrs. Ford and Mrs. Johnson, according to a White House report. It was Mrs. Johnson's 62nd birthday. She lives at the LBJ Ranch in Johnson City, Tex., which for many years was a presidential visiting spot.

Life 'Unsheltered'

WASHINGTON (AP) - Her life in the White House won't be sheltered, says Susan Ford. "I'm not the sheltered type person." She delights in sneaking out of the White House unnoticed for an evening on the town. She giggles when the gold wedding band on her left ring finger is mistaken for her own - "It's my grandmother's" - she says. And she confessed in an interview at the White House that her mother reprimands her for putting her feet up on her father's Oval Office desk.

Wallace Eyes Future

WASHINGTON (AP) - Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace faces both physical and political uncertainties as he decides whether to make a fourth bid in 1976 for the presidency. Some close associates of the 54-yearold Wallace, who last month won his third term as governor, are unsure whether he will run for the Democratic presidential nomination.

Two Americans Reported Killed In Plane Crash

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) - Two Americans were reported among the 77 persons killed in the crash of a Venezuelan airliner four minutes after it took off from Maturin for Caracas. There were no survivors. Avensa, the airline that was operating the DC9 jet, said the dead Americans were Paul Rice and William Richard, who boarded the plane in Maturin. No other information was available on them

"There may have been other foreigners among the passengers, but we cannot now say how many nor supply any identities," said a spokesman for the airline. The bodies of the 71 passengers and six crew members were reported scattered over a wide area. The recovery teams that continued to collect the victims' remains today reported it would be difficult to identify the dead because they were badly burned.

Pilgrims Won't Be Stopped

JERUSALEM (AP) - The leader of a group of Florida Baptists says a grenade attack that wounded one of them won't stop their Christmas pilgrimage in the Holy Land. "We will spend Christmas in Bethlehem as we planned," said the Rev. E. C. McDaniel of Jacksonville after a visit to the hospital where doctors removed a thumb-sized piece of shrapnel from 17-year-old Dejean Replogle's thigh. The doctors said that the girl would be fine.

IRA Begins Cease-Fire

LONDON (AP) - The Irish Republican Army began an 11-day Christmas cease-fire today after a two-hour bombing binge in London and Northern Ireland. One target was the London home of former Prime Minister Edward Heath, but he was returning from a Christmas concert at the time. Five blasts rocked downtown Belfast in Northern Ireland and another three hit the town of Lurgan, 20 miles to the southwest. Police said there were no casualties in any of the attacks.

Russia, Egypt Meet

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Marshal Andrei Grechko the Soviet defense minister, is paying a secret visit to Cairo to discuss Egyptian arms needs, the leftist Beirut newspaper As Safir reported today.

The report said Grechko arrived in Cairo Saturday with a big military delegation, but the visit was not announced for "special reasons." Grechko is trying to reach an agreement on Egypt's



There's A Bitter **Outlook For Sugar**

WASHINGTON- Bakers blame farmers and

Consumer advocates blame producers and the . S. Agriculture Department.

Producers blame increased world demand. Some congressmen blame the Soviet Union and oil-rich Arab nations.

Their controversy is sugar. The question is its price — 400 per cent higher in U.S. markets than it was just a year ago. And to why it's so, there is simply no one an-

At least that was the prognosis from recent Council on Wage and Price Stability hearings on skyrocketing sugar prices.

"Everyone blame(s) everyone else," said Albert Rees, council chairman, whose agency by the end of the year will write a report on the causes and possible cures for the high sugar prices.

But a prehearing council staff report brought out one point on which consumers, bakers, food processors, sugar producers and the Agriculture "The basic economic reason that sugar prices

are high is that since crop year 1970-71, the world conservatives and liberals have paid lip service has consumed more sugar than it has produced to fighting monopolies, price fixing cartels and and, hence, has seriously depleted its stocks. "Because we in the United States import about one-half of the sugar we consume, we are directly

affected by this worldwide problem," the report Furthermore, the report stated, "the short-run outlook for sugar prices is not encouraging. The dollars a year. supply-demand situation will probably remain very tight for the next year or two at least."

more than 400 per cent for the Amstar Corp., the in the 80 years preceeding. largest sugar refiner, and 1,200 per cent for Great Western United Corp.

Taking just this year's gains is unfair, argued sugarcane industry representative Edward D.

A year ago, "The sugar refining industry was operating almost without a profit" because of price controls, he said.

"Like sacrificing a lamb," Carberry said after inspecting the death scene. "It looked like he held the child so the throat would be over the toilet, let him bleed...It was absolutely the most tragic thing I've ever seen."

'Reverend' Wilson To Stand Trial On Multiple Charges

A self-styled Altamonte Springs minister is scheduled for trial at Sanford Jan. 13, on charges of robbery and tampering with a witness in the case.

Circuit Court Judge David U. Strawn entered an innocent plea Monday at arraignment for Grant Wilson Jr., 47, of 583 East SR-436, Altamonte Springs, on the witness tampering charge and set the case for trial the same week as charges of robbery, use of a firearm in commission of a felony and aggravated assault faced by Wilson in the Oct. 11, theft of a safe containing a Midway family's life savings, reportedly \$100,000.

Wilson is in Seminole County Jain on \$200,000 bond on the witness tampering charge. He was arrested on the new charge Friday after State Atty. Abbott Herring's office said that a witness in the robbery case, Mrs. Georgia Peterson of Orlando, was told that Wilson would kill her or have her killed if she testified against him in the Jan. 13, trial. Wilson's wife, Mary Lee Wilson, 38, is also charged in the safe


