5. Meanwhile, throughout South Vietnam, even outside the battle zones, there has been a steady movement of Communist cadre from the countryside into the cities and towns. This reverses the flow of underground cadre from the cities and towns to countryside which followed

the unsuccessful Tet 1968 and August 1968 offensives. Some of these infiltrators have been busy killing police: and making terror attacks on officials, fishing and farm cooperative officers and teachers. But most, apparently, are lying low, making plans for some type of coordinated assault at Hanoi's signal.

In the countryside outside the war zone, local groups of Communist guerrillas have been making a widely dispersed series of probing attacks on local villages, hamlets and outposts, testing strengths and presumably reporting on local capabilities. This again, presumably, is

in prenaration for some future coordinated effort.

Maybe through him we experience a sort of cathersis that enables us to look at, and laugh at, those aspects of Archie Bunker that lie deep within ourselves.



Associated Press Writer MIAMI (AP) - Florida's Lion County Safari, which bills itself as the nation's first "careless zoo" where beasts can roam free, actually turns into a filthy, overcrowded prison when it closes for the night, the Miami Herald said

The mile-square wild animal preserve outside West Palm Beach jams 130 grown lions into small cages at night, often shoots escaped beasts and once even staged a television commercial that led to the death of a lion, the Herald said.

Lion Country executives, generally denying the charges, replied that a hostile reporter had talked to a vindictive ex-employe and "conned the Herald

into printing it." The executives, contacted in California and Texas, said that the article was "disgracefully one-sided" and that it ignored what they described as Lion Country's pioneer efforts in animal conservation, care and propagation.

## Arms Limitation Accord Seen With Nixon And Soviet Leaders

and Soviet leaders have virtually reached agreement on an arms limitation accord curbing erection of defensive antiballistic missile sites and freezing offensive nuclear missiles at their present levels, informed sources

reported today. As President Nixon met for the fourth time in the Kremlin with Communist party chief Leonid Brezhnev, the sources said the negotiators hope to be ready for the signing Friday of a treaty covering the ABM curb and a less formal agreement for the freeze on offensive missiles, both those based on land and

The agreement apparently would not bar either country from installing improved missiles at existing launch

It is expected that the agreement will provide for the use of reconnaissance satellites to verify that missile emplacements are not being increased by

Nixon and Brezhnev are expected to hold both morning and afternoon sessions today and then to participate in the signing of an agreement for cooperation in space exploration, the third accord produced during Nixon's visit to the Soviet capital.

There was speculation that one of the goals of the space agreement might be joint orbital trips by U.S. and Soviet


