tracks within the city. Mayor Norman Floyd recommended the action Tuesday night, saying since the speed reduction on major highways has cut the number of traffic fatalities, slower speeds for trains would hopefully have the same effect.

Council authorized City Atty. Joe Davis to repare an ordinance repealing an old 12-mile per hour train speed ordinance which had proved to be unenforceable, in favor of a new ordinance setting the limits at 35 miles per

Candidates' Promises Heard In Altamonte

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - With the primary elecions behind them, candidates for six offices in Seminole's November general election were off and running at a political forum Tuesday sponsored by the Altamonte-Casselberry Chamber of Commerce at the city's civic

Candidates who spoke are vying for two legislative seats, two county commission posts and two school board

Bob Hattaway of Altamonte Springs, in his first bid for elective office - the seat in the Florida House of Representatives currently held by Republican Gene Mooney - tied himself to popular Gov. Reubin Askew's

A Democrat, he praised the Askew administration for taking state government out of "the red," laying much of the blame for high utility rates and galloping inflation to the GOP. Hattaway specifically cited gasoline prices and reports that President Gerald Ford's administration is considering adding another 10 cents per gallon tax to the

already high price. "I'll do something about utility rates when I get to Tallahassee," he said. Incumbent Mooney said he was working to cut spending in state government before it became the vogue. He pointed to the \$200,000 surplus in state coffers, saying Democrats turned down his sponsored legislation to turn

the money over to local boards of education thus per-

Incumbent legislator Vince Fechtel (R-Leesburg) tagged himself a staunch conservative who has given performance rather than promises, pointing with pride to his sponsorship of the Seminole County Land Planning Act. He said his other sponsored legislation would replace welfare with "workfare," adding he is working toward repeal of the corporate "income tax."

His opponent, Robert Pearson (D-Sanford), said legislation is badly needed to place a spending limitation

on political campaigns, saying that a successful campaign for the legislature costs in the neighborhood of \$55,000, discouraging sum for a man of modest means. Pearson said the voters should demand accountability from their elected officials. An educator, he contended many education laws

passed in Florida are evidence of "sheer stupidity." Democrat Tom Binford, in his first effort in the political arena, called for a halt in county government spending and a one year moratorium on the hiring of new county employes. He said although the county's rate of taxation has declined over the past few years, the county has actually been spending revenue at a higher rate than growth





Rancher Bill Greenway said the calves - all too expensive to raise to maturity - will be shot in the head and buried by bulldozers in a mass grave. "There's nothing left to do," Greenway said. "It's an act of mercy. I can't afford to raise them and I can't give them away. Nobody wants them. Feed just costs too

"We can't go on like this anymore. It's not a publicity thing ... I've got 1,000 head and I'm losing \$100 a head on every one of them," he said.

LONDON- (AP)-Douglas McMinn turned hir small store into a million dollar business in 28 years. Now, he has sold his firm for about \$3.6 million and has decided to give his 205 employes most of the money.

"I was born broke and that's the way I'm going to die," said McMinn, 63. "Any success I had is almost entirely due to the men and women who have stuck by me all these years."

He said he planned to give the workers \$2.4 million from the sale of his firm, which markets everything from nails to heavy industrial equipment. The remainder would go to charity.

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - Project Independence, the federal energy program, is

When announced by former President Nixon the goal was to increase U.S. energy production enough by 1980 to insulate the nation from the power of foreign oil cartels. The target date first slipped to 1985; now advisers talk of 1990, 2000

Unless there's more progress soon than is now in sight, we may be open to price jacking or boycott by Arab nations and their petroassociates until the 21st century. Sitting in on sessions of an energy crash program advisory board provides a dismal picture of government failure.

The advisers are competent - top-flight executives and researchers from industry universities and the financial world. They pull no punches, sound more gloomy than the economists. They believe the independence goal is possible — eventually. But because Congress and the White House put energy on a back burner when long gas lines ended at the filling stations, the coming mid-term crunch is just as certain as it seemed last winter. The board I sat in on ticked off these problems

Finance: Some \$600 billions, or \$40 billion a year will be needed over the next decade and a half to reach the energy goals by 1990. Private corporations alone would have to raise \$16 billion a year in equity capital in 1973 dollars. Even in 1972, U.S. corporations secured only \$8 billion through new stock issues. By 1971 the figure dropped to \$2.3 billion. This year \$600 million is expected. That's for all corporations, not just

Petroleum: The major prospects for oil discoveries are in the offshore oceans. These are little surveyed or geologically mapped. Not much is being done to remedy this lack. Shale: Once a big hope, the shale-to-gasoline program is now beset with political and environmental problems. Some 80 per cent of the most likely shale is on government land, where holdings by law are so restricted that profitable development is unlikely without congressional

Nuclear power: The experts are not at all certain there are sufficient high-grade uranium ore deposits to fuel a uranium industry of the size foreseen in Project Independence. Foreign ores

Production is expected to decline ghtly between now and 1977, unless something more is done than seems likely now.

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Big Cypress National Preserve, an environmental blueprint for the last three years, has reached the White House. The Senate passed and sent to the White House on Tuesday compromise legislation authorizing expenditures of \$150 million to establish the the preserve in Southwest Florida.

The legislation produced by a House-Senate conference committee, provides for acquisition of the 576,000 acres of Big Cypress Swamp over the next six years by the Interior Department.

A spokesman for Sen. Lawton Chiles, D-Fla., said President Ford is expected to sign the bill, which was endorsed by the Nixon administration. The legislation, in varying forms, has been pending since 1971.

Billy Graham In Brazil

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil (AP) - Evangelist Billy Graham and the Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr. Michael Ramsey, are visiting Brazil at a time of growing Protestant strength in the traditionally Roman Catholic country. The nation of 105 million has the world's largest number of baptized Catholics, an estimated 85 per cent of the population. It also has a Lutheran president, more Protestant clergymen than Catholic priests and en evangelical movement that claims a membership in the millions. Graham is in Rio de Janeiro for a five-day crusade, Dr. Ramsey, spiritual head of the Anglican Church, is on a tour of Anglican congregations in South

Venezuela Hikes Oil Tax

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) - The Venezuelan government is raising the tax it collects on exported oil. and a spokesman says the increase will add \$440 million to its oil earnings this year. Mines and Hydrocarbons Minister Valentin Hernandez announced Tuesday that the tax on oil produced in Venezuela, mostly by American companies, is being increased 41 cents a barrel - from \$8.65 to \$9.06 -- retroactive to last Jan. 1. The companies include Shell, Gulf, Mobil, Texaco, Sun Oil and Exxon's Creole Petroleum. Venezuela is the largest supplier of foreign oil to the United States, shipping more than 1.5 million barrels a day to the American market and another 350,000 barrels a day to Canada.

Kissinger Meetings Quiet

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger is avoiding discussion of major issues during his meetings this week with officials from the Middle East and is waiting until he gets to the region next week for meaningful talks, U.S. officials say. Kissinger spent most of Tuesday meeting with Arab diplomats. Two of his appointments today were with Foreign Ministers Yigal Allon of Israel and Ismail Fahrny of Egypt.

Safety Standards Challenged

Mayonnaise Price Doubles

The Associated Press compared prices in eptember 1973 with prices this Sept. 1 and Oct. 1. The pot check showed that prices for mayonnaise and nayonnaise-type dressings went up sharply over the past 3 months in many areas and and there are indictions of further increases ahead. The increases ranged from 8 to 27 per cent. In Washington, D.C., the price of a quart of mayonnaisetype dressing more than doubled, going from 65 cents in September 1973 to \$1.49 on Oct. 1.

(AP) - Emil Danciu, an unsuccessful independent candidate for Congress two years ago, has asked the Florida Supreme Court to include his name on the November ballot as a Senate candidate. It requires independent candidates to present a petition signed by 5 per cent of the voters in order to be placed on

Danciu, of Delray Beach, says the law is discriminatory because it allows a third party candidate to win a place on the ballot with only 3 per cent of the voters signing a petition. He appealed a July 17 ruling by Leon County Circuit Judge Hugh Taylor that upheld the present law.

economy these days. Most doctors still use the term for lung disease that causes distention or inflation of the air sacs. Your lungs are a collection of tiny air sacs that function to a large extent like a collection of tiny balloons. And, they are also elastic. When you let your breath out their normal lasticity squeezes the air out of the lung, much the same way an inflated balloon shoote air out

when you open it.

The overinflation of the lung can occur from loss of the normal elasticity of the tiny air sacs. Or, it can occur from longstanding obstruction to the outlet of the air sacs that eventually connect to your large ipe (trachea). Anything that obstructs the normal outflow of air from the lung can contribute to the gradual development of a persistently

The loss of normal lung funca person. A long standing cough from chronic infection may or may not be present, or a person may have a cigarette hack. At rest the person may not notice anything new. He is literally able to supply only enough oxygen for his body at rest. Often the first signs are ecreased exercise tolerance. He may get tired and short of breath with exertion that used to be no problem. This symptom progresses so that with less and less effort he gets breathless and fatigued.



By JOY COOK Associated Press Writer NEW YORK (AP) - Two days after his 16th birthday, Jerome Murphy's freedom ended. He was arrested, on Sept. 17. 1973, for selling \$30 worth of heroin to an undercover narcot-

ics agent. Black, a school dropout, veteran of juvenile courts in Albany, N.Y., Murphy was convicted and given life in jail. Murphy is one of 150 persons given life terms under a drug law that went on the books in New York State Sept. 1, 1973. The new law put punishment for illegal drugs on a par with murder and kidnaping. But city and federal narcotics experts say that it hasn't put a dent in this city's huge drug traffic, at

east not yet. The year-old law says that anyone at least 16 years of age convicted of selling an eighth of an ounce or more of almost any drug must go to jail for a minimum of one year and a maximum of life. Lifetime parole supervision is mandatory after release from jail.

Under the old drug law, life terms averaged about two dozen a year, and then only for major offenders involved in big drug operations. Heroin and cocaine are more

available on New York City streets today than a year ago, law enforcement officers say. But, they add, the real impact of the new law will come ince mandatory life terms are com-

Spit-Roast Lamb Is A Treat

By CECILY BROWNSTONE Associated Press Food Editor We find that spit-roasting leg of lamb on an open broilerrotisserie is economical and provides great eating. Because the spit-roasting is slow and it comes to the table the way i Open broiler-rotisseries are smokeless, nonspatter and easy to clean. They come in two sizes: one has a compact 12 by 81/2 inch heating element and the other an extra large 15 by 10 inch heating element. A large cut of meat such as a leg o lamb may be spit-roasted on the compact as well as on the extra large model. It's not the weight of the meat that counts; you just have to make sure that it is no longer than the heating element. By cutting off a little of the shank bone on our 71/2pound leg of lamb, it was the right length for our compact

the open broiler-rotisserie i fine for the broiled chicken and fish that so many of us like to serve often these days. And i be interested to know that the extra-large, open broilerrotisserie uses one-third less electricity than a rotisserie in an electric kitchen range.

If you plan to invest in a ro sider acquiring a meat thermometer with a short stem especially designed for spit-roast-ing. One of these we've tried is stainless steel and may also be used when roasting meat in the oven of the kitchen range.

The following recipe is a great one for spit-roast lamb. When a friend gave it to us, and before we tried it, we wondered whether the coating of coarse salt, tarragon and peppercorns might fall off. Interestingly enough it doesn't, and it adds immeasurable flavor to the

SPIT-ROASTED LAMB 5 to 71/2 pound leg of lamb 2 gzzlic cloves, slivered 2 tablespoons coarsely ground black pepper (kosher) salt 1/2 to 1 teaspoon crushed dried tarragon If a 71/2-pound leg of lamb is

used, you may have to have enough of the shank bone cut of heating element of open broilerrotisserie. Let lamb stand at room temperature for a few hours before roasting With a sharp pointed knife make deep slits at intervals in the surface of the meat and ingredients and roll lamb in mixture, patting it down. Slide a holding fork to the end of rotisserie spit. Insert spit through lamb so that it is wellbalanced and insert other holding fork; secure. Place on spit supports so that meat is as close as possible to the heating element without touching it. If used, insert meat thermometer. Place motor on spit arm support; turn on motor. Spit-roast to desired doneness — it will take 21/2 to 3 hours for welldone meat - 175 degrees on the meat

HOUSTON, Tex. (AF) - David is a 3-year-old who has never skills are advanced and "he already knows his letters," Free known a mother's kiss or the touch of a bare human hand. He lives in a plastic bubble, and doctors say there's no medical certainty

David suffers from a disease known as severe combined immune deficiency. His body has no immune defenses against disease. Even bacteria that most people can easily throw off

For three years he has breathed filtered air, has eaten sterile food and has been cuddled only by hands wearing big, black rubber gloves which extend through the wall of his bubble. He was delivered by Caesarean section on Sept. 21, 1971, and was placed immediately into a plastic-walled bubble. He has lived

behind plastic and glass ever since. "It's only in the last month or six weeks that he's began to think about getting out," said Dr. David A. Freedman, a professor of psychiatry at the Baylor College of Medicine.

"I think that the next step is for him trying to remove himself from that room. The whole question is how long can you keep someone in a goldfish bowl. At the request of the boy's mother and father, hospital officials

parents. They said he has one sister. Freedman says that so far David's development - physically, intellectually and emotionally - has gone well.

He is also agile and strong. He jumps and climbs and plays ball inside his 9-by-7-by-6-foot bubble with more skill than most 3-yearolds. He sleeps in a tunnel-shaped annex to the bubble. David knows his mother and father, even though they've been only faces on the other side of a plastic wall, and responds to them He goes home in a portable bubble and stays with his family

every six weeks or so. He lives there in a grouping of bubbles. What the future holds is uncertain. "We definitely know what it holds if we don't do anything," said Dr. John R. Montgomery, co-leader of the team caring for David. We know what the future would be outside the bubble."

David's condition occurs about once in every 10,000 births. For most, death comes in eight or nine months, usually from a massive, uncontrollable infection. What the doctors hope to do is to awaken David's natural immunity. Next week, they plan to try injections of a thymus extract
