



## More facts about this summer's power Situationi

On Monday, June 26th, one of FPL's largest power generators developed mechanical problems and was temporarily turned off The failure of this 400,000-kilowatt unit at our Port Everglades power plant drastically reduced our generating capacity. And, for several hours, placed much of Florida on the very brink of a power shortage.

FPL was able to meet that crisis by borrowing electric power from other Florida utilities.

Can we always rely on other utilities? On June 26th we were fortunate. Some of our neighboring electric companies had enough power reserves to share with us. At other times, these utilities could be meeting such high power demands that they would have none to spare. Or they may have serious problems themselves. This is what happened on Friday, June 30th, when a neighboring company was forced to shut down its largest generating unit and had to call for emergency help from FPL and other utilities on the state's interconnected network.

What else can we do? While FPL continues to build facilities that promise future relief to the tight power situation, we're asking you to please save electricity between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m., the hours when everybody-at the same time-uses the most power It is during this time that you should take special care to use less electricity. And help avert a power shortage.

How can you do this? For a start, set your air conditioner thermostats so the temperature will be a bit warmer than usual. Also, you can plan meals that require little or no cooking. If you must cook, do it before 4 p.m. or after 8 p.m. And limit the amount of hot water you use for dishes, showers, and other uses.

FPL has printed a pair of free booklets that tell you how you can save electricity (and money) while using your air conditioner and other major electric appliances. Both booklets are available at any FPL office or at most appliance dealers.

During these summer months of high power demand, any major mechanical problem in our generating network could lead to a power shortage. Should this happen, you will be immediately alerted via radio and television as to the problem. Meanwhile, we ask for your confidence and cooperation.

#### We Could Profit From Soviet Snags

President Nixon's aides count on the unfortunte results of Leonid Brezhnev's latest economic experiments to push the Soviet Union into greater accommodation with the

If these current boggles become increasingy serious, and Nixon's experts predict they will, Brezmev's eco. nomic problems could be a strong force for at effective follow-on agreement covering all major strategic arms and hopefully calling for cutbacks as well as ceilings. Brezhnev's immediate problems began as the result of a decision he made about two years ago, in part to solidify his position as first secretary through increasing part control over the economy and in part to remedy the growing productivity problems that plague Soviet industry

The Communist party has always been supreme in overall economic direction-setting quotas, prices and priorities. This has been bad enough for economic efficiency. Brezhnev has gone a step further, given the party committees in each local factory strong direct say in day-to-

The word now coming out of the Soviet Union is that this shift is not working well. Factory managers complain their autherity is being undermined. They strenuously object to party interference in the selection of foremen, superintendents and department heads, in work assignments and in training methods. Party workers in each plant find themselves required to police their supefors on technical matters outside their competence. Party nterference, even when it succeeds in forcing an ineffi cient manager to resign or to change his methods, has had unsettling effects among the workers. Professional relationships have been destroyed. Production is suffering. Each side blames the other

Despite all this, local party committees are reported working on ways te intensify their supervision. Nixon's economic analysts see a basic unsolvable conflict here. They are certain that these difficulties will deepen and that increasing party interference in the details of local factory production will lead to greater inefficiencies, regardless of what brilliant technological breakthroughs Soviet scientsts achieve.

This will make the Russians increasingly conscious of their arms burden and (if analysis here is correct) of their need for U.S. matagement and development skills Growing dependence in the United States should make the Soviet Union more cooperative if U.S. negotiators are hard nosed, the theory here runs. But the Soviet represen tatives are going to be tough bargainers, whether talking about arms, economics of political settlements in such places as the Middle East and Asia.

The theory here is that the growing Soviet economic problems will not make Ruisian diplomats easier to negotiate with. Talks that should take two years may take five. But the Soviet difficulties may make agreements more likely in the end, if we argue from military and political strength as well as economic



#### One Man's Opinion Anti-Skyjacking To Cost Lot More

The inevitable has happened.

Back many years ago now it became apparent that skyjackings were not going to be a few isolated incidents, a passing threat to the traveling public that would run a brief aberrational course and go away. As the pattern progressed from the early forced flights o asylum in Cuba to seizures for a variety of political causes to the current skyjackings for escalating ransoms.

it was increasingly apparent that eventually the public was going to suffer much more than inconvenience. At San Francisco it happened—the death of a passenger in the shoot-out between FBI agents and skyinckers There are many who, while regretting that death and the several injuries in that and previous incidents, will nevertheless approve the FBI's decision to meet the challenge by a frontal assault. Just as there were many who earlier applauded the Israelis in setting the hard-line pre-

cedents for the storming of hostage airliners. Force is certainly one way of answering force. Not many of those speaking up for force, lowever, are themselves involved in the business of flying passengers. Even fewer are likely to have had the personal experience of a skyjacking.

Those who know it best, the flight crews, insist the skyjacking threat be met on the ground, by adequate passenger screening and other security measures. This was the demand, directed at governments and airline managements, that took pilots out in a spottily

effective worldwide strike in June. Whether due to the strike, the obvious threat to passenger life and limb or cold economics-the fitancial pain o the airlines in the ransoms—the demand new seems to be getting a more attentive hearing.

Several federal agencies, the airlines and outside experts are newly and energetically committed to developng effective procedures and equipment to thwart the skyjackers. Passenger screening may be expected to be employed more widely and concientiously and use of weapon detectors, financed by \$3.5 million voted by Congress, greatly expanded. That likely is only the down payment.

Skyjacking, which was unacceptable in the early milkrun flights to Havana, is now intolerable. Effectively ending the threat to public safety will be an expensive proposition for the airlines, the fovernment and quite possibly the ticket-buying public But we cannot afford to do otherwise.



The representative of the office explained the office had just been personally notified but the court took exception noting he had notified the office on June 8. "It appears your office is uncoordinated," Judge Arkridge rebuked.

The two defendants, Donald Goodall and John Beaulieu, were part of a burglary ring which had been in operation for three years and specialized in the burglary of homes, vehicles and business

Donald Goodall, pleaded guilty on April 3 to three counts of breaking and entering a vehicle, a lesser offense of petty larceny in a negotiated plea. According to his attorney, Ned Julian Jr., the state agreed the defendant should be sentenced to 18 months in county jail on each count. However, the court said he was inclined toward

probation for Goodall, and placed him on probation for 41/2 years. A special condition is that Goodall make restitution for a pro rata share of the stolen property. The court withheld adjudication of guilt. The other defendant, John Beaulieu, charged with grand larceny, pleaded guilty to the lesser offense of attempted grand larceny on April 3. The court noted penalty for the crime is 21/2 years in state

However, Beaulieu also was placed on 41/2 years probation by the court, who withheld adjudication of guilt. Beaulieu also was ordered, as a special probationary condition, to make restitution for his pro rata share of the stolen property and to pay court

Instead of expanding our Seminole County jail we should be emptying it. There is another side to the overcrowding. This is the courts - judges - who use our jails to file their problems. April 4, 1972, Circuit Judge

Roger Dykes wrote the commissioners deploring the overcrowding in our jail. June 1, all the 18th Circuit judges demanded action - that the commissioners expand facilities.

June 28, Judge Dykes again notified the commissioners. demanding immediate expansion or transfer of prisoners, to make room for more. It is obvious that jailing is not cutting down crime.

July 5, three commissioners held a 15-minute work session with Chief Deputy Duane Harrell, Chief Jailer Lt. Max Stewart and Estes Brockman, liaison for Circuit Court. They quickly agreed that a temporary solution could be found if the juveniles (boys) could be
