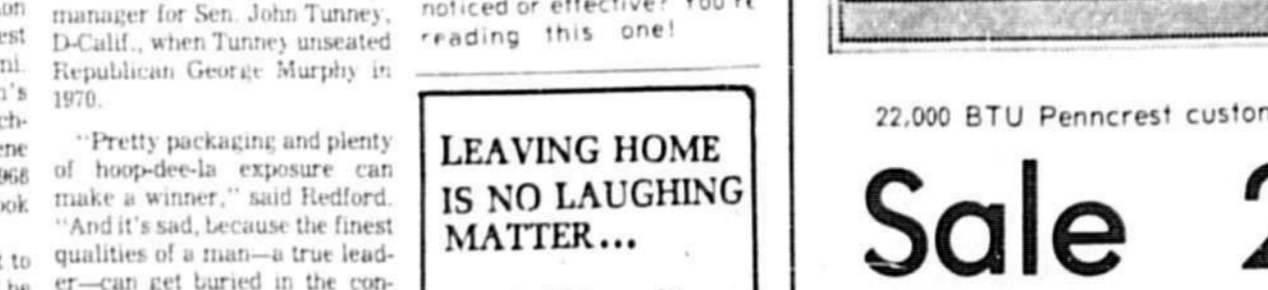

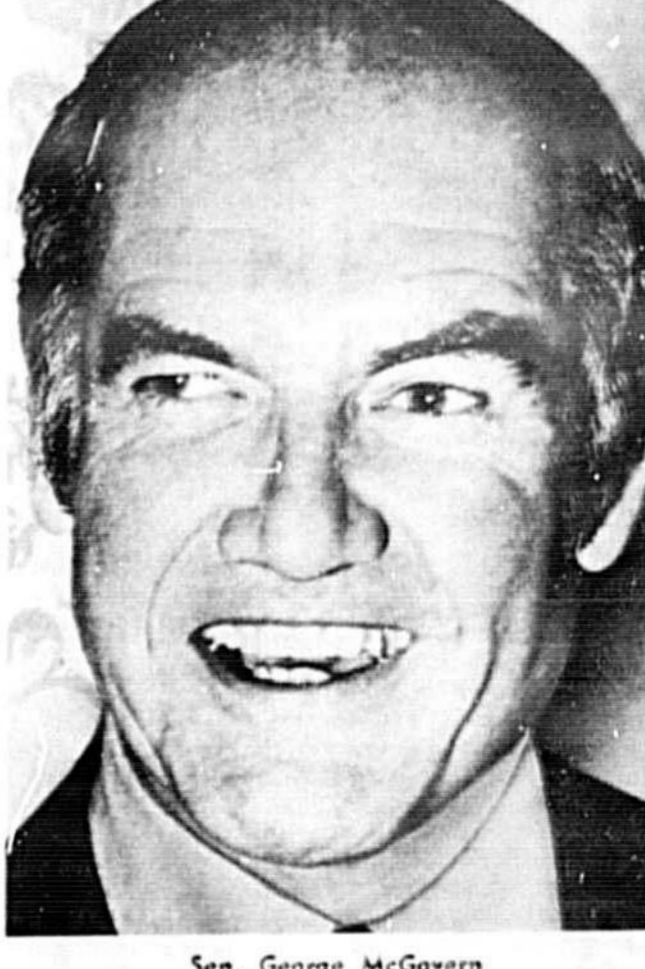

To go with the expected \$11,734,535 from the state, Seminole County is providing \$4,949,500 in local taxes, making a total of \$16,684,035 in state and county funds.

Including the race track tax funds and new teacher units earned by the schools, the total operational budget for the schools comes to \$18,728,206.

Since the county operation's budget must be figured on this known amount it was necessary that no contingency or carry-overs are included in order to give a balanced budget, Teague said.

Hopefully, the county will receive additional school money after the 4.5 per cent ratio study court battle is concluded. As much as \$10,287 might be coming to Seminole as part of ratio study.

An additional \$96,000 from the state in funds lost due to the number of elderly persons

receiving an additional \$5,000 in homestead exemptions in the county is also expected, Teague said.

Plus there is recalculation funding but not expected to be available until December, when the state gives counties with attendance increases additional funding after average daily attendances are submitted to the state.

But, until more funds are available, the School Board is considering operating without funds for emergency situations in its contingency account.

"All meetings of the City Council of Winter Springs shall be public," stated City Attorney Thomas Freeman as he read a proposed new ordinance during the regular session of the Winter Springs City Council Monday night. The city's original charter contained provisions for closed meetings in some instances. This amendment, which passed unanimously, deletes the closed meetings to conform to state law.

In other actions, the Council approved the acceptance of performance bonds totalling \$111,400 from Florida Land Company guaranteeing maintenance of roads and drainage in their North Orlando Terrace, until development for two years. The placement of fire hydrants and water systems, according to the zoning board's recommendation, also found favor.

More facts about this summer's power situation:

On Monday, June 26th, one of FPL's largest power generators developed mechanical problems and was temporarily turned off. 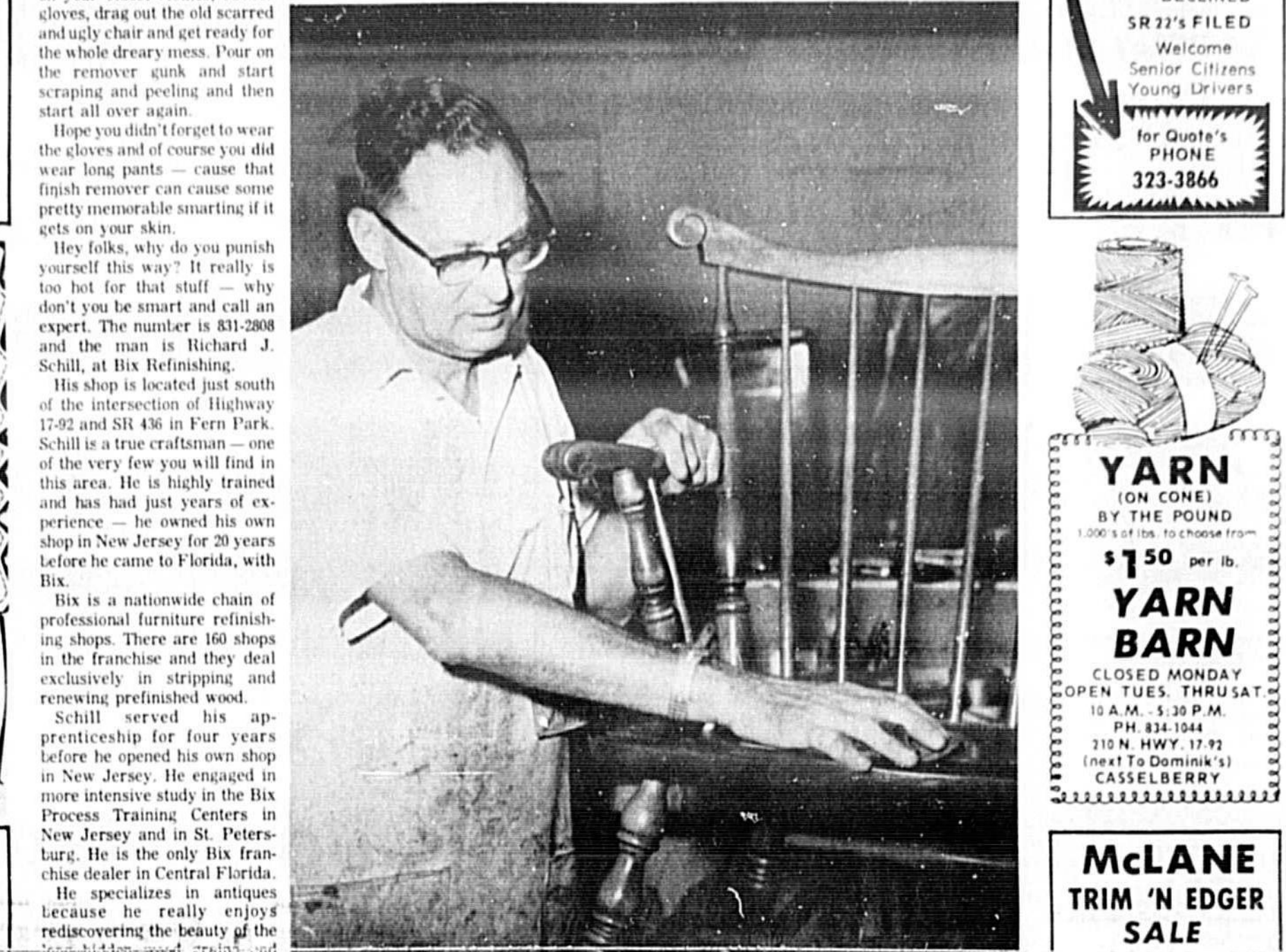

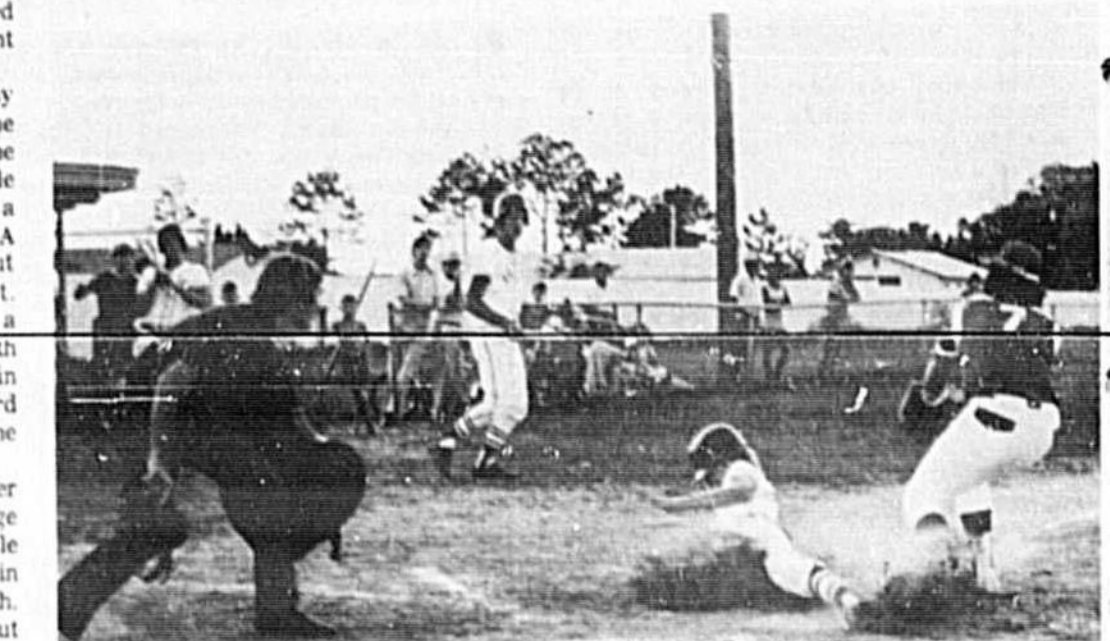

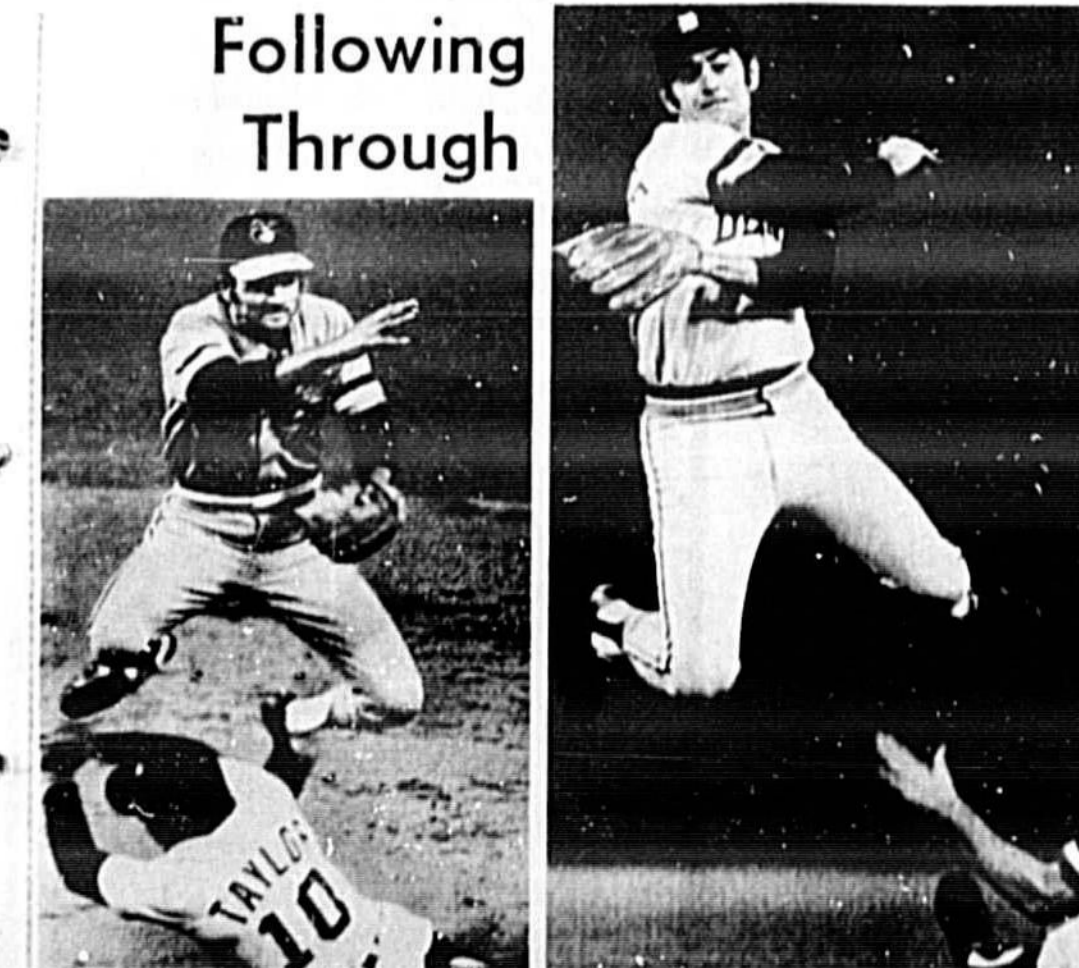
