





Must Pray REV. G. BLAIR MCGARVEY



Everybody prays. At sometime in their lives, it seems that everybody cries out to God for help in time of need. It may be the soldier in the midst of a fierce battle or it may be the child when his small world has been set in turmoil, or it may be when the Church, the Body of Christ, is called upon to come before the Face of God in repentence and prayer for themselves and this nation.

This weekend we are called to pray for the success of the thrust of evangelism all across the North American Continent. We are called to pray for the particular success of evangelism in our own sphere of influence. In light of this call to pray, let us make several observations about prayer.

Notice please, that prayer is not an option for the believer, but an obligation, . . and a most wonderful opportunity. The Bible says we are to "pray without ceasing." All too often, prayer is considered as one of several alternate approaches to solving our problems, and then more often than not it is considered as the last of the several options available. It is, more often that we may like to admit, a resource that men turn to only after every human resource has been exhausted and the man is completely spent. Then as a last resort, and only because all else has failed, we turn to God and call upon His Holy Name and petition Him to intercede in our behalf with His unlimited power.

How tragic that we have so much privilege available that we fail to exercise . The power of prayer is without a doubt the greatest untapped resource that man possesses in Christ. It is the most remarkable weapon in the battle for the souls of men and victory in the Christian life. The Scripture promises in James 5:16b, (Living Bible) "The earnest prayer of a righteous man has great power and wonderful results." And again in that same Epistle of James, "And yet the reason you don't have what you want is because you don't ask God for

Thus we note that the prayer life of the Christian is not his option, but is his obedience. It is vital to his continuing Christian walk. It is his communication with God, which brings the second observation. Prayer is not a ritual but a relationship. It centers around a person, not a performance. True prayer is often expressed in groanings that cannot be uttered as the heart of the believer weeps before God in anguish of soul for either the needs of self or others. Prayer is designed for God's ears and not for man's. Prayer may be expressed in words, but it is a communication that is not confined to mere words.

A term often heard around the old Camp Meeting was the term "praying through". While not too sophisticated, it expresses very well the prayer that wrestles with God until the need of the heart is met, the presence of the Lord is felt, and the answer is received. It is not casual prayer. The song writer asks the question, "How long has it been since you knelt by your bed, and prayed til the light broke through?" Yes, "praying through" meant "Through" to the answer. This is costly praying by committed disciples.

We are called to pray for the evangelism of Key '73. If we are going to see the Gospel of Christ advance, it is going to be as God's people pray. In the unfolding of the Gospel, God's blessing has always had it's beginning in the ministry of prayer. In this new year; this year of opportunity; this year of obligation; God's people are called to a ministry of prayer, for cleansing and for power to serve. "Men ought always to



The outline of the "energy crisis" looming in the United States of America is growing sharper. We now are seeing that the problem goes beyond developing adequate sources of oil, gas and electrical energy to keep pace with the growing demands of our highly mobile industrial society. The further question is how we are going to pay the bill to keep it going.

We have built a life-style in modern America on the assumption that there will be an abundance of cheap energy. It is as much of the price of gasoline as the price of automobiles that has made it common for a single family to own and operate two cars or even more. When considering the purchase of a new electrical appliance for our home, we are more likely to consider its price tag than the impact it might have on our electric bill

The ability of American industry to produce an enormous variety of goods within reach of family budgets is also based on plentiful supplies of relatively cheap fuel. Thus the warnings of higher fuel costs stemming from the "energy crisis" are pertinent both to our personal budgets and to the national economy

Over one-fourth of the oil needed to keep our economy functioning is now coming from abroad. The oil import bill passed \$4 billion a year and has no way to go but up, promising to aggravate our international balance of payments problem. The countries that supply this oil — especially those in the Middle East are beginning to realize they are entering a seller's market, and their price demands reflect

We are also facing a shortage in the natural gas supplies once considered to be of almost limitless abundance on our continent. American

LONDON (AP) - The parents of the "Thalidomide children" have received an offer of almost exactly what they demanded in compensation from a large liquor and drug

However, some of the parents are reacting warily to the offer of a \$47-million trust fund from the Distillers Co. It distributed the tranquilizer thalidomide which caused birth defects when pregnant mothers took the drug in the early 1950's.

The company made the "final offer" Friday for a 10year trust fund to help pay the medical costs of 342 British children born with defects, including deafness and missing limbs.
