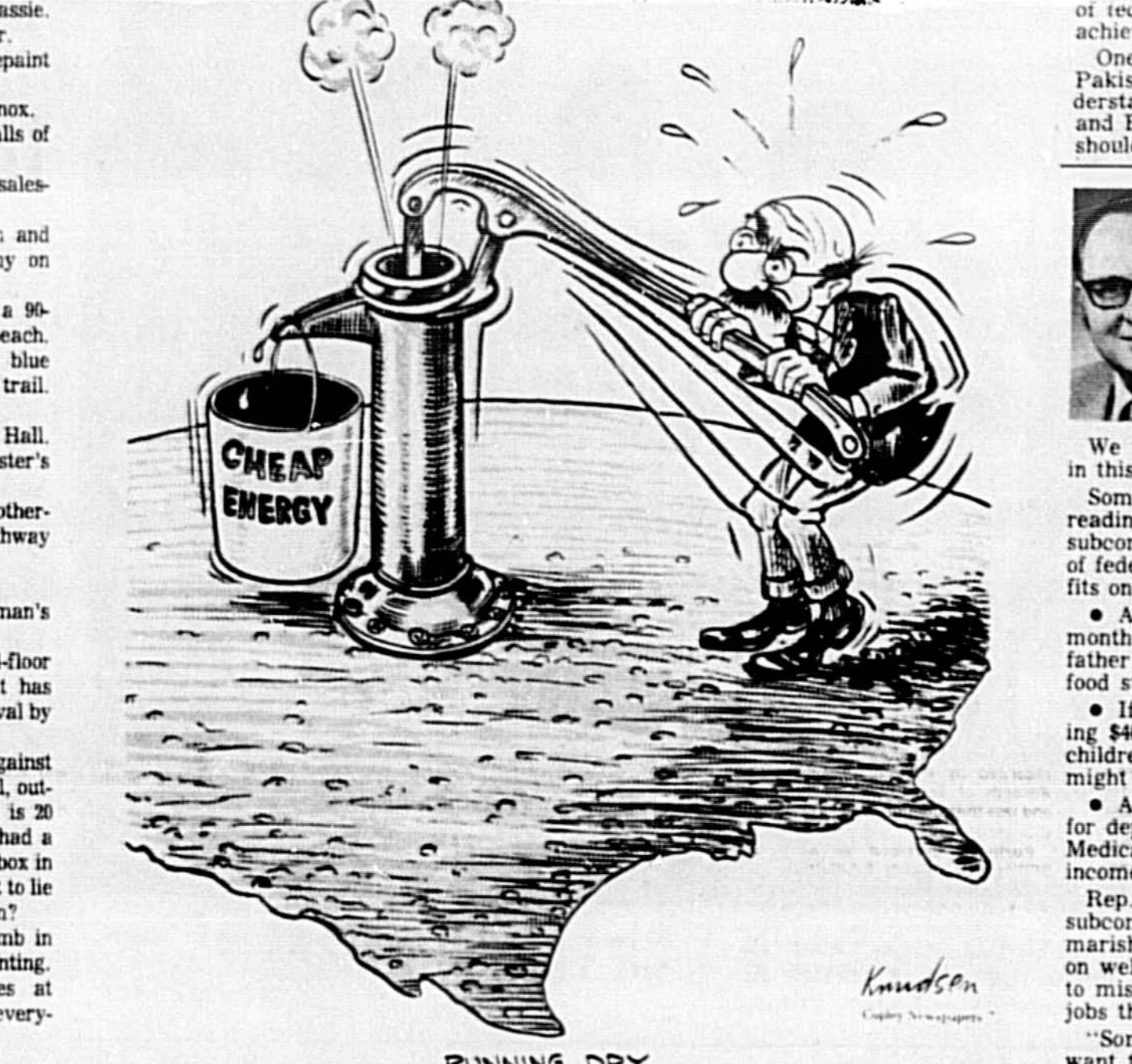

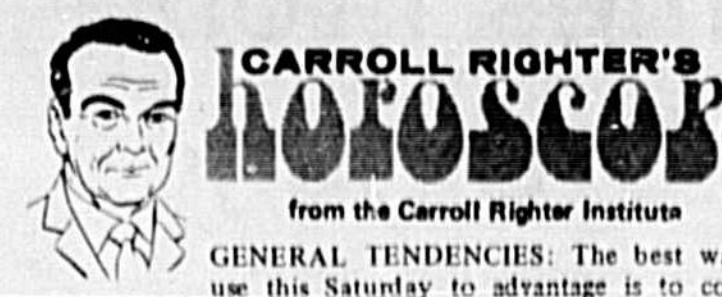

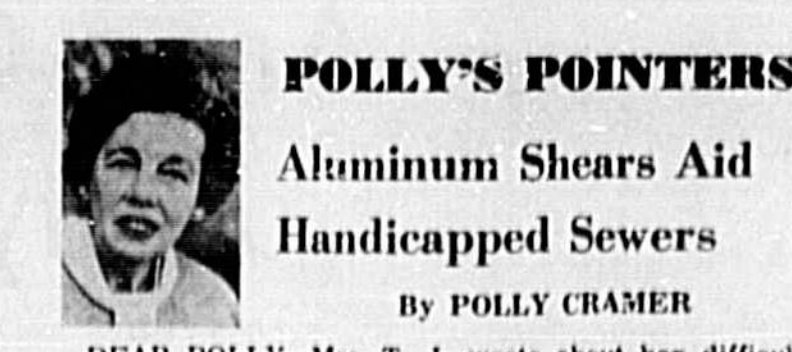

Vietnam Communists Press More Attacks

The U.S. Command refused to comment. But other U.S. sources report that aerial reconnaissance is continuing above the 20th parallel to assess damages from the Hanoi-Haiphong blitz last month, to check on repairs, to monitor the flow of war materials, and to keep target lists up to date in case a resumption of the bombing there is ordered.

'Grass' Possession Leads To Arrest

Two Sanford men and a city juvenile were arrested at a downtown pool hall Friday by the combined city-county vice unit. Gus Ashley, 19, 1614 W. 16th Street was charged with two counts each of sale and possession of marijuana with bond set at \$10,000. He remains in custody. Robert White, 18, 1710 Roosevelt was charged with one count each of sale and possession and bond was set at \$5,000. A 14-year old city youth was also arrested in the same incident.

Casselberry Police Chief George Rarber called to Bridgport, Conn., said Judge Holden's decision was not being studied. "We have not yet decided whether there will be an appeal," he said. Turner claimed the attorneys general and the Better Business Bureau had conspired to deprive him of his constitutional rights, including the right to transact business in interstate commerce. City Withholds Permits, Utilities

Sanford city commissioners have agreed the city will refuse to issue building permits or turn on utilities in San Lanta subdivision until the developer, Austin Development Company of Altamonte Springs, constructs permanent storm drainage estimated to cost \$100,000. Last week the commission held up issuance of building permits and utility connections anticipating temporary measures Austin was taking would stop flooding of Valencia Court West in front of five homes. Friday City Manager Warren Knowles, Mayor Lee Moore and Commissioners Gordon Meyer, A. A. McClanahan and Julian Stenstrom inspected the "temporary" work in San Lanta at the request of Meyer. Knowles explained that a "dike" of earth bulldozed across an unfinished portion of the street was "stupid" because it is in the wrong place. "It's blocking runoff from in front of the homes," Knowles said. "All this time Austin has been trying to run water uphill."

Turner Suit Thrown Out

MONTEPELIER, Vt. (AP) — A \$500 million law suit filed by Florida businessman Glenn W. Turner against the attorneys general of 25 states and the Council of Better Business Bureaus has been dismissed. Vermont Atty. Gen. Kimberly Cheney said Friday that U.S. District Court Judge James S. Holden dismissed the case without taking evidence. One of Turner's two attorneys in the case, The Dore Koskoff of Bridgport, Conn., said Judge Holden's decision was not being studied. "We have not yet decided whether there will be an appeal," he said. Turner claimed the attorneys general and the Better Business Bureau had conspired to deprive him of his constitutional rights, including the right to transact business in interstate commerce. His suit alleged that on two occasions the attorneys general had held meetings during which his company's methods of operation were discussed. Turner is the principle owner of several firms that operated on the basis of an alleged chain distribution system. Under that method of operation, a person contracts with the parent company not only to sell a particular product for profit, but also to act as additional distributors for profit. ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP) — Glenn W. Turner, an entrepreneur, has become president of Lilac Time Inc., a small perfume company that he and his wife acquired earlier this year. The Securities and Exchange Commission, without giving a reason, has suspended the trading of Lilac Time stock through Jan. 14. Shares in the Rochester firm were selling at less than \$1 each, but when news of the firm's acquisition circulated the price soared to \$4 to \$5. Jeffrey Tew, a Miami, Fla., lawyer who announced that Turner would head the company, said he expected Lilac Time would meet all conditions of an agreement it had made with Turner. These, he said, included the filing of overdue financial statements with the SEC. Tew said the Lilac Time firm would operate independently of other Turner enterprises, which include the Kocout Interplanetary cosmetics business and the Dare to Be Great self-improvement program. Koscut and Dare to Be Great have been under legal attack in several states and Canada.
