## Police Oust Joe Hickson

Lt. Joe Hickson, a Sanford police officer for 18 years was dismissed from the department today for negligence of duty and "conduct unbecoming a police officer," Chief Ben Butler reported.

In a letter to the City Manager, Civil Service Board and City attorney, Chief Butler said: "On the evening of March 20, 1967, while in an intoxicated condition, and in an area frequented by the public and in front of the public, to the detriment of the police department did commit and threaten bodily harm to police officers of subordinate rank within the department while acting in the performance of their lawful duties."

Chief Butler also charged Lt. Hickson with failure to properly care for and confine the city's Canine Corps dog. Butler said Hickson had been involved Monday night with a scuffle with police officers Mike Rotundo and Ralph Russell.

With the dismissal of Hickson, the police force is one short of strength, according to Chief Butler.

Hickson was not available for comment. However, indications are he will protest the dismissal to the Civil Service Board at its meeting April 6.

## Five Schools Face Double Sessions

Five schools in the county face double session in the fall, a reliable source told the Herald today.

The County School Board, meeting in special session Thursday night will discuss setting up double sessions at Sanford Junior High School, South Seminole Junior High, and the Bear Lake, Altamonte Springs and South Seminole Elementary Schools.

Indications are that in the fall the school population will soar to 17,523.

At Thursday's meeting, the board will also meet with the three architectural firms who are expected to get the contract for three new schools in the county. The three are John Burton, Sanford Junior High; Schweitzer and Schweitzer, Oviedo High School; and Watson and Co., Oviedo.

The Herald learned today the board hopes to let the bid on the three school contracts in the early fall. According to the State Survey team report in 1965, the Sanford school will cost \$1,772,498 and will include 24 classrooms on a site near the Seminole High School.

The Oviedo school will be constructed on a 43 acre site and have 16 classrooms at an estimated cost of \$1,809,280 while the proposed new Lyman school will cost \$2,570,161 and have 31 classrooms.

Indications are that only \$2,500,000 is available for construction of the three schools and that to complete the facilities, according to State specifications, a local bond issue will be pushed.

**Charges Filed; Drug Blamed For Deformities**

AACHEN, Germany (AP) — Criminal charges were announced today against the manufacturer of thalidomide, the tranquilizing drug blamed for the birth of thousands of deformed children in many countries.

More than five years after the worldwide scandal over the effects of the drug on pregnant women, nine officials and scientists of the Chemie Grunenthal pharmaceutical firm were accused formally of inflicting bodily injury and negligent manslaughter.

Local prosecutors said evidence collected since 1961 proved a definite link between the once popular drug and the wave of deformed babies.

In about 20 countries, from Austria to the Philippines, an estimated 6,500 children were born with missing or malformed limbs or with other serious defects to women who reportedly took thalidomide during pregnancy. Several thousand more were believed to have been still-born.

The charges against the manufacturers were announced at a news conference by chief prosecutor Heinrich Gierlich, 56, in a courtroom office crisscrossed with thousands of files on the case. The prosecutors who conducted the long investigation, Josef Havertz, 34, and Eberhard Knipfer, 33, sat by his side.

Up to a million thalidomide pills were produced daily by the Grunenthal firm at its factory near Aachen, before a West German pediatrician, Prof. Wilhelm Lemm, pushed the alarm button at a medical congress in November 1961.

Lemm, noting the mysterious increase of congenital malformations, found that 14 mothers of deformed babies had taken thalidomide during their early pregnancies.

His disclosure spread a wave of panic among pregnant women. Some sought abortions, among them Mrs. Gerd Frick, 40, an American housewife who traveled to Sweden for a much publicized operation. A Belgian woman killed her crippled child but was acquitted in a manslaughter trial. A similar case in Germany is still before a court.

Grunenthal stopped the sale of thalidomide in West Germany five days after Lemm sounded his warning. A criminal complaint filed by a West German couple started the prosecution investigation. Hundreds of other complaints followed.

**Answers For Veterans**

Q. What veterans are eligible for a flag to designate their status? I thought all veterans were, how I hear some are not.

A. Veterans of the Spanish American War, the Mexican Border Campaign, World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict, and certain peacetime service. The deceased veteran must have been discharged under other than dishonorable conditions and either a wartime or Korean conflict veteran, or a veteran who served at least the full enlistment during peacetime, unless discharged or released sooner for disability incurred in line of duty. The American flag can be secured from any VA office, or most local post offices by the undersigned, to designate the status of the veteran, after which it may be given to the next of kin, or close friend or associate of the deceased.

Q. We have a flag pole, as do many of our friends, and are at loss as to the proper way to dispose of our old flag each time we receive a new one. Could you suggest a proper way?

A. The flag, when it is in such a condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning. This should be so done in our area though, drop your old flags off at one of our local veteran organizations where they will do a very proper flag burning ceremony, and you will be certain it will be retired with dignity.

Q. Can the VA reduce my service connected compensation check without first examining me to determine the present extent of my disability?

A. Section 20, Public Law 114, passed by the 86th Congress specifically forbids VA reducing compensation without a physical exam. However, if VA requests a veteran to report for a physical and he fails to show up, his compensation will be stopped.

Q. If flag training approved under the new GI bill - W. F. is other than a course given by an educational institution of higher learning, does credit toward a standard college degree, may not be approved.
