### **Action Developer**

**Editorial Comment** 

When a camera shutter is clicked, the negative apparently remains unchanged. It looks just like it did before the snapshot. But it's the developer that makes the difference. As the blank film under the action of the developer begins to take on form, the details shade in one, by one and at least there is the picture, clear in its completeness, to tell a story, The recent announcement of General Dynamics' Dynatronics that they would make a significant expansion in their operation here brought clearly into view the picture that had been developing for quite a while. The "action developer" is John Krider.

And this might well be regarded as a part of a much bigger picture of Sanford, Seminole county and this area. For there are many progressive changes around here that have been started by Krider and his colleagues in the Seminole County Chamber of

Frequently, there is a chain re-action that comes about because of the initial effort. For instance, take the case at hand. Krider some years ago was given a plaque by this same Dynatronics firm because of his relentless effort to find a site for them, to get the property owner interested, to help arrange financing, to urge rapid construction and bring into active production this firm of electronic component makers. The officers were grateful for his interest, his energy his help in developing a picture that they, alone might not have been able to do. And in a tribute bathed the sunshine that means so much to this state in its invitation to tourists and industry, they had a public ceremony to say "Thank you, John Krider". This new expansion of he firm — after they have become "national" through General Dynamics - is almost the same story, and that could not have ever happened but for the first one, repeated again - with different main characters. Different, that is, with the exception of Krider.

Other pictures of progress hereabouts have come about because of the action of this same developer. The project most often MUST be developed in the "dark room" of well-kept confidences. For until all the details are clearly in place, the whole picture might be spoiled by just one slight slip. But most of us can now recognize such features as the Lakefront project, the Port Authority, Sanford Seminole Development Co. the new Winn-Dixie center that will soon get under way. Individuals, industries and prospectors for future "business gold" find in Krider a haven of interest and confidences. But more than that they find the experience of a veteran who is willing to put forth whatever action is needed to bring together the many elements that must congeal into a solid business venture in our community.

Krider has been a resident of this section of the Sunshine State a sufficient number of years to know the background that is needed in any proposal. His wide acquaintance with prominent and influential people in business, public service (or politics, if you'd rather) and finance opens doors to this dynamo of enthusiasm that others may not enter. These are the contacts that have been bringing results.

Not that John does it all by himself. He has in the CofC committees a host of dedicated business leaders whose wide diversity of talents are readily recognized. They gladly give their time and talents to the tasks at hand. But Krider's relentless energy, his "hometown interest" are the catalyst that has been bringing — and will continue to bring — results. And so, while we are rejoicing in this fine addition to our community as Dynatronics expands here. we might well extend our thanks to Krider, to Jeno Paulucci with whom Krider has worked so closely and to George Anderson, president of Dynatronics, who continues his cooperation in the development of
