have replied, when seled what he thought the U.S. lunar explorers would find on reaching the moon, 'Russians," This wry prophety may yet come true. At any rate, the story points up the fact that at this stage the big question is: 'Who will be first?

There is another question of far greatgrange importance: What shall man do when he gets to the moon? There are two hasis, though not mutually exclusive, alter-natics. The most sould be used for mili-tary observations and the launching of mis-niles. The moon could also be used for scientiffe purposes, notably as a site for astronomical observatories with a clearer view than the earth affords.

The whole question may seem a bit impractical at the moment, when no one has even succeeded in hurling a rocket beyond the pull of gravity. But one of these days a moon shot will succeed. After that, men will be near the verge of journeying to the moon. By then the question will be far from academic.

If the moon is thought of mainly as a notential military base, competition to arlive first will take on the perilous flavor of aternational hostility. But if acientific uses are kept uppermost in our minds, there is a chance of cooperative action, or at least of a more amicable rivalry.

Our approach to this question is a mat-

Communism's Followers

Too many Americans have accepted the eliche that the hungry masses of the world are demanding economic betterment, and that if they do not get this quickly from the United States they will support Communism, revolt, and line up with the Soviet bloc. This is a crude simplification of the notion of "belly Communism."

The fact is that in a number of the under-industrialized new nations the appeal of Communism is stronger among the educated and the half educated than it is among the masses of the uneducated and the illiterate. The educated and semi-educated are the sponsors of Communism in the under-industrialized world. And many of them are looking toward Moscow rather than the West for reasons of personal power, and because of irrational attitudes. The future stability of the world demands the effort to develop the under-industrialized countries, but this fort is not the sole answer to Communism.

It is not merely privation which turns ment to Communism. Many men with full bellies are for Moscow. We need to stop believing in cliches, lest we go down to defeat in bewilderment and ignorance, not ever knowing why we lost.






