# **Burton Gets Nod** On Junior High

The School Board yesterday named three different architectural firms to draw up plans for three proposed new schools in the county.

Sanford Architect John Burton was selected for Sanford Junior High School; Sweitzer and Sweitzer of Winter Park for the new Oviedo High School and Watson as! Co of Orado for the proposed new Lyman High School. Work on preliminary plans for the new schools are ex-

pected to be submitted within the next month. According to the State Education Survey team report the Junior High School will cost \$1,772,498; Oviedo, \$1,809,280 and Lyman, \$2,570,464.

The board has only some \$2,500,000 to get the three projects underway and indications are a bond issue will be needed to finish the schools.

At the same time the board authorized Burton to proceed "immediately" with preiliminary plans for the Junior College complex. The deadline for the plans is June 1 so the county can get some \$430,000 in state funds and \$45,000 in

federal appropriations. Cost of the first phase of the complex has been set at 4.500.000.

In other business during the meeting, the board tabled all bids on shop buildings at the Junior College site pending more study. The board had anticipated spending some \$40,000 for the two metal facilities. The six bidders submitted prices from \$66,466 to \$85,000;

They also took no action on modifications to the Sanford Junior High School's heating system as only two bids were submitted. The board authorized Burton to ask bids be reubmitted for the March 23 meeting;

Turned down a request from the Longwood Citizens Progress Committee to furnish paint to repaint the Longwood Elementary School. The group had planned to do the labor. However, board members felt under this plan, the structure

would have to be repainted every few years; Asked for a standardized grading program for the physical education department on the secondary level. School board members felt the "mentally strong were being penalized for being physically weak."
