

# Jail Screening Program May Reduce Inmate Population

By January 1, 1977, officials expect to begin a diagnostic ment for inmates found to need the help. rogram at Seminole County Jail at Sanford aimed at reducing repeat incarceration of offenders in the short-term county contract basis.

A \$9,810 grant from the federal Law Enforcement Assistance dministration (LEAA) is being used with state and county funds pay the \$10,900 first year cost of the program. Jail Administrator George Proudfoot said it took two years of ork to obtain the federal crime-fighting funds for the program which will entail screening of inmates who remain in jail after

assignment based on the offense, the offender's age and personal of those arrested remain in jail.

Proudfoot believes the diagnostic program, by furnishing personality profiles and background data on inmates, will help shorten the time period required for pre-sentence investigations ordered by the court from state probation and parole department

One objective of the new screening program is to reduce the average inmate population at county jail. For the three-month screening and evaluation program to be headed by a period ending in September, the average jail population was 91.5

GM Workers On Strike;

### New Contract 'Close'

DETROIT (AP) - About 80, 000 United Auto Workers struck 16 key General Motors plants today as bargainers, meeting through the night, closed in on a new national contract.

"It was simply a matter of their running out of time," said one source close to the talks. He said the two sides were "very close," adding a settlement could come "within hours."

While the 16 selected plants were idled effective at midnight, about 100 other GM plants across the country continued operating in compliance with orders from the UAW.

### Schools May Collapse

CHICAGO (AP) - Voter resistance to school tax hikes has grown so strong that schools face severe curtailment of services or even collapse - unless they get more federal and state assistance, big-city school superintendents say.

"Don't think you can get the cities straightened out if you don't get the schools straightened out," Vincent Reed, superintendent of Washington, D.C., public schools told a meeting of heads of 27 major city school

The three-day conference of the Council of the Great City Schools, which opened Thursday, was called to develop urban educational priorities that the superintendents hope President-elect Jimmy Carter will adopt.

### **Economy Meeting Described**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Congessional leaders who met with President-elect Jimmy Carter did not team up to urge an economyboosting tax cut and Carter gave no indication of a decision, one of the participants says.

Rep. George H. Mahon, DTex., said the problem of stimulating business and reducing unemployment was extensively discussed during the three-hour session Wednesday in Lovejoy, Ga., where Carter met with Democratic leaders.

"I did not detect a unanimity of the leadership concerning a tax cut," Mahon said.

### Seattle Begins Ad Campaign

SEATTLE (AP) - This Northwest metropolis, sometimes cited as one of the nation's most livable cities, has started running television commercials aimed at keeping its middle-income residents.

A January 1975 survey of 50 cities by Harpers' Magazine ranked Seattle No. 1 in livability. That magazine and The Atlantic magazine described Seattle, ringed by two snowcapped mountain ranges, Puget Sound and two lakes, as an urban jewel.

It's not just a cluster of government programs or just a government effort. Community Action must involve all sectors of the economy and all the people of our county. SCA volunteers manned tour vans taking interested citizens over the county Thursday to see first-hand the projects of SCA and the private business ventures of SEEDCO that boost the Seminole economy and offer services to the low-income families of the area. First stop for the tour was SCA's com-

munity canning plant at 504 Celery Ave., Sanford, where SCA's Energy Conservation and Home Winterization Program is also headquartered. Cannery coordinator Laura Clark explained that the facility shows citizens how

to can their own food and furnishes jars and lids and processing at low cost. Residents with poverty-level incomes aren't charged processing fees. The center offers free transportation for seasonal farm migrants and free classes on home canning, nutrition and pickling. Winterization program supervisor Alfred DeLattibeaudiere said 17 workers

are now involved in repairing homes

owned by low-income families under a

federal program where the owners pay one-half of the materials cost. Tour stops also included SCA's Headstart Centers and Outreach Centers at Sanford, Oviedo, Midway, Bookertown and

Altamonte Springs. Early benefits of medical and dental care, daily nutritious meals and snacks are offorded approximately 200 pre-school children at the Headstart Centers. In the year ending Aug. 30, the Headstart program used \$325,522 in federal funds. Officials said Outreach activities this







### Judge Reaffirms First Amendment

The free speech guarantees of the First Amendment have been reaffirmed in Federal Judge Warren J. Ferguson's ruling against the controversial "family hour" on television.

We applaud his decision, but at the same time we hope it does not spell the end of the policy which has tried to keep shows exploiting sex and violence off the television screen between 7 and 9 p.m.

That may sound paradoxical, but this important case did not turn on whether the family viewing policy is good or not. It dealt with the relationship between the Federal Communications Commission and the broadcasting industry.

This has become, and remains, a difficult area for application of the First Amendment - reconciling the long-accepted need for federal regulation of broadcasting with the Bill of Rights guarantee that Congress shall make no law abridging freedom of speech or of the press.

Judge Ferguson found that the FCC had bypassed administrative procedures established by law when it pressured the television industry into adopting the family viewing policy. Evidence was submitted that broadcasters were led to believe they might lose their licenses if they did not comply. This kind of behind-the-scenes activity should not substitute for the formal procedures which provide for public hearings on regulatory

It would hardly be more satisfying if the FCC did follow legal procedures in an effort to impose the family viewing policy. It has already extended its authority into programming with its fairness doctrine, which can inhibit discussion of controversial issues on radio and television and creates recurring problems at election time.

The "family hour" probably has been welcomed by parents who are worried about exposure to their children to lurid depiction of violence and sexually suggestive situations and dialogue, both in movie theaters and on television.

The movie rating system has been of some value in protecting children from unsuitable entertainment, and it is regrettable that a similar problem should now be represented by television sets in American homes. The rating system, for all its imperfections, is an effort by the movie industry to meet a public problem by policing itself.

Television producers who took the family viewing policy into court had a good case on constitutional grounds. It is another matter whether they could argue as well against the principle of following some guidelines of taste and morality in programs aired before the bedtime of small

Although Judge Ferguson has given the FCC a dressing down for the way it tried to impose such guidelines, the need for them still exists. If broadcasters are sensitive to their responsibility to the public, they will not abandon the principle of the "family hour" just because a judge has told

"The business of America is business," said Calvin Coolidge back in 1925. Today, many would revise that to say, "The business of America is

complying with government regulations." There is no question but that the chore of meeting the requirements of and filing reports with the federal government's lengthening list of regulatory agencies has become a major business of American businesses, large and

The first federal regulatory body was the Interstate Commerce Commission, established by Congress in 1887 to regulate the railroads. Later the ICC took on the job of regulating motor

As the nation's modern industrial economy developed in the 20th century, other agencies were created. Chief among these were the Federal Trade Commission (1914), Federal Power Commission (1930), Federal Com munications Commission (1934), Securities Exchange Commission (1934) and the Civil Aeronautics Board (1940).

In one recent year, 1974, 25,000 federal regulations were issued, and every year more than 5,000 federal reporting forms are distributed. Completing these forms (not counting tax reports) requires some 130 million work-hours annually and enforcing all the government's regulations occupies some 74,000 JOHN CUNNIFF federal employees.



They Love Well, But Not Wisely

Couples who defy the unwritten rules against mixed marriages normally are snubbed by families, friends and neighbors. That's the least they can expect.

"Couples have to be very sure of themselves to go through something like this," said a counsellor who works

with the fledgling Northern Ireland Mixed Marriages

and clergymen who advise and comfort couples who love well but not wisely. The attitudes to mixed marriages have long been set by the rival churches in Ireland. Both Protestant and Catholic churches frown on such marriages.

One of the major obstacles the Catholic church had put in the way of mixed marriages was to insist that the non-Catholic partner gives a formal undertaking to bring up any children in the Catholic faith.

The Vatican modified that ruling in 1966. Four years later Pope Paul decreed that nonCatholics no longer need
