### **Ordinance** would curb excessive police calls

SANFORD - Sanford residents are calling the police with concerns about a proposed city ordinance that would establish a charge for excessive police service calls.

The ordinance addresses the number of repeat calls to the police from individual proper-

We've been getting calls with questions about this," acting police chief Ray Bronson said.

For example, the police department said ideis Mart was responsible for 224 calls for service through Nov. 2 of this

"It's calls resulting from such businesses we're concerned with. The property owner may not have made the call. A neighbor could have been calling with a complaint."

Azmi ideis, the owner of ideis Mart on 13th Street, said people tend to use pay phones in front of his business to call the police, and meet the police on his property.

"A lot of people in this area don't have phones in their homes." Azmi Ideis, owner of Ideis Mart on 13th Street said. They use the telephones in front of this store to call the po-That goes on my record. This goes with other businesses, too. The police department itself ought to straighten the record."

A comprehensive review by the Sanford Police Department said the majority of police calls originate from certain residences, apartments, hotels, and businesses.

On Thirteenth Street, four properties were responsible for 727 police service calls through Nov. 2 of this year.

\*Hopefully this is something that the property owners will assist the police department in solving," Bronson said. "It's not fair that we're unable to provide the service we want to because some properties are tying us up."

The ordinance addresses nuisance calls originating from individual properties. sance calls would include armed disturbances, loud music, drug investigations, prostitution, disturbances involving a threat, harassment, and Piesse see Calle, Page 3A

### Land tract slated for office space

LAKE MARY - The last large tract of commercial land in the city could be developed as flexible office space, but some commissioners aren't happy about the idea.

New Century Park is 153 acres located between intestate-4 and Rinehart Road, abutting the Siemena Telecom Networks facility and next to Primera and the Rinehart Ridge project.

Currently zoned for heavy commercial, office and light industrial, the developers want to use the land to build singlefloor buildings of 50,000 to 60,000 square feet and 100,000 to 120,000 square

"I came here to make you aware of how this style building will work in Lake Mary," said Don Ammerman, spokesman for the development.

Known as "flex-space," the buildings are shells that can be modified to meet the needs of the tenants, said Ammerman. The buildings are designed to be attractive from the exterior, with high architectural style and landscaping.

Ammerman said tenants like the "store front" exposure the flex-space buildings afford. There are plenty of people who multistory building."

While the development has unanimous approval of the city's project review committee. Mayor David Mealor raised the concerns of the commission, saying that multistory building. like the Crescent buildings in Primera, were the types of buildir gs targeted for industry along the 1-4 corridor.

Flex space, conceptually, is not what I had envisioned in that area," said Mealor,

The mayor was concerned the transition, from 5 and 6-story buildings, in Primera, to the single-story buildings in New Century Park, would not be attractive to tenants in Class A office space. Deputy Mayor Thom Greene said he was worried the long-term tenants, cited by Ammerman as residents of similar business parks in south Orange County, would not come to Lake Mary, but Ammerman said he expected a Please see Buildings, Page 3A

### Going to bat for Nap Ford

Nap Ford played baseball against Jackte Robinson's Major-League All-Stars in the late 1940's. Ford was the leftfleider on the Orlando Black All-Stars

Ford was 20 and considered to be a very good player. He had a quick bat that had some pop, and he could run

and throw. Nap never made the big leagues - known to some as The Show. But he had much to show in his life that ended this week when he died suddenly at age 71 while on a trip with his wife to visit a daughter in

New Orleans. Ford's name forever will be linked in Orlando's history as a civil-rights champion, city councilman and educator. He taught at Jones High School, Winter Park High School and the University of Central

Florida. "I'm fortunate to have been on the cutting edge of change," Ford said this year. This is a new world we live in. a new Orlando. It's not perfect but it's better than what we had before."

Ford remembered when he could not go into restaurants. in downtown Orlando or try on clothes at a clothing store. Blacks could go into the stores, they just couldn't sit down or try on anything," he said.

For years, Ford said the Orlando newspaper would not run stories or pictures about blacks. "If a black was arrested, there might be a mention, " he said. "Later, the paper published a special 'colored' sheet for stories on colored people. That's the only

way we got in the paper." Notice that Ford made the bottom of the Orlando Sentinel's Wednesday edition. There was a small picture and a quote from Orlando Mayor

Glenda Hood, who said Nap Ford imparted incredible wisdom and made a difference. He did that and more.


One of Ford's aspirations was to save the impoverished Parramore community, a square mile area in Orlando plagued by crime and unemployment. He urged the community to dedicate itself to the task.

Ford showed courage in later years when he refused to go to the sidelines after having both his legs amputated below the knees because of poor circulation. He played golf by using prostheses. He had a cane but hardly ever used it.

Nap Ford is one of the great figures in Orlando's history. He will not be forgotten by either blacks or whites.

What a shame he didn't get to play more baseball when he was in his prime. He would have liked to play a few times at Tinker Field, not far from where he lived. This ballpark was for whites only when Nap Ford was growing up.

If they don't tear the park down, they might consider renaming it Nap Ford Field. Tinker's had his chance.





Is it true that all stores have to accept returns ' No! The store determines its policy regarding returns filte same policy must be applied to all people.) If a store does not accept returns, under Florida Law, it must post a sign stating that fact. If you don't see a sign ask about the store's return policy just to be

fortunately most stores do accept returns, but a cash refund



is not always assured. Ask what the policy is before making purchases. Most stores are generous in the time allowed to return purchases, but don't expect to return an item purchased 6 months earlier.

When returning items, be sure it is in the original packfor resole. Would you want to buy a returned item if someone left the operating instructions out of the parkage

Stores can legally require a sales receipt or proof of purchase to accept returns. Most stores will not give a cash refund without proof of purchase, however many will exchange the return for other merchandisc. If unable to find a replacement, you will be given store credit" for a later purchase. Without a sales receipt you will be credited with the price that the item is selling for at the time of return. If the item is on clearance at 50 percent off, that is the price you will receive credit for, not the original - vour her for a later purchase. Diffee.

Most, but not all, stores will accept returns without sales receipts when told the Item was a gift. Large stores are likely to be more generous about this than smaller independent stores. Remember, even though a gift was received in a box with a specific store's name, it is no guarantee that the item was purchased from that retailer.

It's up to the store to decide if it will give a cash refund, or exchange the item for other merchandise or Issue a store

When buying it's smart to

find out the store's refund pollcies and to keep the sales receipts in case they are needed. If you receive a gift that must

be returned, ask the giver to exchange it for you, or it he/she prefers you to exchange it, ask if a receipt is available. If you know where the gitt was purchased, you may ask the store to exchange it without a receipt. But remember, the item may have been purchased months earlier on sale and can't be returned.

### Teens and drinking don't mix

It's almost too late to worry about this for this year, but I don't know what the "proper" protocol is for allowing teenage family members to use alcoholduring holiday gatherings. Of course, they feel that they should be able to "toast" the holidays like the adults, and that has been the way it's been done in the past. But I'm getting more and more uncomfortable with it because law enforcement is cracking down on underage drinking everywhere, and it seems like we're giving conflicting messages if we let the teenagers drink at our house, but they could get arrested for doing it somewhere else. My other problem is that if I don't let my kids share in Holiday toasts, they're going to feel picked on because their cousins, who are the same age, are allowed. I'm torn both ways.

The real question is whether we want our kids to think it's OK to break the law if you don't get caught, or if your parents know you're doing it. I don't think that's the message you want to give them. In many families, alcohol is a part of the

holiday celebration. This is perfectly acceptable, when used in an appropriate manner among adults. However, as you are saving, the problem arises when teenage kids feel that they have the same entitlements as the adults.

Perhaps your best bet is to establish a "NO illegal Use" rule for your family and in your home. To make the rule conform to state and federal laws, the rule would include:

No use of alcohol by anyone under the age of 21. \* No possession or use of any

illegal drugs by anyone.

No use of cigarettes or tobacco products by anyone un-

If anyone gives you trouble about the rule, remind them that you are legally responsible for any harm done to persons or property perpetrated by a person under the influence of alcohol or any other drug supplied by or consumed in your

Some parents feel uncomfortable about establishing a 'no use" rule for their kids, when the purents themselves drink. Remember, the real Issue here ts no ILLEGAL use. If the adults



OCALA Attention nirkey hunters! Spring turkey quota hunt permit applications will be available beginning Dec. 28 at the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission's (GFC) Central Region Office in Ocala, and at county tax collectors' offices.

The applications must be submitted to the GFC's quota hunt office in Tallahassee from 4 and April 16-18). Jan. 11-20 in order to be eligible for the random drawing.

Applications received before January 11 will be returned to the applicant.

After the random drawing the GFC will issue any remaining permits on a first-come, firstserved basts.

Quota hunt permits are not necessary on private lands and many public wildlife management areas (WMAs).

However you will need one if you plan to hunt any of the following WMAs located in the GFC,'s Central Region: Baird Unit of Richloam in Sumter County (March 20-22, March 26-28 and April 2-4]: Caravelle Ranch in Marion and Putnam 22, April 2-4 and April 16-18), counties (March 20-23 and A new area, Potts WMA I March 24-28).

Also, Eloniah Creek in Putnam County (March 20-22, March 26-28 and April 24); Flying Eagle in Citrus County (March 20-23 and March 24-28); Half Moon in Sumter County (March 26-28, April 2-4 and April 9-11h and Lake George in Putnam and Volusta counties (March 20-22, April 2-

Others include Ocala - Lake Delancy Unit in Marion and Putnam counties (March 27-28, April 3-4, April 10-11 and April 17-18), Prairie Lakes Unit of Three Lakes in Osceola County (March 20-22, April 2-4 and April 16-18); Richloam in Sumter, Lake, Pasco and Hernando countles (March 20-28); and Seminole Forest in Lake County (March 20-23 and March 24-28).

And Seminole Ranch in Orange County (March 20-22, March 26-28 and April 2-4]: Tiger Bay in Volusta County (March 20-22, April 2-4 and April 16-18), and Tosohatchee in Orange County (March 20-

A new area, Potts WMA in Citrus County, will also offer spring turkey hunting this year by quota permit only (March 20-23 and March 24-28). This area was approved by the commission too late to be included on the Quota Turkey Hunt Application, so it will have its own application this year also available at the GFC's Central Region Office and tax collectors' offices.

EXEMPT HUNTERS PLEASE NOTE: The following WMAs do not allow exempt hunters except by quota permit: Haird Unit of Richloam, Etoniah Creek, Half Moon, lake George, Ocala Lake Delancy Unit, Potts, Prairie Lakes Unit of Three Lakes, Seminole Forest. Tiger Bay and Tosohatchee.

In addition to possessing a spring turkey quota hunt permit, those wishing to hunt on any of the areas mentioned above must possess a valid Florida hunting license, a wild turkey stamp and a wildlife management area stamp.






