Christmas recess, but there was no prospect that such a vote was likely on a move to withhold funds from the commission. Senator Walsh said he was uncertain of his position on such a move, adding he believed the legality of the commission's position could be questioned in the courts. Meanwhile, interest centered on the next move of the commission and whether it would re-employ Charles A. Russell, the solicitor, and William V. King, the chief accountant, whose termination of services along with all other employees of the old commission started the Senate drive against Smith, Garsaud and Draper. After the Senate had confirmed them and they had taken the oath of office, the three commissioners sent out notices to the employees of the old commission saying their services were terminated by the law creating the new commission. It would consider applications of all old employees for re-employment. Russell and King were at odds over a long period with Frank E. Bonner, executive secretary of the old commission. Some Senators charged Bonner was protecting the "power trust." Russell and King were lauded by some for opposing Bonner. President Hoover said Saturday the controversy presented "no issue for or against power companies." He recalled it was upon his recommendation that the new commission was organized and that he had recommended giving it authority to regulate all interstate power rates. The appropriation bill for the independent offices will not come before the Senate for some time. This measure carries funds for the commission. The announced intention is to bring the

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NAVY PLANES OF IMPROVED TYPE BEING DELIVERED

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recently flew in formation a record of 25,000 feet. They carried full military loads. first place among the world's beehives. The production has fallen below consumption, he holds, justifying expectation of an upward correction, but permanency of this improvement depends upon the progress we make in correcting the causes of the depression. These causes Wiggin lists as follows: Impediments in international trade through excessive tariffs and other restrictive policies. Abnormalities in certain commodity markets due to government and private attempts at favoritism. Tardiness with which finished goods, retail prices, wages and rentals have adjusted themselves to the sharp fall in raw materials. Low money rates and excessive credit which led to undue diversion of bank money to slow and speculative uses. Political difficulties, especially in India, China and Russia. Most serious of the adverse factors, he continues, "is inability of foreign countries to obtain dollars to make interest and amortization payments on their debts to us and to buy our exports in adequate volume." Cancellation or reduction of interlocking debts, he asserts, "has an important bearing on the magnitude of the debts involved." "I am firmly convinced it would be good business for our government to initiate a reduction

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The Spread Of Communism

Possibly because an unprecedented use of property throughout the country had brought about a lack of general interest in public affairs and had permitted things to happen in government which proved revolting, and because now that the reaction has set in, millions have been thrown out of employment, and business is poor, the public is beginning to think that the government and take notice of the corruption which has existed in our government and the special privileges which it has handed out, a fertile field for Communism is found in the United States.

While admitting that there are many flaws in governing bodies, many evils in our business life, we believe that public wrongs of this kind should be corrected from within rather than annihilated from without in the final analysis, in any case, the overthrow of our government, the people themselves are at fault when any fault exists. The government is not better than the public want it to be, and the public wants law enforcement, the people should obey the laws, not certain laws which particularly satisfy it, but all the laws; and the then insignificant minority which would persist in disobedience should be made to obey by the election of competent men to office.

The overthrow of our government, unthinkable as it is, certainly would not help matters any. It would not create any greater demand for this world's commodities upon which property is based. It would not necessarily place in the public offices any more efficient men than we have at present, or that we will be able to put there under our present system of government. Communism does not give to the property owner any more rights than he has at present, and it is at present for indeed the basic principle of Communism is personal retribution. The individual has no right to the fruits of his own labor, and fortunate indeed are those who are able to keep their property.

One of the most important decisions which the Supreme Court of Florida has rendered in recent years, was that handed down the other day in the case of the motor bus line operating between Seaboard Air Line and Jacksonville. The Supreme Court has ruled in favor of the Seaboard Air Line, and has ordered the bus line to be discontinued. This decision is based on the fact that the bus line is in violation of the franchise granted to the Seaboard Air Line by the state of Florida.

Complicated indeed are modern economic problems. The public interest in public utility and clean transportation. To this end, that modern vehicle, the truck is being widely utilized; the canal for facilitating water transportation was scrapped a generation ago but is again being built in favor of the air. If the medium through which quick transportation is affected, meantime, railroad investments are challenged.
