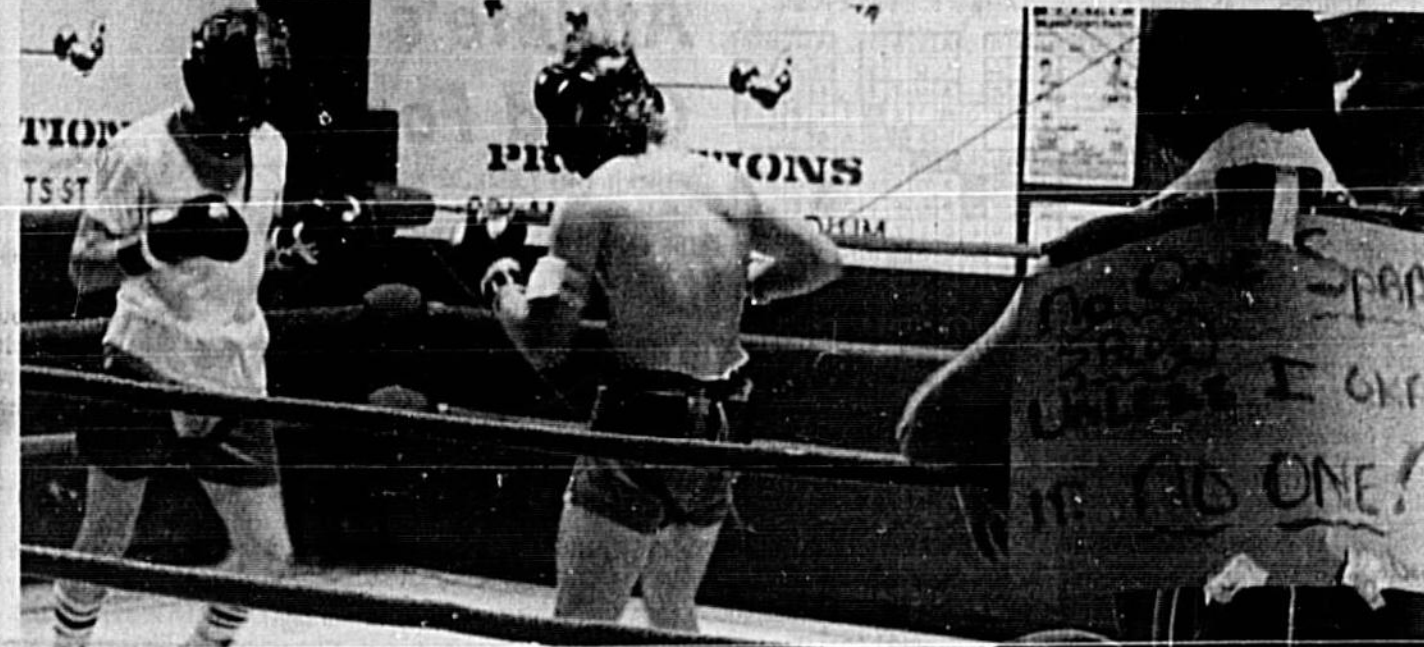

Altamonte Chiropractor Answers Doctor Charges

"In 'The Health Robbers,' part of a series copyrighted by the Leigh Valley Committee Against Health Fraud Inc., Philadelphia, Pa., distributed by Newspaper Enterprise Association, and appearing in The Evening Herald Monday, Dr. Stephen Barrett raised several issues against the chiropractic profession. Altamonte Springs chiropractor, Dr. William P. Webb II today replies to these.

ISSUE: Chiropractic began in 1888 when David Daniel Palmer restored the hearing of a deaf janitor by adjusting a bump on his spine. Palmer claimed to release pressure on a nerve in the ear, but the nerve from the brain to the ear does not travel inside the spinal column. DR. WEBB: There is a recurring nerve within the cervical spine which affects the interpretation of hearing. We now know that the particular adjustment made by Palmer affected the pressure of the cerebral-spinal fluid. That affects the pressure inside the ear drum itself.

ISSUE: Palmer offered courses in chiropractic by mail. DR. WEBB: There was mail order with colleges, but not with Palmer. There was also mail order in those days with all healing arts colleges. ISSUE: Chiropractic training is not on a par with medical training. DR. WEBB: More than half the states in this country, under pressure from the American Medical Association (AMA), formed a Basic Sciences Board and forced chiropractors to be medical doctors in the eyes of the law.

ISSUE: How does that apply to Florida? DR. WEBB: What has happened in Florida is that medical doctors were taking the examination for basic sciences and not passing them, while chiropractors completed them successfully. The medical doctors applied to the legislature via their college advisory boards to do away with the basic sciences so more

medical doctors could be licensed. In other words, we (chiropractors) had to "become" pathologists to pass their pathology exam, basic biologists in order to pass that exam. Chiropractors also have their own board of examiners, as do medical doctors, osteopaths and others. ISSUE: Chiropractic does not recognize the germ theory of disease. DR. WEBB: We do not ignore the germ theory. Very briefly, when a germ takes over a diseased tissue, the nerve supply to that tissue has already been diminished. Germs do not attack electrical energy and that is what the nerves carry.

ISSUE: Chiropractors attempt to treat such serious ailments as cancer, diabetes by spinal manipulation. DR. WEBB: In the State of Florida chiropractors are not allowed to treat cancer, by law, and we have the law on our backs. On the diabetes situation: yes, chiropractic effectively treats diabetes, but not high blood sugar, because the sixth dorsal nerve controls insulin regulation and production. ISSUE: The entire science of chiropractic revolves around a "subluxation" and chiropractors cannot agree on what that is.

DR. WEBB: We developed the word "subluxation," which is defined as a vertebrae that become misaligned, causing pressure on the spinal cord. The reason medical doctors have a difficult time trying to find out what a subluxation is, is that they are not taught what it is. ISSUE: adjusting the spine is dangerous. DR. WEBB: Adjusting the spine is not dangerous when it is done by a skilled chiropractor according to Dr. Webb, has filed an anti-trust suit against the AMA in Chicago because of the AMA's effort to discourage patients from seeking chiropractic aid.

Dr. Orville Barks, public health director for Seminole County, has resigned his position because of "aggravation" brought on by a county reorganization which placed his department under the department of human services.

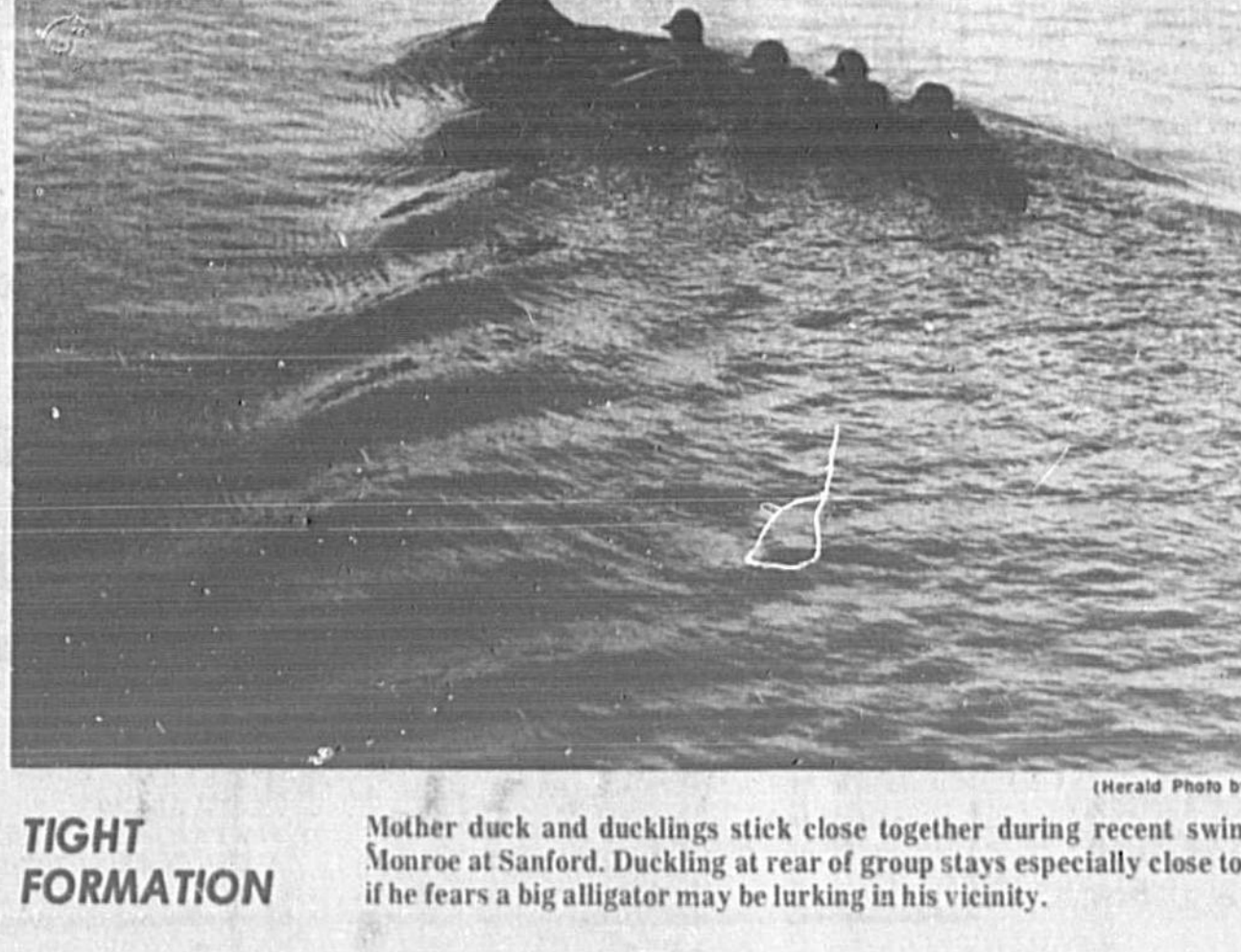
