

Ten years ago there were something like 30,000 automobiles in use in the United States. The number has increased now until there are nearly a million automobiles and over 30,000 trucks. The increase in the use of auto trucks in this country in 1912 over 1911 is estimated at 24 per cent. In Indiana there was in 1912 an automobile registered for every sixty inhabitants of the state. Autos are increasing rapidly and the farmers are buying a large number of them. With one of them a ten or twenty mile drive in the evening in an hour or so, an impossible thing with a horse, is a common thing. But good roads are necessary for a pleasant drive and are a valuable asset to good business. An increased amount of travel and the progressiveness of the country are other indications that butter highways are necessary.



Three dead, scores injured and hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of property destroyed for the toll recorded in the hurried canvas made when the city aroused itself after half un hour of helplessness in the grasp of the elements. Out of a blazing sky, under which the city was sweltering with the temperature at 100 degrees, came the storm, roaring from the north, driving a mass of clouds that cast a mantle of darkness over the city.
