



LA Airport Bomb Probe

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Authorities are inspecting heaps of debris in an effort to determine who placed a bomb that killed two persons and injured 36 at Los Angeles International Airport. Federal aviation officials said the explosion on Tuesday was believed the largest ever to hit an airline terminal in the United States and the first to kill anyone. Officials said they could conceive of no motive for the explosion and had no leads

Klein Discounts Barb

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP) - Herbert G. Klein, President Nixon's former director of communications, says, "No one likes to have himself referred to in derogatory terms. And when you read something like that you don't forget it." Klein was reacting to the latest Watergate transcripts released on Monday by the White House. In one passage, the President criticizes Klein's handling of a meeting with television network executives, saying Klein "just doesn't really have his head screwed on" and saying he was disorganized "But I don't regard it as a serious blow to a friendship that has gone on over a number of years." Klein said in an interview on Tuesday. "When he called me unorganized, it was because I never believed in writing a lot of memos."

Coal Talks Start

CENTRALIA, Ill. (AP) - Coal companies and miners will begin new contract negotiations some time this month, with each side hoping to sidestep a nationwide strike like the one that shackled the industry three years ago. But some officials of the 120,000-member United Mine Workers have already accused the companies of foot dragging. They say the issues are so numerous and complex the talks should already be under way if a pact is to be agreed upon by the time the current contract expires Nov. 12. No date for the first session has been set.

House Cuts Vietnam Aid

WASHINGTON (AP) - The House has voted a \$300 million cut in U.S. military aid for South Vietnam, in what proponents called notice for the Thieu regime to negotiate a political settlement with Hanoi and the Viet Cong. The cut to a post-Vietnam war low of \$700 million in U.S. military aid was made in a \$83.4 billion defense appropriation bill approved by the House.

U.S. Planes Leave Taiwan

WASHINGTON (AP) - The United States has quietly withdrawn half of its F4 Phantom jet warplanes stationed in Nationalist China at a time when mainland China has started basing missile-firing boats near the Taiwan

Defense officials, acknowledging the pullout of a squadron of 18 Air Force F4s in late July, said there was no connection between the two events. These officials said the withdrawal of the F4 squadron

to the Philippines had been planned for some time. They noted that the Air Force still has a squadron of Phantoms on Taiwan and that the United States remains committed to defend Nationalist China from attack, even while seeking improved relations with the People's Republic of China.

Cyprus Fighting Flares

VASSILIA, Cyprus (AP) - Greek Cypriot troops pulled back without firing a shot and dragging their wounded with them today, as Turkish infantrymen launched fresh attacks behind a continuing artillery barrage along the northern Cyprus coast. "Our Greek officers told us not to fight back," said a

tall, unshaven national guardsman, as he stood with Western newsmen and watched shellfire bursting amidst the hotels and vacation homes of Vassilia, 12 miles west of the Turkish enclave of Kyrenia. The attacks were a continuation of Turkish onslaughts

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - A ruling that a lower court did not have jurisdiction to hear a contempt complaint by a legislative committee against St. Petersburg lawyer Robert N. Bussey has been issued by the 1st District Court of Appeal.

The appeals court said Tuesday that the Leon County Circuit Court erred in not dismissing the complaint, filed by the Joint Legislative Auditing Committee, because Bussey was not properly served with the action.

Drug Arrests Continue

MIAMI (AP) - Drug Enforcement Administration officials say the arrest of five men on narcotics charges shows that the collapse of the agency's Miami office building will not hamper the DEA's activities.

Seven persons were killed when the roof of the building fell through two floors of offices Monday. About 33 hours later, the DEA announced the arrest in Miami of five men on federal drug charges and the seizure of more than two pounds of cocaine with a street value estimated at \$250,000.

Meanwhile, Don Hickman, Miami fire chief, said Tuesday that the collapse was caused by the weight of 57 autos - impounded during drug investigations - that were parked on the roof.

The man issues a statement admitting he has lied to the American people, the House Judiciary Committee and his own lawyers and turns right around and argues that the entire record of his post-Watergate conduct "does not justify the extreme step of impeachment and removal of a president.'

The hell it doesn't. In an earlier day it might well have justified a hanging.

The mind's eye flickers and a television screen comes into view. There's Richard M. Nixon giving his 600th explanation of his knowledge of and conduct throughout the Watergate coverup.

The President is sweating a little-probably because of the television lights, we tell ourselves. But his jaw is firm and he stares each of us in the eye as he gestures with his left hand to a stack of tape transcripts and assures us that there, ladies and gentlemen, is the complete record of everything your President knew and said and did about Watergate.

Well, of course it wasn't-even those transcripts he himself selected for our edification suggested he was being less than candid. Now comes the information-not from John Dean, not from Howard Hunt, not from any of his close associates now 'doing time'-but from his own mouth that he didn't even tell his lawyer the truth. Nor his vice president. Nor such men as Rep. Charles Wiggins (R-Calif.) and Rep. Charles Sandman (R-N.J.) who were permitted to make asses of themselves on national television defending a man who knew time was running out on the

We're not vindictive. We don't want President Nixon impeached. The country has far more important problems to tackle than to waste its time on a foregone conclusion. All we want Mr. Nixon to do is go away, quietly and as soon as possible and as far as possible. Take the pension, take the staff salaries and office allowances. Take the free office space. Take Pat's life insurance. Take anything you can lay your hands on in the next few days.

But, please, just go away. We're sick of you and we're sick of your lies and we're sick of your pretensions and we're sick of the virus you've injected into the bloodstream of public service.

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - Even with expected high infusions of Arab oil money into the U.S. economy, we can expect some most difficult times in the years just ahead unless the federal government changes its foolish financial-

In prospect are a rash of business and bank failures, rising unemployment and continuing

The problem can be stated simply Administration policy- makers for some time now have so mismanaged the money supply that long-term capital needed for industrial expansion is exceedingly difficult to come by. This has meant industry could not expand rapidly enough to absorb the men and women moving into the labor market as quickly as the working population has grown — driving unemployment up. It has resulted in such a slow increase in production and such marked increases in production costs that prices were bound to rise

Most dangerously, an increasing number of companies are financing their long-term expansion with short-term loans. The same can be said for banks. Too many are financing longterm loans with short-term money, which can be

When a company has hefty short-term debts. little ready cash and few assets which can be quickly turned into cash, it is on dangerous ground - regardless of the times. Such a firm is especially vulnerable today when money is in

If a bank, likewise, has a heavy amount of short-term debt, and is overextended in longterm loans, then the directors had better buy rabbits' feet and cross their fingers.

Reports coming to this writer indicate that more and more companies and banks in the United States and Western Europe are reaching

It is clear today that this country does not exist in financial and economic isolation. Disasters in the Western world can have most serious effects here. It is especially worrisome, therefore, to record that friends in the business world who have recently visited Western Europe predict a heavy series of failures on that continent in the next 12 to 18 months, even among companies making quite large paper profits. Paradoxically, a boom in business, with the concomitant equirement for added working capital, can drive a company to the wall. For it normally must go to its bankers to secure the added funds it needs to handle the purchase of raw materials, parts and the payment of subcontractors to fill the new orders. If the funds are not available, the

West Europe can have a domino effect - on banks, which must then pull in money from other I debtors to meet obligations, and on other business concerns which are thereby caught in

an evertightening financial thicket. Failures in West Europe would mean fewer markets for American firms and add pressure on those U.S. companies and banks whose condition was already shaky.

Busing Isn't Integration

In the perspective of twenty years, the drive first to desegregate and then compulsorily integrate America's public schools can be seen to have gone through three quite distinct phases. Phase One began, of course, with the historic

decision of the Warren Court in Brown vs. Board of Education in 1954. The basic holding in that case was simply that it was unconstitutional for a state to segregate students by reason of their May, N.J. color. In practice this decision affected only the southern states, since only they had provided by statute for the segregation of black and white

The lower federal courts soon ordered southern cities to desegregate, and we were treated to the spectacle of cute little black girls in white dresses being led into schoolhouses all over the South, through rows of infantry with bayonets affixed to their rifles. Phase Two began early in the 1960's, with the

effort of the liberals to duplicate in the North the success they had achieved in the South. A great many northerners who had rather enjoyed watching the improvement of the South now suddenly felt that charity was getting uncomfortably close to home, but it was clearly the

In Phase Three however, which had already begun in the late 1960's, the liberal impulse finally met its match and master. By almost every test the American people, white and (interestingly) black alike, preferred the "neighborhood school," even if it involved a certain amount of de facto segregation, to busing, where this was required by judicial orders to integrate.

But if you think that American's liberals are disposed to be balked by any such petty obstacle as majority sentiment, you simply do not understand the horsepower of the reformist engines that drive these people. 

Charlie Finley A 'Choir Boy'

Compared With Padres' Owner

THE TIPOFF: The gaffe was not in Ray Krok making that "stupid baseball accusation" of his San Diego Padres; it was in baseball, eager for fresh money, taking on an owner who's going to make Charles O. Finley look like a choir boy when it comes to eccentricity.

Q: What was it like for Lee Elder in his early years on the golf tour? Did he feel the prejudice? - P.J., Reidsville, N.C. Let's hear it straight from Lee, who turned pro 15 years ago but didn't really start cashing in as a touring pro until 1967: "It was difficult for us socially in the early years. But now the Bob Murphys and the Jim Wiechers and others are people we're really close with and go to dinner with often. The majority of my friends on the tour are white. I'm one of the few exempt blacks. Other blacks are out qualifying. Charlie Sifford tends to be a little bitter because he doesn't feel he was received his due as the "Jackie Robinson of golf" who broke the color line.

Q: What was Denny McLain's E.R.A. the year he won over 30 games? - A. Battiste, McKees Rocks, Pa.

In that fabulous year of 1968 when he won 31 games and lost 6, Denny had an earned run average of 1.96 for the Detroit Tigers, lowest of his major league career. It wasn't good enough, however, to lead the American League. Luis Tiant spun a remarkable 1.60 for the Cleveland Indians, the best since the great Walter Johnson's 1.49 in 1919.

Q. Could you please tell me the average salary of a basketball player in the NBA and how much the great Kareem Abdul-Jabbar makes a year? - Randy Henry, Sacramento, Calif. The latest quoted figure for the NBA is an average of

\$90,000 annually per player which sounds, and is, astronomical and is made that way because the great Kareem hauls down an estimated \$450,000 a year. On the New York Knicks, you might be interested to know, there are eight players over the \$100,000 mark.

Q. It was always my opinion that the greatest home run hitters were the ones with most home runs per time at bat in the major leagues. Will you tell me the averages for home runs per time at bat for Babe Ruth, Mickey Mantle, Willie Mays and Hank Aaron? - Jack C. Perrin, Pauls Valley,

The career figures show that Ruth it one homer for every 11.8 times at bat; Mangle slugged at a rate of one for 15.1: Aaron so far has one homer each 15.8 times up; and Mays hits them out at a clip of one per 16.5. Aside to H.A. Erwick of Corning, Calif.: If the Babe had been up to bat as many times as Hank Aaron when the latter hit his 714th, the bambino would have hit 960 homers - assuming he maintained his normal pace. But its important to remember that Ruth also played in another era of all day games and generally smaller

Q: Re: Your recent note that Babe Ruth hit his last home run off Tom Zachary, I don't remember Zachary ever playing in the National League. Also, Babe finished with the Boston Braves. What gives? - Jack Cauldwell, Rahway,


A couple of other perspicacious readers caught me on that too. My boo-boo was in not noting that Zachary gave up the last home run Ruth hit in his memorable 1927 binge of 60 homers. The last homer of his career, on May 25, 1935, was with the Pittsburgh Pirates. Oh yes, Tom Zachary did eventually pitch in the National League — as Casey Stengel says, "You could look it up."
