### LA Airport Bomb Probe

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Authorities are inspecting debris in an effort to determine who placed a bomb that killed two persons and injured 36 at Los Angeles International Airport. Federal aviation officials said the explosion on Tuesday was believed the largest ever to hit an airline terminal in the United States and the first to kill anyone. Officials said they could conceive of no motive for the explosion and had no leads.

### Klein Discounts Barb

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP) — Herbert G. Klein, President Nixon's former director of communications, says, "No one likes to have himself referred to in derogatory terms. And when you read something like that you don't forget it." Klein was reacting to the latest Watergate transcripts released on Monday by the White House. In one passage, the President criticizes Klein's handling of a meeting with television network executives, saying Klein "just doesn't really have his head screwed on" and saying he was disappointed "But I don't regard it as a serious blow to a friendship that has gone on over a number of years," Klein said in an interview on Tuesday. When he called me unorganized, it was because I never believed in writing a lot of memos."

### Coal Talks Start

CENTRALIA, Ill. (AP) — Coal companies and miners will begin new contract negotiations some time this month, with each side hoping to avert a nationwide strike like the one that struck the industry three years ago. But some officials of the 120,000-member United Mine Workers have already accused the companies of foot dragging. They say the issues are so numerous and complex the talks should already be under way if a pact is to be agreed upon by the time the current contract expires Nov. 12. No date for the first session has been set.

### House Cuts Vietnam Aid

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House has voted a \$300 million cut in U.S. military aid for South Vietnam, in what proponents called the third measure to negotiate a political settlement with Hanoi and the Viet Cong. The cut to a post-Vietnam war level of \$700 million in U.S. military aid was made in a \$63.4 billion defense appropriation bill approved by the House.

IMPEACHMENT BLUES: A solemn Congress is making painful preparations to put President Nixon on trial. Here are some backstage details:

—Republican leaders expect the House to impeach the President by a solid 280 to 155 votes, at least. The Senate outcome is more difficult to predict. Several senators have told the leadership they simply don't know how they'll vote and won't make up their minds until they've heard the evidence. But the Republican leaders estimate the Senate line-up today about 60-40 in favor of removing the President. This would be seven votes short of the two-thirds needed to convict him.

WASTON CROMLEY Government Must Alter Fiscal Policy

WASHINGTON — (NEA) — Even with expected high infusions of Arab oil money into the U.S. economy, we can expect some most difficult times in the years just ahead unless the federal government changes its foolish financial-economic policies.

When a company has hefty short-term debts, little ready cash and few assets which can be quickly turned into cash, it is in dangerous ground — regardless of the times. Such a firm is especially vulnerable today when money is in short supply.

If a bank, likewise, has a heavy amount of short-term debt, and is overextended in long-term loans, then the directors had better buy rabbits' feet and cross their fingers.

Reports coming to this writer indicate that more and more companies and banks in the United States and Western Europe are reaching this danger point.

It is clear today that this country does not exist in financial and economic isolation. Disasters in the Western world can have most serious effects here. It is especially worrisome, therefore, to record that friends in the business world who have recently visited Western Europe predict a heavy series of failures on that continent in the next 12 to 18 months, even among companies making quite large paper profits.

WILLIAM RUSHER Busing Isn't Panacea To Integration

In the perspective of twenty years, the drive first to desegregate and then compulsorily to integrate America's public schools can be seen to have gone through three quite distinct phases.

Phase One began, of course, with the historic decision of the Warren Court in Brown vs. Board of Education in 1954. The basic holding in that case was simply that it was unconstitutional for a state to segregate students by reason of their color. In practice this decision affected only the southern states, since only they had provided by statute for the segregation of black and white students.

In Phase Three however, which had already begun in the late 1960's, the liberal impulse finally met its match and master. By almost every (interesting) black allele, preferred the "neighborhood school," even if it involved a certain amount of de facto segregation, to busing, where this was required by judicial orders to integrate.

But if you think that American's liberals are disposed to be balked by any such petty obstacle as majority sentiment, you simply do not understand the horsepower of the reformist engines that drive those people. There are still many overwhelmingly black schools in America — notably in certain large cities where there are still federal judges willing to order forcible integration, if only a sufficient supply of white students can be found. But they cannot be found in the school district, or adjacent districts; they are no longer even in the city. Simple enough, if you're a liberal: just bus them in from the suburbs.

And it was to this latest suggestion that the Supreme Court, in Bradley vs. Milliken, two weeks ago, said No, by the narrow but significant 5 to 4. In so doing, the Burger Court signaled its acceptance of the implications of Phase Three. America's public schools must be integrated where this does not seriously transgress the "neighborhood school" principle. But integration is not to be regarded as a god before which every other human value must bow down. For that, Americans of both races have cause to be grateful.

But now the Bob Marleys and the Jimi Wahlers and others are people we're really close with and go to dinner with often. The majority of my friends on the tour are white. I'm one of the few exempt blacks. Other blacks are out qualifying. Charlie Sifford tends to be a little bitter because he doesn't feel he was received his due as the "Jackie Robinson of golf" who broke the color line.

Q: What was Denny McLain's E.R.A. the year he won over 30 games? — A. Battiste, McKees Rocks, Pa. In that fabulous year of 1968 when he won 31 games and lost 6, Denny had an earned run average of 1.96 for the Detroit Tigers, lowest of his major league career. It wasn't good enough, however, to lead the American League. Luis Tiant spun a remarkable 1.60 for the Cleveland Indians, the best since the great Walter Johnson's 1.49 in 1919.

Q: Could you please tell me the average salary of a basketball player in the NBA and how much the great Kareem Abdul-Jabbar makes a year? — Randy Henry, Sacramento, Calif. 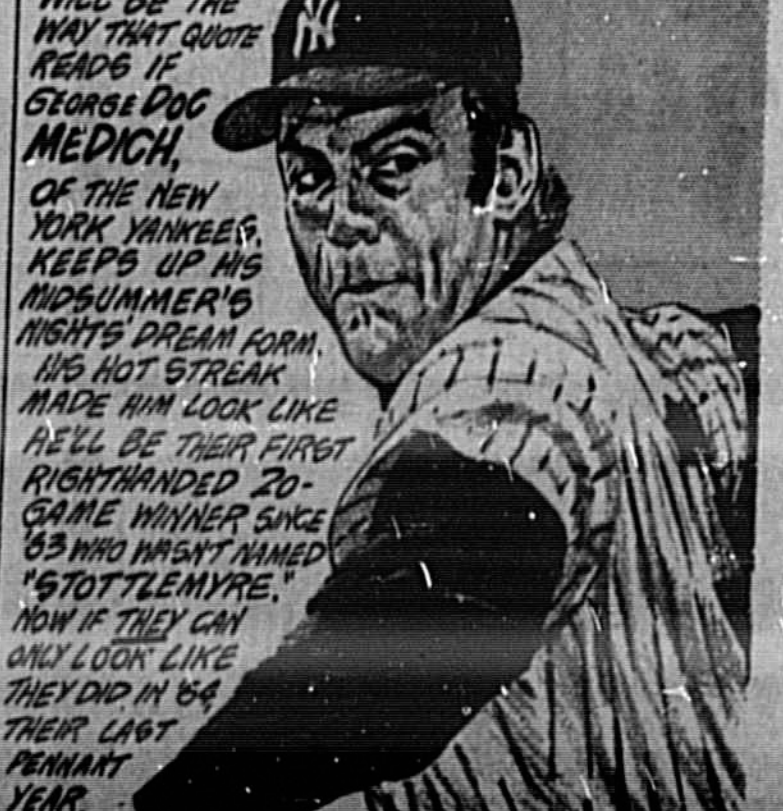

ATLANTA (AP) — Russell Mendez, whose hobby as a rocket-powered dragster driver has turned into a full-time job, dislikes comparison between himself and daredevil motorcyclist Evel Knievel, as he prepares for a spectacular 700 mile an hour run at the world land speed record.

Mendez says what he does is tested and is relatively safe, at least he feels it is more dangerous than Knievel's escapades. "Evel Knievel sells adventures and death," says Mendez. "He thrives on accidents. I live more dangerously than he does. I've got killed a lot more easily going 300 miles an hour than he can at 50 jumping a few cars. Everybody tells me I'm crazy."

His group regularly tours the country and traveled over 120,000 miles last year, "and we didn't have one single accident in all that time on the road," said Mendez.

In over 35 runs in his dragster, he has been involved in one accident, damaging only the machine slightly. "The 34-year-old Tampa, Fla., contractor, along with an Atlanta-based group called the Rocket Crusade, has a target date of September 1975 for the record try at the Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah.

"There's only one problem — \$1 million. "We need to raise a million dollars," says Mendez, who has sent out 300 brochures to top firms around the country, hoping to lure sponsors.

"We don't anticipate any problems getting the money. We have been in contact with auto and racing-type firms and the response has been good."

Mendez says it will take eight months to build the rocket-powered machine. "We want to build a low profile type which looks more like a car," he says.

Mendez, who has been touring the country with the group in a rocket-powered dragster, "The Free Spirit," says it has done 325 m.p.h. or 4.90 seconds in the quarter mile.

"You blink and it's all over," he says. "But it is completely under control."

The land speed record currently is 622 m.p.h. held by Gary Gabelich, who established the mark at Bonneville in the "Blue Flame."

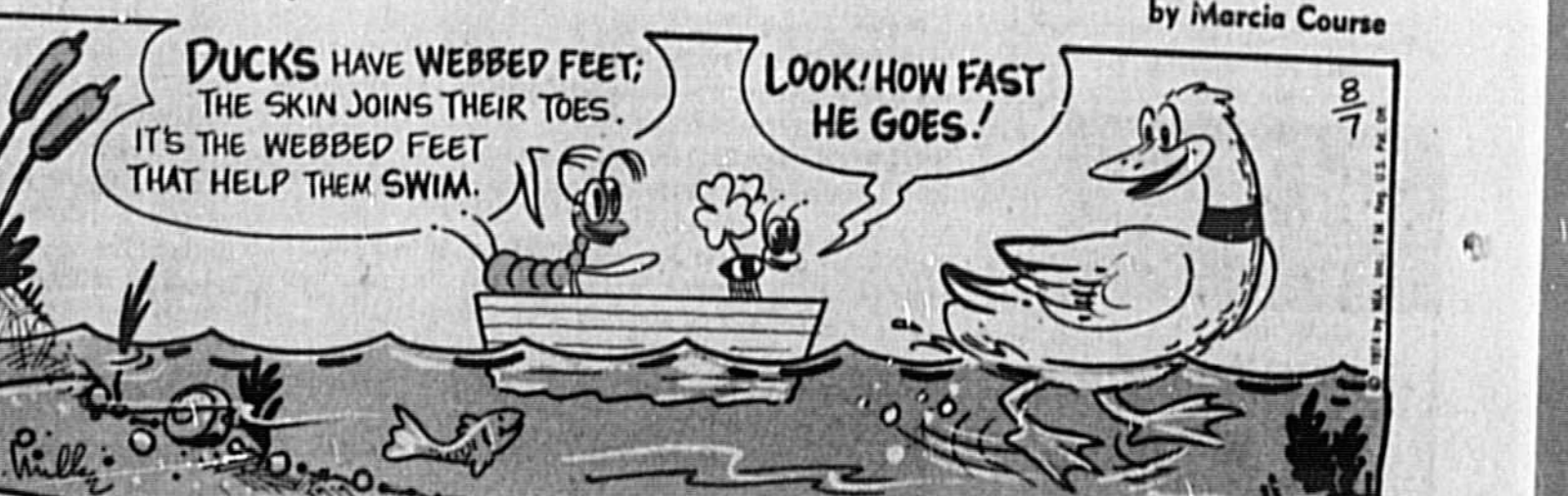

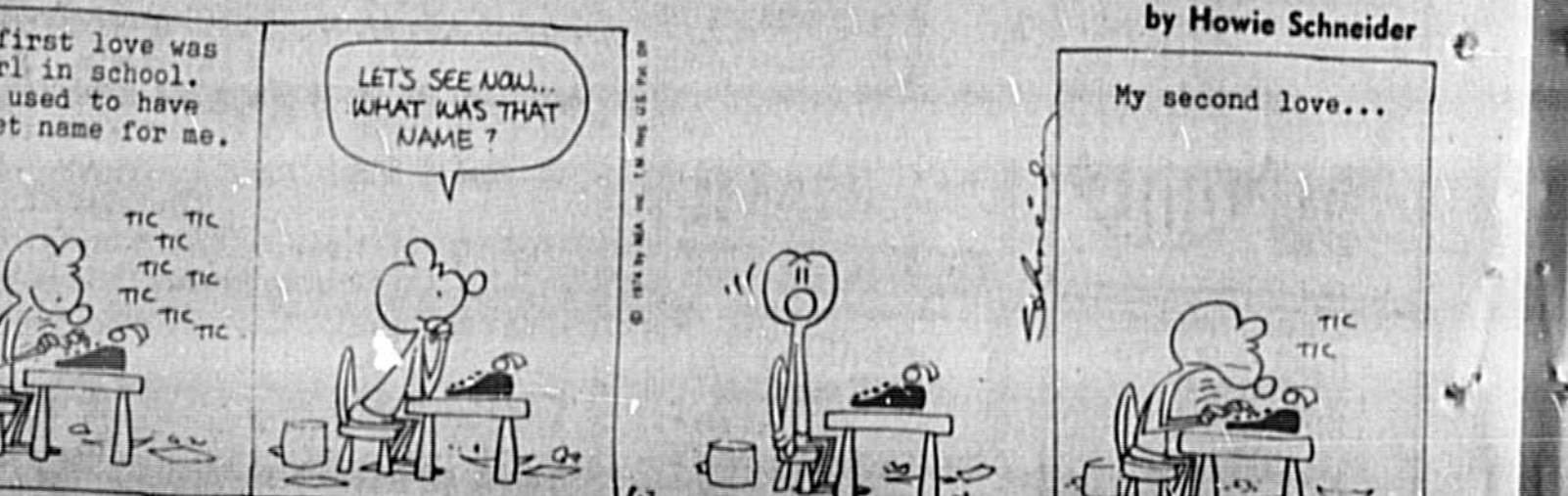

## Casselberry Okays Condos

CASSELBERRY — Swatting mosquitoes and fanning away the heat, council met Tuesday night in the fire house to conclude the Land O'Lakes site plan review begun Monday, and gave SMD Partnership the go-ahead to build the first 116 condominiums of their development.

In an atmosphere reminiscent of a decade ago when council meetings were held in the old single-stall fire house and volunteer firemen on

the council would have to abandon meetings at the sound of the fire alarm, council thrashed out the problems of construction on the low-lying SMD property for two hours before approving the site plan.

The major problem was deciding who should pay for the drainage of the Land O' Lakes master drainage system; the paving of access roads prior to the issuance of certificates of occupation; and the construction of lakeside condominiums another 10 to 15 feet further back from the lake than indicated on the site plan.

## Shooting Charges Dropped

2-3rds cup beef stock, see below

7-ounce can tuna in olive oil, undrained

1 cup mayonnaise

1 tablespoon lemon juice

2-ounce can flat anchovy fillets, drained

1/4 cup/drain capers

Romaine

1 cucumber, pared and sliced

1 pint box cherry tomatoes, stemmed

Cut away fat from top of beef; slice thin. In an electric blender whirl together until smooth the beef stock, tuna, mayonnaise, lemon juice and half of the anchovies; stir in 2 tablespoons of the capers. Spoon a little of this sauce into a deep platter or shallow serving dish. Add layers of the beef, spooning sauce over each slice as you do so. Add any remaining sauce. Chill until serving time, then garnish with the remaining anchovies and capers and the romaine, cucumber and tomatoes. Makes 6 servings.

**Cooked Beef and Stock:** In a saucepot place 1 1/2 pounds thin cut (1st cut) beef brisket in 1 piece; add 1 1/2 cups water, 1/4 teaspoon salt, a pared carrot, a medium onion stuck with 2 cloves, tops of 2 celery ribs, several sprigs parsley and 2 bay leaves. Bring just to a boil; cover and simmer until beef is tender — about 2 hours. Remove beef and refrigerate overnight. Strain stock and pour into a small container; refrigerate overnight. When ready to use stock let stand at room temperature until liquefied; or heat very gently and cool; there should be 2-3rds cup — if not, add water to make that amount.

# International Caribbean Cuisine

ENGLWOOD, N.J.  
(NEA) — Perhaps, when the breeze off the Jersey Meadows near here whips the granite-trapped heat of New York City sidewalks around the right way, Muriel Jansen feels truly at home.

Here was a childhood laced softly by the prevailing trade winds that make the subarctic Netherlands Antilles bearable for native or tourist. She was born in Surinam, Dutch Guayana, and at age six shifted the 50 or 100 miles cross water to the small Dutch island of Curacao. Her father was to work there for the Shell refinery.

Curacao is a fascinating spot. Unlike many of the extremely lush semi-tropical islands to the north, it is predominantly sand and cactus.

**BRAISED BEEF WITH GREEN BEANS**  
(stief bouchi or takki takki)

- 1/4 cup corn oil
- 1-3/4 cups diagonally sliced flank steak strip
- 1 pound green beans, sliced
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 2-3 cup water
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper

Heat corn oil in large skillet over medium heat. Add beef and brown on all sides, turning as needed. Add beans, onion and tomato paste. Stir until beans look bright green. Add water, vinegar and salt. Cover, reduce heat and cook over low heat until beans are tender crisp. Stir in pepper and serve with rice or potatoes, if desired. Makes about 4 servings.

**KLEINE KINDEREN COCONUT TOUTJE**  
(small children's coconut dessert)

- 2 1/2 cups hot water
- 1 can (1 1/2 ounces) shredded or flaked coconut
- 1/4 cup corn starch
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla

Pour hot water over coconut in a 1-quart saucepan. Simmer over low heat about 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool to lukewarm. Strain mixture through cheesecloth, squeezing thoroughly. Makes about 2 cups liquid. In 1-quart saucepan bring to boil over medium heat 1 and a half cups of the coconut milk. Stir corn starch, sugar and salt in remaining half cup of the coconut milk. Gradually add to hot coconut milk stirring until mixture comes to boil and boils 1 minute. Remove from heat, stir in vanilla and almond flavoring. Pour pudding into individual serving dishes or in large serving dish. Makes 4 (half cup) servings.

**FRESH COCONUT PUD DING**  
Crack nut shell of fresh coconut and remove dark outer shell, chop nutmeat coarsely and place in small blender container. Follow manufacturer's instructions for chopping nuts or coarsely grate on grater. Measure 1 cup of grated coconut. Freeze remaining coconut for use later. Follow instructions as for Coconut Dessert increasing sugar to one-third cup. Makes 4 servings.

**GAGO GADO VEGETABLES**

- 1 pound fresh or frozen (5 ounces) frozen whole leaf spinach
- 2/3 cup coarsely shredded cabbage
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen whole string beans
- 1 can (16 ounces) bean sprouts
- 1 recipe Peanut Sauce

Bring water to boil. Add vegetables, 1 at a time, and blanch 2 to 5 minutes. Drain (keep vegetables separate, if desired). Serve hot or at room temperature with Peanut Sauce. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

**PEANUT SAUCE**

- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1 cup water
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground garlic
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne and cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric

- 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 1/4 teaspoon ground paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne and cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 1/4 teaspoon ground paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne and cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1 cup water
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground garlic
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne and cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

Heat corn oil in heavy 1-quart saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and saute until golden and transparent. Add peanut butter, stirring constantly. Gradually add water and soy sauce stirring until smooth. Add ginger, garlic powder, cayenne and cloves. Bring to boil stirring constantly until sauce thickens. Serve hot or at room temperature over vegetables or meat. Makes 1 and a half cups.

**BEEF SAUCE**

- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons dark corn syrup
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons dark corn syrup
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice

Mix together soy sauce, corn syrup, lemon juice, garlic, curry powder, ginger and clove. Add beef cubes; cover and store in refrigerator several hours or overnight. ## Legal Loopholes Beckon President

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon faces possible criminal prosecution should he resign or be removed from office, but several escape routes may be open to him.

Congress or special Watergate prosecutor Leon Jaworski could take steps to save Nixon from a criminal trial. So could Vice President Gerald R. Ford if he succeeds to the presidency.

Some legal experts believe Nixon could even pardon himself of all crimes before leaving

office, but that is viewed as only a remote possibility.

Most constitutional scholars concede that a president cannot be indicted while in office, although it is not an undisputed legal principle.

The Watergate grand jury ducked the issue when it chose

national headquarters June 17, 1972.

Monday, he admitted ordering the investigation halted for political reasons and concealing the information from his lawyers and the House Judiciary Committee.

Some members of Congress say Nixon, in effect, confessed to obstructing justice, a crime carrying a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine. Multiple counts and related charges would increase the potential penalties.

If Nixon resigns, he would be vulnerable to an indictment.

If he were convicted in an impeachment trial, he would be removed from office and sim-

ilarly vulnerable because the Constitution states that "the party convicted shall nevertheless be liable and subject to indictment, trial, judgment and punishment according to law."

To avoid that fate, Nixon could attempt to strike a deal with Jaworski. The President could offer to resign in exchange for the prosecutor's promise not to bring criminal charges. But the deal would not necessarily bind a grand jury.

The prosecutor's office refuses to comment on the possibility of plea bargaining. Atty. Gen. William B. Saxbe said on Wednesday he is not aware of any ongoing negotiations. Nixon's chief attorney, James D.

## Nixon Meets Ford; Presidency Nears End

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon summoned Vice President Gerald R. Ford to the White House today to inform him he has decided to resign from the nation's highest office, a presidential aide said today.

The aide refused to be identified, but he is in a position near the Oval Office.

His terse response — "Yes" — to a newsman came amid other strong indications that the Republican chief executive's pluming toward an end.

Official White House spokesmen continued to refuse to divulge Nixon's plans. But other

sources said it appeared likely Nixon would disclose his decision later today.

Nixon and Ford, the man he picked for the vice presidency after Spiro T. Agnew resigned last October, met alone in the Oval Office. The session began at 11:30 a.m. EDT on a grey, muggy summer day as the nation and the world awaited formal announcement of the embattled president's plans.

Hundreds of newsmen and photographers milled in the smoke-filled White House press room while the two leaders conferred in the guarded office 36 paces away.

Some sources said flatly Nixon had made the decision to step aside voluntarily rather

than allowing the constitutional machinery to grind toward impeachment.

Shortly after Ford's office announced he was postponing a scheduled 12-day political trip through the Far West and Chicago, the Ford spokesman said.

Asked what kind of opinion the vice president's office might have on the current situation, the spokesman replied, "I hear we're going on the trip, but we're just going a little later."

Before the announcement of the delay, Ford press secretary Paul Mitchell said plans for the trip were unchanged. But other sources indicated at least part of the itinerary could be scrubbed at a moment's notice.

Also on Ford's schedule today was the presentation of post-humous medals to relatives of seven military servicemen at ceremonies at Blair House, across the street from the White House.

House republican leader John J. Rhodes, who was among three congressional leaders to meet with President Nixon Wednesday, earlier canceled plans to accompany Ford to the telethon.

## Tax Break Ahead?

If Seminole County Commissioners had trouble balancing their budget in past years they ain't seen nothing yet.

Four of Seminole's seven municipalities today began a move to force the county government to stop or reduce the cities tax funds levied on municipal residents for services either denied or limited to them.

Officials of Sanford, Casselberry, Winter Springs and Altamonte Springs said Sheriff John Polk's department is the major offender of the state constitution's ban on double taxation.

They noted that while city taxpayers residents are taxed equally with citizens in the unincorporated areas, Polk's department does not provide major law enforcement within the cities. Rather, they said, city residents must pay a second time for major law

enforcement for city police departments.

Sanford City Commissioner John Morris brought a new state law — Chapter 125.01 — to the attention of the CALNO Council of Local Governments Wednesday night. Morris said the law provides relief from

department services are either excluded or limited to cities.

After receiving resolutions from a city or group of cities specifying inequities, the county should take action to rebalance the tax money, limit the taxes to services received, Maitland, the first area city to take action under the law, said in a resolution.

McIntosh said the remedy under the law, in the event the county refuses to act, would be a law suit, filed by one or several cities.

Casselberry City Manager Harry Hug said he is gathering the documentation to beef up the cities' argument against the sheriff's department. He added that the only service Polk's department provides to the cities is housing prisoners for short periods.

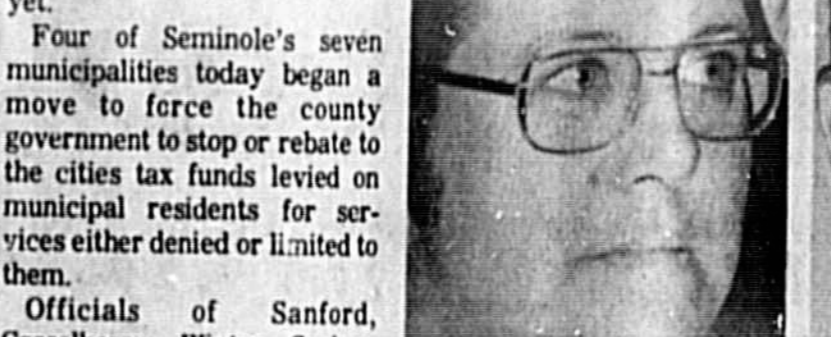

Winter Springs Mayor Troy Piland, calling the new law "the greatest thing since apple pie," pointed to the county fire administration office, animal control and the utilities' office.

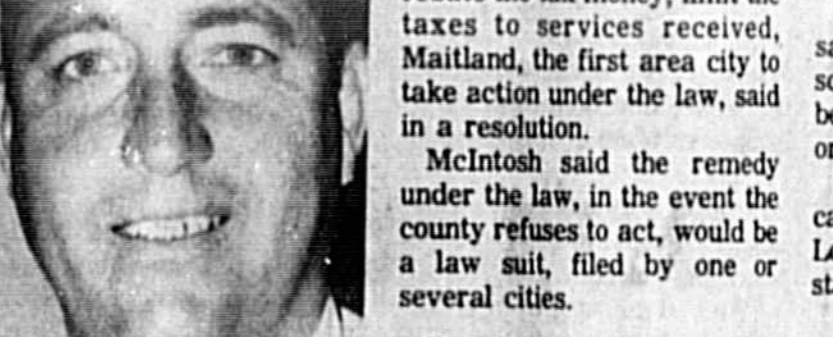

## Sanford Bond Election Decision Expected Today

Sanford city commissioners were expected today to finalize plans for a citywide Nov. 5 referendum on a proposed \$4.25 million drainage bond issue.

Earlier commissioners indicated the bonds would be on the December city election ballot, but Wednesday in a

today's 4 p.m. work session on results of a meeting with County Supervisor of Elections Mrs. Camilla Brooks on including the drainage bond referendum on the voting machine ballots in each precinct in Sanford.

Mayor Lee Moore said this would be more convenient for city voters. Normally only one polling place—the lakefront civic center—is used in city elections.

Moore said Wednesday, after meeting with city fiscal agent Loomis Leedy, that the proposed bond issue to fund drainage throughout the city could be paid off over 30 year period with a maximum of 3.5 mills property tax after the second year.

The city would pay only the interest on the bonds the first two years until the city's present bonded indebtedness is retired in 1977.

If Sanford voters approve the bonds, it will take engineers eight months to complete construction plans for drainage structures, some large enough to drive a small auto through, that will channel surface water underground from throughout the city to Lake Monroe.

City Manager Warren Knowles said engineering should be done and the bonds ready for sale by next July.

Following awarding of contracts the drainage work would start within three months—about Jan. 1978.

- Incumbents James Adkins, Joseph Boyd and Ben Overton, and 1st District Court of Appeal Judge Sam Spector for the Florida Supreme Court.

## 'I Had Tears In My Eyes ...'

WASHINGTON (AP) "It was pathetic. I had tears in my eyes." The President of the United States, in shirt sleeves, was greeting his family — his wife, two daughters and their husbands — in an upstairs room at the White House Wednesday night.

The witness: Oliver "Ollie" Atkins, personal photographer to Richard Nixon in good times and bad since 1968.

Nixon, seemingly poised on the brink of becoming the first American president to resign the office, was gathering his family for a private dinner after hearing gloomy tidings from Senate and House Republican leaders and party elder Barry Goldwater.

Atkins was there, as on many occasions in the past — in Peking and Moscow and at inaugural balls — to record a moment in history.

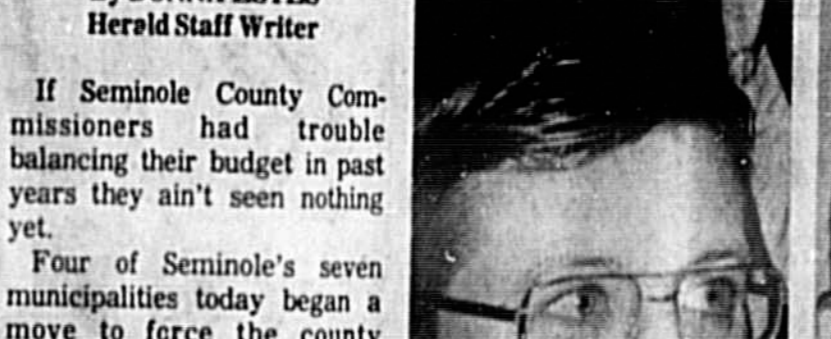
Just a few minutes earlier he had photographed the beleaguered President walking in the White House Rose Garden with daughter Tricia Cox.

The White House press office reported Nixon and Mrs. Cox just happened to meet as the President was walking home to dinner and that Atkins just happened to walk by with a loaded camera as father and daughter decided to take an evening stroll.

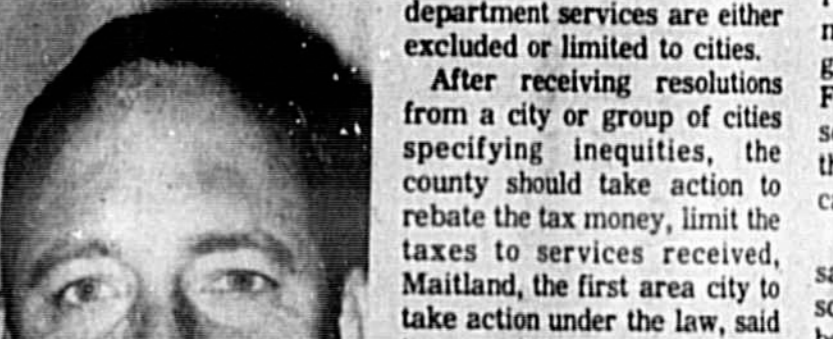
In the past this explanation would, more than likely, have been the prelude to another public relation move — a distribution to the news media of official White House photos.
