Bus crash stalls traffic on I-4

SANFORD — A three-bus collision shut down Interstate 4 for more than three hours Friday during morning rush hour. Three tour buses carrying 94 band members from Edgewood High School in Maryland crashed into each other on I-4 at the St. Johns River bridge. Several of the 118 total passengers suffered injuries but none more serious than a head laceration.

The accident occurred at 6:52 a.m. near the 17-92 exit on the westbound side of the interstate. The three Hunt Valley Motor Coach buses were transporting students and chaperones to a band competition at Walt Disney World. A witness said that upon approaching normal I-4 traffic at that time of day, the first bus came to a normal stop. But the second and third buses couldn't do the same, as both ran into the bus in front of it.

The witness said that (the driver of the first bus) didn't slam on his breaks or go out of control," Florida Highway Patrol Public Information Officer Kim Miller said. "He didn't strike anything. The second and third drivers should have had time to stop." Miller said that careless driving charges are pending for the drivers of the second and third bus but not for the driver of the first bus. Main Street 'in breach' of contract

SANFORD — City officials declared the Sanford Main Street organization "in breach" of its performance contract just two weeks after the document was signed. The Downtown Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) voted 4-0 to provide Main Street with a letter indicating the organization is in breach of its contract with the CRA. Officials from Main Street will have 30 days to show why the contract should not be revoked.

At issue is Main Street's support of an infrastructure improvement project along 1st Street. Some merchants along the street have voiced concern about the effects the project will have on their business, and there has been some talk of suing the city to stop the project.

The renovations — which would, among other improvements, replace stormwater drainage, upgrade electrical capacity, widen sidewalks and install brick treatments on the street, as well as additional landscaping — would take about 18 months to complete.

Pete Sechler of Glatting Jackson, the city's design consultant for the project, said during construction vehicle traffic would shift to one side of the street, though 1st Street would never be closed. Sechler said pedestrian traffic would also remain open and businesses would have uninterrupted use of their front doors, even if crews had to build wooden bridges to allow customers access when concrete is poured for new sidewalks.

Main Street President Bill Kirchhoff said he and other members of his board have met with merchants to discuss their concerns.

"Some of us have very strong feelings" about the project Kirchhoff said, "but Main Street is not taking a position. We believe we should facilitate meetings between the merchants and the CRA."

Kirchhoff also indicated the merchants want a special meeting with Sechler's design team.

"(The design team has) had general meetings but they didn't come down and talk to the merchants," said Kirchhoff, noting the team met with a number of groups including the Audubon Society.

Members of the CRA expressed discontent that Main

Wicklow students create mural of Florida's wildlife

Florida's wildlife is coming to life at Sanford's Wicklow Elementary School.

Alligators, panthers, mockingbirds, and various other animals — along with plants and trees indigenous to the state — are slowly taking form on what was once a barren concrete wall at the school. Students, mostly fourth- and fifth-graders, are painting a mural as part of a project assigned by art teacher Gay Bess.

"It was our principal, Beverly Perrault, who encouraged us to paint the mural," Bess said. "It was just a blank concrete wall. It was boring. So, we decided it was the perfect spot for the mural."

Students began working on the project at the beginning of the year by researching Florida's state symbols, including the Zebra Longwing, the Orange Blossom and the

Honoring our troops: Sgt. Davidson now in battle

U.S. Army Sgt. Lee Davidson, 25, a native of Sanford is presently in the battle areas of Iraq. Davidson joined the Army almost five years ago, and left for Kuwait in January of this year.

Davidson is in the 1st Battalion, 3rd Infantry Aviation Brigade. His mother said his main job is the loading of missiles on Apache helicopters.

SCC awards first Teaching Chairs of Excellence to three faculty members

SANFORD — Seminole Community College recently awarded its first Endowed Teaching Chairs of Excellence to three faculty members in the middle of March.

SCC District Board of Trustees and the College Foundation Board started fundraising for the chairs in 1996. This will mark the first year the chairs were handed out. The recipients of the Endowment

Chairs are Bill Jordan, SunTrust Endowed Teaching Chair; Kenna Noone, Sprint Endowed Teaching Chair and Robert Rapalje, The Chesley G. Magruder Foundation Endowed Teaching Chair.

"The idea came from the president and the foundation board embraced it," said Pam Weber, director of the foundation. "It's just as a reward to the faculty."

The reward to the faculty is the endowment chair and a \$5,000 check. SCC plans to have 16 chairs

which will be awarded in the next three to five years. The chairs fall into two categories, an honor chair and a project chair. The honor chair receives the money and can spend it in any fashion, while the project chairs will use the funds to work on an approved project.

One project, steered by Kenna Noone, is a full bibliography of tourism in Mexico and Central Florida. The other project by Robert Rapalje will look at a course students' took to improve their

math skills and how they are doing afterward.

"It's a very thorough process to apply," Weber said. "A college committee screens the applications, making sure they are full-time faculty, and reviews them. They send at least two finalists for each chair to a foundation committee. All the candidates are videotaped in the classroom or explain their project in front of a panel, which is also videotaped."

For all the time applying to,

receiving the endowment chair was the easiest part. The President along with other members of the Foundation Board went into each professor's classroom carrying a big check and balloons, like Publisher's Clearinghouse, to tell them they won.

Each chair is valued at \$100,000. Fundraising efforts by SCC yielded \$60,000, with the state matching the remaining \$40,000. The four-

I have met Ms. Billberry only on a couple of occasions, so I can't say with any certainty whether she is doing a bad job. Board members at SHA have a better understanding of that than I do. However, I have to question what role the federal alphabet gang (TARC and HUD) are playing in all of this.

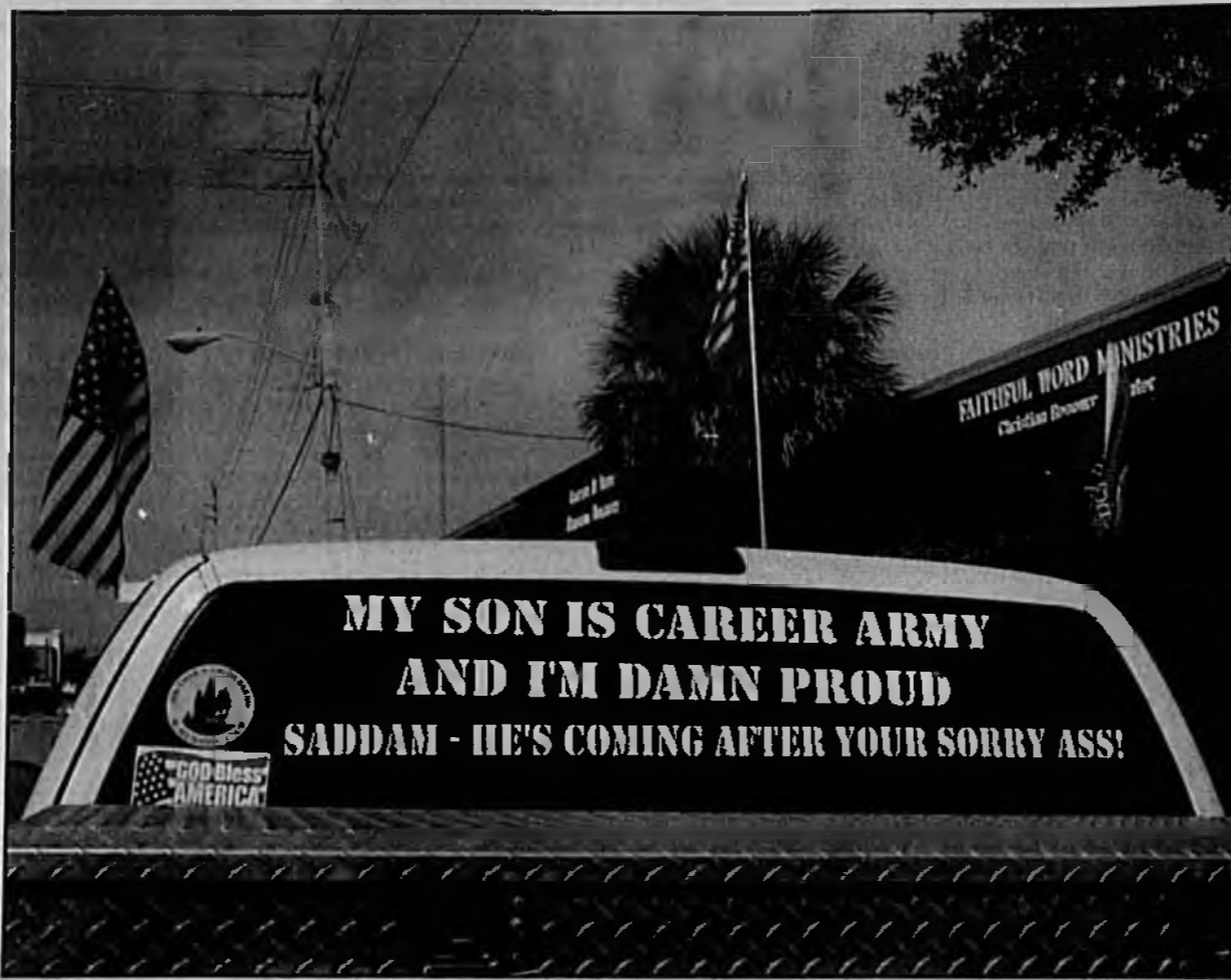

### Some seem to be forgetting what's at stake

To the editor: Several years ago, the old Touchton Drug Store was purchased, gutted inside and out, resulting in an impressive, major improvement to First Street and its buildings. Nearby, other improvements including the Cool Beans Cafe, the Willow Tree and Morgans' Cafe have made subtle changes to the landscape of the town. Equally impressive is the current labor being done to the former South Side Elementary School where alterations have taken an older facility and transformed it into a stylish, impressive one with all of the "glory" that a town would desire, particularly for a home for the aged. Behind each effort is the commitment and financial support that it takes to

overhaul, gut and transform a town. Then these activities occur, all of us know that our downtown will flourish. Such was the case when a dilapidated Winter Park Mall became a "new" Winter Park Village. Regrettably, the inside Sanford "politics" now have the people shouting absurdities to each other. Some believe that parking cars parallel instead of head-on as they presently do will mesmerize the town into an upgraded street. Wider sidewalks can result in having more trees is the purported belief. Somehow, the problem seems to have lost its real thrust. Without major facade upgrades, the Winter Park luster will continue to be a goal never achieved. Equally disturbing is the apparent disregard of merchant input and wisdom — two serious issues that should not be ignored. For years, merchants have owned, operated, and made life-long commitments to their

businesses. They know what works. Having fewer parking spaces is not the answer for them or for people who arrive to a city. (By the way, I keep asking why did we release the already limited-parking spaces to the police? Yes, protection is wonderful, but can't the police park where they choose without getting a ticket, anyway?) For those of you who keep hoping to make Sanford become another Winter Park Village, have you ever been one of the many souls trying to find a parking place on the narrow streets in an attempt to get to a movie or frequent a restaurant there on a Friday afternoon? If so, you will know your walk would equal two Sanford blocks before you arrive at your destination. Somehow, our barometer should be more elevated. I don't believe we want to ask for those types of problems. The beauty of our town is that it can be planned, well-thought through beforehand where owners of

stores do not suffer. Lastly, I am appalled that CRA — a wonderful base for collection of taxes from downtown business and property owners themselves for funding necessary downtown improvements — can "dictate" its beliefs upon a group of volunteers. Yes, Main Street — aside from its needed administrative support — is basically a group of people who want to do their part in making Sanford a thriving, vibrant, picturesque town. They need support and money to accomplish their goals. To castigate anyone from that group including Bill Kirchoff because he has beliefs that parallel those of the merchants is counter to what open, democratic organizations should be doing. ## U.S. companies could make out like bandits in postwar Iraq

Perhaps President Bush has perfectly good reasons for allowing American companies with White House connections to get secret contracts for rebuilding Iraq. Perhaps the president has considered the ramifications of giving billions in business to companies such as Halliburton, where Vice President Dick Cheney was CEO. Still, the president should reconsider the process for awarding bids for the reconstruction. It's bad enough that the insider deal-making feeds the conspiracy theories of loonies such as former congresswoman Cynthia McKinney — who infamously suggested that President Bush allowed the terrorist atrocities of Sept. 11 so that his defense industry friends could profit from an ensuing war. But worse, far worse, is the way that the profiteering, which started before the first bombs fell, fuels the fear and resentment of skeptics around the world — notably Muslims, who already believe the war is largely about American

greed. With the difficulties facing an American occupation, the White House cannot afford to generate more ill will. Though the war has proved more difficult than many hawks predicted, an American military victory is still assured. But a political victory is not. Indeed, so far, the U.S. is losing that battle. The American-led invasion has fanned the flames of Muslim resentment, with Islamist clerics calling for volunteers for the "jihad" in Iraq. Still, the Bush administration steamrolls forward with its plan for occupation; it is in the process of awarding bids for a total of about \$1.5 billion, not only in secret but also excluding all but American companies. Even corporations from Great Britain, our staunch ally, have so far been excluded. Andrew Natsios, the head of USAID — which quietly requested proposals for rebuilding Iraq in January (when the Bush administration supposedly had not yet decided to go to war) — has

defended the process, saying that the agency needed to act quickly and depended on firms that already had security clearances. That included Bechtel, which once employed several Reagan administration officials, and Fluor, which includes among its high-ranking officers a former Army secretary. Writing recently in USA Today, Natsios said: "Critics have implied that inviting only the big firms to compete ... is a sign of cronyism or favoritism. This is far from the truth. If you need a surgeon, a lawn service, a real estate agent or a college, you seek out the names with the reputation for quality and the ability to get the job done." That proved quite convenient for Halliburton, which was struggling with severe financial problems. While Halliburton declined to bid on the major \$600 million contract to rebuild infrastructure such as bridges, it is still primed to become a subcontractor — a pretty good position for hefty profits. Last month its Kellogg Brown & Root subsidiary was awarded a contract, for an undisclosed sum, to extinguish oil well fires in Iraq.

Of course, Halliburton's stock-in-trade is oil-related contracts. If it gets substantial work in rebuilding Iraq's oil fields, the conspiracy buffs will have a field day linking the war to oil. So will fundamentalist Muslim clerics. President Bush's bid to impose democracy in Iraq — indeed, to sow democracy throughout the Middle East — is an enterprise fraught with risks, more likely to fail than to succeed. Iraq, after all, has tribal conflicts, feuding religious factions, and no history of strong democratic institutions. But if the democracy-building effort is to have any chance for success, the United States must proceed with the greatest diplomatic sensitivity — inviting an active U.N. presence, restarting negotiations for a Palestinian state, and avoiding even the appearance of using an occupation to enrich well-connected American corporations. So far, the White House effort looks more like old-fashioned colonialism. © 2003 THE ATLANTA JOURNAL-CONSTITUTION

acquire some color. Despite a little rain, the mural began to take shape.

Officer Mark James, 59 were injured. Those with serious injuries were taken to local hospitals, with Central Florida Regional receiving the most. Twenty-nine others were well enough to walk away and got sent to Sanford Middle School where they received care from the American Red Cross. James said that eleven more passengers were taken to the hospital after arriving at Sanford Middle School.

Both James and Miller said that all those with serious injuries would probably get discharged from the hospital by the end of the day. James said that some of those taken to Sanford Middle School experienced neck and back pain and also had bandages around their knees. He added that they would wait there for the rest of their party to return from the hospital and then get transported to their original destination.

"It was slammed," Chuck Williams, who works the pre-press for Oviedo Publishing, said. "I was in it for two and a half hours."

James complimented the overall effort of all the parties involved in handling the accident. That included fire and rescue units from Volusia and Seminole Counties, Lake Mary, Longwood and Sanford, as well as CERT and the Florida Department of Transportation.

"This was a huge joint effort between agencies," James said. "All and all, the incident management system was put into place today and worked to a tee."

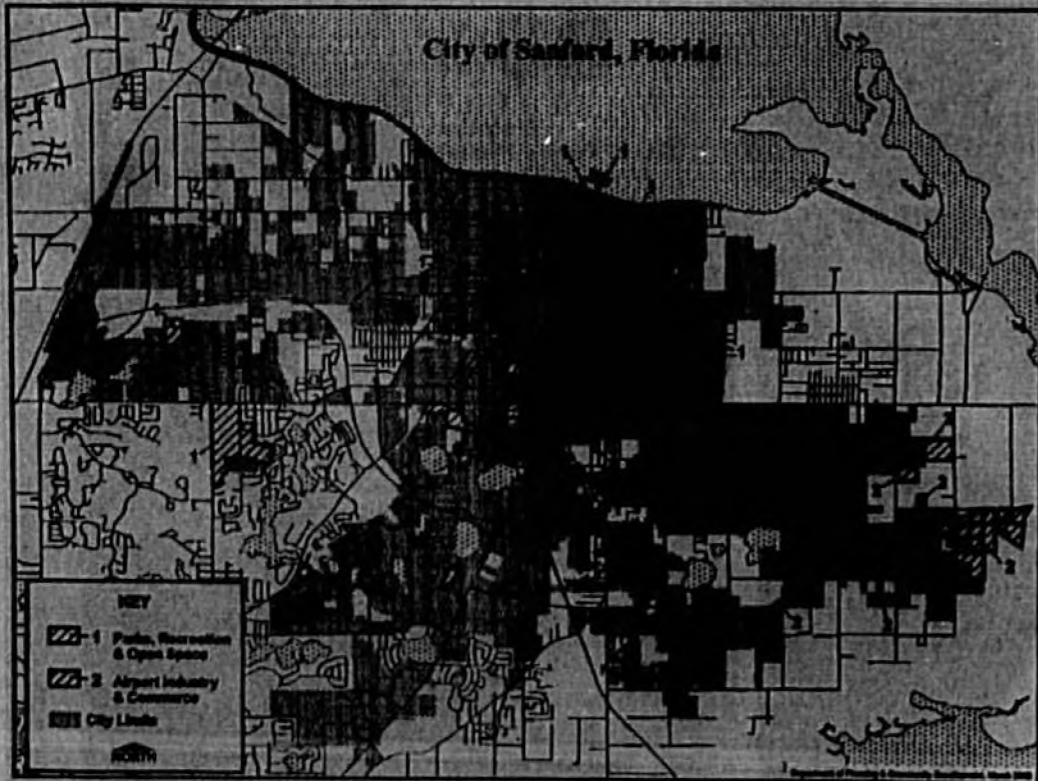

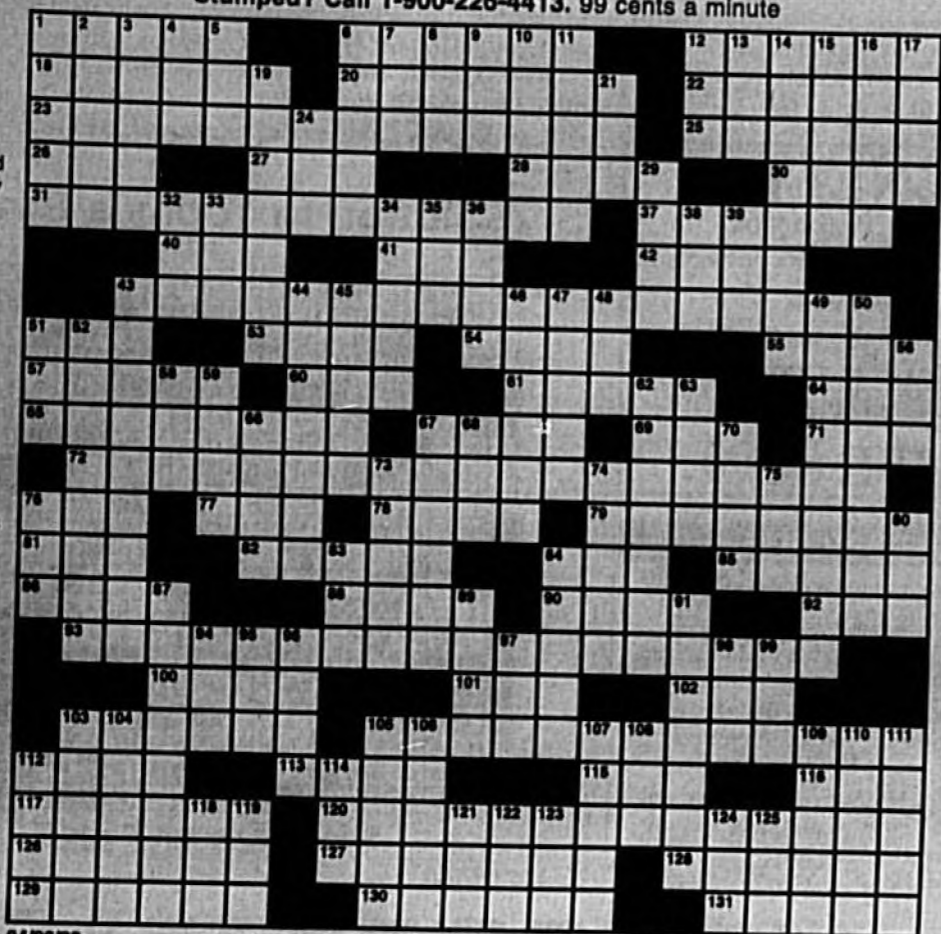

At 2:30, the procession formed at Park Avenue and First Street, and to slow music, the "Hathletes" marched away to the Place de Execution.

Promptly, the umpires, Messrs. E.B. Durlin and E.B. Forster called time, and the contest began, raging fast and furious for three hours and 20 minutes. Then the "Scorchers" John Smith carrying the flag of truce, a large cipher, asked permission to bury their dead, which request was cheerfully granted.

**Police conduct second search of United Arts' finance director's home**

Tuesday, April 1, Orlando Public Assistance Fraud (PAF) Supervisor Eric Ashby and Investigator Nobel Willits, along with the assistance of Regional Legal Advisor Steve Brady, initiated a search warrant at the residence of Steve Mason.

Mason is the former Finance Director of the non-profit United Arts of Central Florida. The organization receives a grant of \$100,000 per year from Seminole County for the promotion of arts in the county as well as throughout Central Florida.


Mason is suspected of stealing more than \$52,555 from United Arts of Central Florida. He is

suspected of stealing 56 monetary checks made payable to the organization.

He is further suspected of having in his possession, United Arts original Sun Trust Bank records for their money market and depository accounts, and United Arts ADP Payroll records. All of these items were recovered during a search of his residence.

This is the second search warrant obtained by PAF investigators on Mason. A warrant was previously issued freezing Mason's bank account that held approximately \$42,000 allegedly stolen from United Arts. Mason was previously arrested for similar thefts from Workforce, Etc.



Street has failed to take a position on the renovations. Part of the Main Street's \$62,500 contract with the CRA requires the organization to build consensus for CRA projects.

"Why are we funding you if you're not going to support us?" said board member Bob Kuhn. "Why are you guys not taking a position on something we so

"The bulk of the funding comes from outside the four-block area in downtown," said Parsell, noting that Central Florida Regional Hospital and other property owners along SR 46 generate most of the CRA tax revenue. "It's not just this one four-block area that is a stakeholder. The entire community has a stake in downtown."

"You can't do economic development, it's not going to do any good if we don't do renovations now," he added.

CRA chairman Larry Strickler, who participated in the meeting by phone from Tallahassee, said there were about a dozen meetings related to the project. He also said there is a lot of misinformation being circulated about the renovations.

"One person told me that all the business along 1st Street would be closed for the entire 18 months," Strickler said. "Where were all these people during this process?"

The CRA agreed to have Sechler meet with merchants before an April 14 joint work session between the CRA and the Sanford City Commission.

"It's a tough process," Parsell

said of the construction project. "I've had the main entrance to my stores completely blocked off when the state came in and did road work. But you work with it, get it done as fast as you can and move on."

"When it's over, you reap the rewards," said board member Linda Johnson, who has been involved with similar projects in front of her business.

The FHSAA Volleyball Advisory Committee discussed the potential implementation of rally scoring at length at its Dec. 3, 2002 meeting, voting 5-2 in favor of the rule once the NFHS made it available for state association adoption.

"The rally scoring format has been popular at the collegiate level and with the state associations that experimented with it," said Commissioner Robert W.

Hughes. "It's more spectator friendly and brings an added level of excitement to each match."

During the 2002 season, 15 state associations experimented with rally scoring. In statistics compiled by the NFHS, the average length of a game with rallying scoring was 18 minutes, compared to 21 minutes for games with side-out scoring. The National Collegiate Athletic Association adopted the rally scoring format in 2001.

The Board of Directors also adopted terms and conditions for invitational state championship series in girls & boys bowling and girls weightlifting. The FHSAA State Bowling Series will take place in the fall, with the FHSAA Bowling Finals state tournament the

Association to "Florida High School Athletic Association," for submission to the membership for adoption.

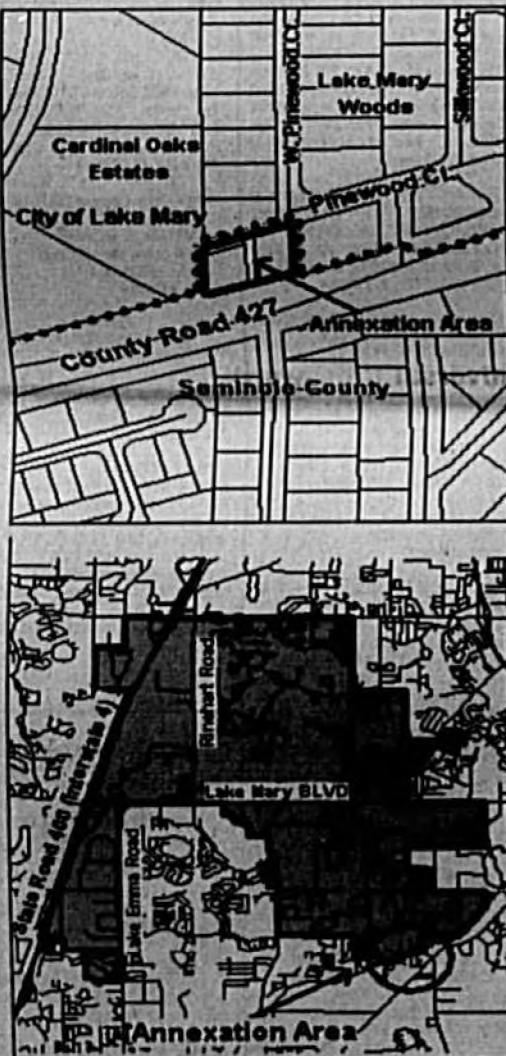

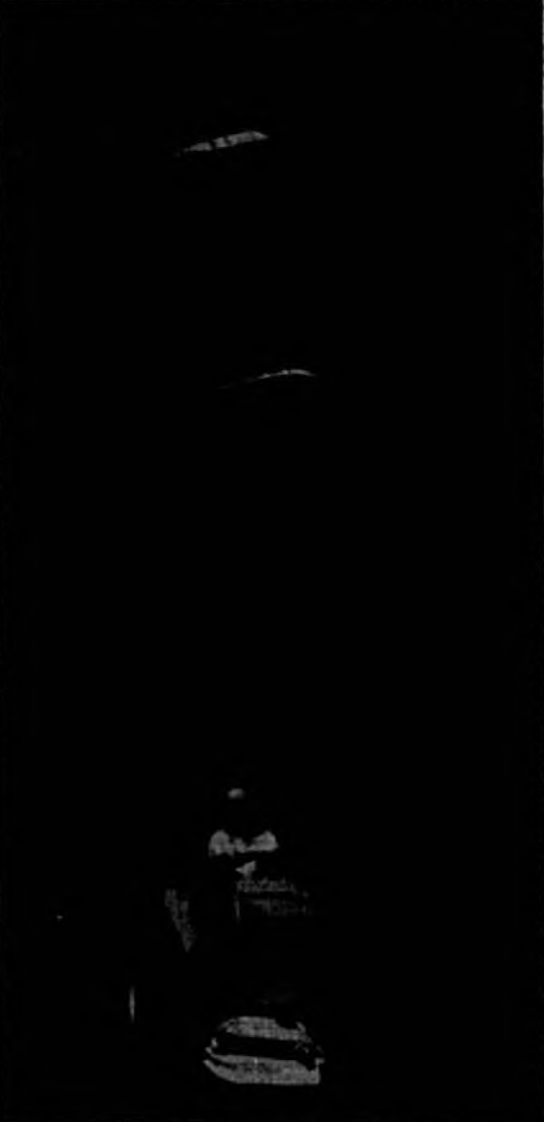
