Actor Believes You Just Can't Keep Fans Happy

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Tony Curtis who gets about 10,000 fan letters a month says he'd never be able to "smoke, drink or make love" if he heeded the demands in many of them.

"If I lived the way a lot of fans want me to, I'd have to change my whole way of life," he said.

The 34-year-old actor, relaxing in his white-carpets study in gray shorts, a white T-shirt and sneakers, said:

"I decided at the beginning of my career that I'd rather quit than make believe I was absolutely pure just to keep fans happy. No career is worth that."

"I'm not kidding when I say some letters tell me how to conduct my love life. Some say I shouldn't drink or smoke. One guy wrote that if he saw me eating meat in a still photograph, he'd stay away from my pictures."

Curtis said he and his wife, Janet Leigh, get about 15,000 fan letters a month between them.

"But fan mail is really no criterion by which to judge a star," he said. "A lot of performers get mail but couldn't get into a movie unless they bought a ticket."

"Curtis, currently appearing in "Operation Petticoat," said he is much more comfortable now that he's a recognized actor than he was as a teen-age idol.

"My turning point came when I made "Trapeze" with Burt Lancaster," he said. "Before that, I was under contract to a studio—Universal-International—and they were interested in anything that could make a quick buck. I'm not averse to money, and I don't want to sound like those hoksey method actors—but I always wanted something better."

"From now on, I want to do more and more light comedy. I'm trying to find a range between Marion Brando and Gary Grant. Brando is the foremost motion picture actor around because he can bring to the screen the complexities of today's generation."

"But he has his limits because movies are not made just for today. That's why Gary is the best over a long period and why I admire him. I think people can take a dire situation when they see a grain of humor in it. They have too much straight drama in their own lives. Gary can take any subject and lighten it for an audience."
