## Home Agent Guides Youth Clubs

Plant nematodes are probably responsible for more injury to turf-grasses in south Florida than all other factors combined. Nematode counts from hundreds of lawns and other turf-grass areas indicate that as little as 100 per cent of the unhealthy turf is due to this pest. Symptoms of injury are patches of dying grass ranging in color from pale green to brown and with greatly reduced root systems.

During 4 years of testing at the Everglades Station, a nematode called *Sarax* was the only one tested which was consistently found to cause injury to turf-grass and to be safe for use on golf greens and home lawns. This material is a specially formulated Diazinon compound for soil application for nematode and soil insect control.

Applications to St. Augustine grass have given equally good results. The nematode die-off is very rapid and control of chinch bugs was noted for more than two months. Zoysia and centipede grasses infested by root knot nematodes treated with 3/4 pint of Sarax per 1,000 square feet maintained vigorous green color a year later while surrounding grass was dead.

The researcher explained that Sarax has not been labeled for ornamentals. While it is considered safe for home lawns, it must be applied at low pressure (35-40 psi) and with caution. It must also be "drenched" into the soil rather than applied as a top-dressing.

# Doyle Conner Concerned About U. S. Food Prospects

TALLAHASSEE (NEA)—Hall County's people may go to bed hungry, but most of us are sure we'll never find out how that other half lives. Doyle Conner isn't so sure.

United States a deficit food producer country. "That prospect may not sound as frightening as war in Asia, riots in the cities and the attack on the dollar, but Conner wouldn't bet on that either. According to him, "No country with deficit food production has even been able to retain world leadership. A nation that's forced to trade hard goods for food, such as Britain is today, is in the worst kind of trouble. Even if foreign competition resulted in a cheaper product for the consumer, it would be the most expensive eating—the worst bargain—that the American people ever realized."

Conner has the credentials to sound off on his favorite subject. He's a lot more than a pecker who wandered into politics for lack of a better row to hoe. He was something of a boy wonder in 1950 when, as a 30-year-old college sophomore, he won election to the Florida House of Representatives. He gained re-election through 1960 when he became Florida's first elected commissioner of agriculture. He was re-elected without opposition for a two-year term in 1964 and for a four-year term in 1968. Along the way he was named one of the 10 outstanding young men in the nation by the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce.

When he isn't running an insurance and real estate business, the commissioner is very much a farmer, and he's proud to be one. It's his fond of noting that agriculture brings far more money into Florida than does tourism.

Conner, a Democrat, like all the other members of the Florida cabinet, with the exception of Gov. Claude Kirk, admits he doesn't have the answers.
