

Seminole rancher Ed Yarborough dies

A former county commissioner, he was a leader in the community and the state cattle industry

GENEVA — A prominent cattle rancher who presided over 7,600 acres of land, Ed Yarborough, died Monday, Aug. 14, 2000. He was 69.

Yarborough and his wife Imogene, were not only involved in cattle ranching, but often opened their ranch near

Geneva for tours by school children, cattlemen's associations, agricultural groups, and the annual Seminole County Farm Tour. Often, at their own expense, they also provided meals for small to large groups of visitors.

He was also involved in the political life of the community, having served on the Seminole County Commission from 1965 to 1973. He was also past-president of the Seminole County Cattlemen's Association and was the recipient of many awards pertaining to ranching and agriculture.

He was a frequent guest speaker, known for his straightforward approach to the cattle industry, and a great deal of the ranching history in Seminole County.

Seminole County Commissioner Randy Morris had the utmost praise for Yarborough.

"He was a true gentleman," he said. "To me, he was the model of what a Florida

Rancher really is. He was always helpful, even when he and I took a differing position."

Morris said Yarborough, "was the kind of person who, when he spoke, people really listened."

Funeral services will be held Friday morning at Brisson Funeral Home in Sanford.

SANFORD - On Friday, August 18, the Seminole County Sheriff's Office will hold its annual awards ceremony to honor deputies, civilians and citizens who have made a difference to the community by going beyond the call of duty.

The awards, to be given by Sheriff Don Eslinger, include a Purple Heart, a number of Life Saving Commendations and a Unit Citation.

The Purple Heart will be awarded to a former Seminole County Sheriff's Deputy who recently passed away. Deputy Rudolph Kramer suffered a gunshot wound the evening of October 27, 1977 during a struggle with a suspect who had wrestled a gun away from another deputy. The suspect was later wounded and captured at the scene.

A Unit Citation will be awarded to the Civilian Search and Rescue Team for its dedication and volunteer spirit. During the

lengthy investigation regarding Cory Erving's disappearance, the unit logged well over 1,000 hours of volunteer time. The unit has dedicated one day a month for training and has responded to limited searches in other cases during the past six

The CDME program is a collaborative effort of the World **Tourism Management Centre**


(WTMC) at the University of Calgary, Purdue University, and the International Association of Convention and Visitor Bureaus.



Sometimes doctors need to adjust drug dosages

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have been prescribed digoxin and atenolol for my atrial fibrillation. The medicines seem to cause nausea and shortness of breath. Do you have any recommendations?

a generic answer, in hopes that it will stimulate you to review your concerns with your physician. It's entirely possible that you

may be reacting to one of your medicines - or to their combination. Atrial fibrillation is an irregular heartbeat that may sometimes be too rapid. Digoxin is a good therapy because it slows the pulse and increases the strength of cardiac contractions. However, it has one glaring drawback: what doctors call a narrow therapeutic index. This means that the optimal dose of the medication is very close to the toxic dose. Because digoxin toxicity is frequently associated with nausea and loss of appetite (as well as other signs and symptoms), I am concerned that your dose of digoxin needs adjustment. Your doctor can easily diagnose digoxin toxicity by ordering a

drug-level analysis in your blood, a simple test. If the results indicate a high level of digoxin, the dose must be reduced. That's the first consid-

Atenolol, a beta-blocker, also slows the pulse. But the medlcation may be associated with diminished cardiac contractions, leading to an accumulation of fluid in the lungs that can cause breathlessness. I'm not at all sure that you need this drug; the digoxin may be enough. This is the second con-

The dosage and necessity of these medications are issues that I defer to your physician Other prescription drugs might be more appropriate. If your doctor is unable to make the necessary adjustments, I recommend a consultation with a cardiologist.

Finally, atrial fibrillation increases the risk of stroke in many patients. This is why specialists encourage the use of anti-coagulant medication, such as Coumadin, to prevent this complication. This is yet another concern that you must review with your practitioner. This is the third consideration.

In summary, the nature of your disorder is unclear. More work needs to be done to identify the role that medications may be playing in contributing to your symptoms - and whether the medicines themselves should be altered or changed. DEAR DR. GOTT: Could my burning feet be the result of a vitamin B-12 deficiency?

DEAR READER: Yes.

Pernicious anemia (vitamin B-12 deficiency) causes many neurological complications, as well as burning feet.

Such complications may occur long before the anemia is evident and may include: weakness, numbness of the extremities, poor balance, depression, irritability, burning tongue, liver swelling, abdominal pain and - late in the disease dementia. In other words, m of the body's tissues are affected by the deficiency because vitamin B-12 is necessary for the formation of RNA and DNA, the vital compounds that control the life processes in all human cells. When nerves are deprived of B-12, they begin to function abnormally, hence the appearance of symptoms such as burning, numbness and weakness.

Pernicious anemia is believed to be an auto-immune (selfallergy) disease, marked by shrinkage of certain cells in the stomach that are necessary for proper absorption of dietary vitamin B-12. The diagnosis can readily be made using a simple blood test.

Treatment of this disorder is both straightforward and inexpensive: B-12 injections given every month or two. Injectable B-12 is rapidly utilized by the body and will usually reverse all the symptoms I listed, including the nerve malfunc-



Motorist commended for making a call for safety

Traveling eastbound on Interstate-4 in Orlando Sunday afternoon, six motorcycles flew past traffic at high rates of speed. The motorcyclists darted in and out of traffic — often traveling on the shoulder to pass cars.

Continuing easterly near Sanford, there was the typical slowdown. At the St. Johns River bridge, three Florida Highway Patrol cars were pulled off, along with the same six motorcycles. The riders were sitting on the barriers next to the road being interviewed by the officers.

While the FHP office in Orlando says no reports were made regarding the incident, someone may have used a cellular phone to report the speeders.

Based on the speed of the motorcyclists and the erratic way they were driving, the call could have prevented serious injuries — not only to the motorcyclists, but also to other motorists who could have easily collided with one of them.

Law enforcement agencies have often said having telephone capabilities on vehicles is like having extra eyes watching our highways. Most of the calls pertain to wrecks, but some motorists report situations concerning unsafe behavior on the roadways.

We highly commend the motorist who took the time to make the call and urge others to do likewise whenever a similar threat to safety is observed.

We also commend troopers of the Florida Highway Patrol for their prompt action in following up this call. It doesn't mafter whether the motorists were arrested, issued tickets, or lectured and allowed to go on their way. What matters is they were stopped and the rest of the motorists on I-4 that afternoon were given another step toward improving safety on the highway.







Bush: A different kind of Republican

To suggest, as Cocco has, that Powell and Rice and the other black speakers featured at the GOP convention in Philadelphia are "minstreis" simply because they choose to associate with

Republicans is nothing short of racist.

For implicit in Cocco's remark is the bigoted suggestion that all 35 million or so black folias in this country ought to think alike; ought to be members

> But the black population is not monolithic. There are some black Americans like Powell, like Rice - who appreciate their heritage, who love their people, but

of the same political

who happen to believe there is a place for blacks in the party of George W. Bush. And while the vast majority of

black registered voters are almost certain to cast their ballots for the Democratic ticket come November, Bush has nonetheless made some inroads.

Indeed, in a post-Philadelphia CNN/USA Today/Gallup Poll which Cocco found quite disturbing, no doubt - 52 percent of blacks said Bush had leadership and personal qualities to be president; 54 percent said they approve of Bush as a person; 37 percent said Bush, if elected. would work hard to represent black interests.

Clearly, Bush is perceived differently among the mass of black Americans than Republican presidential nominees past (including the Texas governor's father).

That is attributable, in part, to Bush's effort to reach out to the black community, as evidenced by his recent appearance at the NAACI's national convention (at which he became first Republican presidential nominee to address the nation's leading civil rights organization in 16 years).

It is also attributable to the GOP standard-bearer's message of inclusion, as eloquently set forth in his acceptance speech in Philadelphia.

"We will extend the promise of protperity to every forgotten corner of this country." said Bush. To every man and woman, a chance to succeed. To every child, a chance to learn. To every family, a chance to live with dignity and hope."

And what would a Bush presidency mean for blacks, particularly the most needful?

On education: "When a school district receives federal funds to teach poor children," he declared, "we expect them to learn. And if they don't, parents should get the money to make a different choice.

On tax policy: "Those in greatest need should receive the greatest help," said Bush. "So we will lower the bottom rate from 15 percent to 10 percent and double the child tax credit.

On health care: "We will give low-income Americans tax credits to buy the private health insurance they need and deserve."

And on housing: "We will transform today's housing rental

program to help hundreds of thousands of low-income families find stability and dignity in a home of their own.

Clearly, Bush is, as he characterizes himself, "a different kind of Republican." And he just may be the man to bring blacks back into the Grand Old Party, after a half-century-long estrangement.

That's not to say that the Texas governor has black voters runhing into the Republican fold. But at least he doesn't have a fearful black electorate mobilizing to prevent him from winning the White House

And that is what has Cocco and other Democratic Party loyalists so concerned. They fret that black voters, the most reliably Democratic voting bloc, may start to defect to the party of Bunh.

So they insinuate that any black who abandons the Democratic plantation is a traitor to his or her race; must be some sort of minstrel, frankly.

What particularly rankles is the hypocrisy of Cocco and her ilk. How swift they were, for instance, to condemn the hateful remarks that the ousted president of the NAACP's Dallas chapter made about Joseph Lieberman, merely because of his religious faith. Yet, these supposedly enlightened follos think nothing whatsoever about uttering no less hateful remarks about blacks like Colin Powell and Condoleezza Rice, merely because they happen to be Republicans.

Crumble the goat cheese over the melon.

CHILLED MELON SOUP WITH MINT SORBET

For the sorbet: 1/2 cup sugar

2 cups water

3/4 finely chopped orange mint (also called eau-de-Cologne mint) or spearmint

juice of 1 lemon, or more or less to taste

For the soup: 1 cantaloupe (or a Persian, Crenshaw or honeydew melon) 2 pounds watermelon, peeled and chopped

lemon juice, to taste

To make the sorbet: Heat the sugar and water in a saucepan and stir to dissolve the sugar. Bring to a boil, then remove from the heat and allow to cool. Add the mint and lemon juice.

Pour the syrup into an icecream maker and process according to manufacturer's directions. Sorbet should be firm. If it is not, put in an airtight container and freeze until firm. Or, pour into a shallow pan and freeze

overnight. The next day, put the ice in a food processor and puree it to remove large crystals. Pack in a plastic container and freeze until firm.

Make the soup: Halve the cantaloupe (or other melon) and remove the seeds. Scoop the flesh into a blender or food processor. Add the flesh from the watermelon (you needn't remove the seeds). Process to a puree, then rub through a strainer into a bowl to remove the watermelon seeds. If the melons are slightly unripe you may need to add sugar or lemon juice to develop flavor. Cover and refrigerate 2 hours.

To serve: Ladle the soup into

chilled bowls and spoon sorbet into the center. Serve immediately. Yield: 4 servings.

Note: You will not need all the sorbet, but it is difficult to make a smaller batch. Keep leftover sorbet covered and frozen up to one week. Serve as an accompaniment to fruit or chocolate, or between courses as a palate

who wants to keep closing the gap to assure poorer residents the same medical services as those who are more fortunate. She wants to strengthen the Healthy Start prenatal and Infant care program and expand dental services to the underprivileged.

Much of Dr. Bencie's time will be spent directing programs to prevent outbreaks of meningitis, tuberculosis, Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B. She is concerned about the health habits of food service workers and the influx of visitors to the Central Florida area. Recently, she directed a vaccine program offered in Orange County.

"We need to be developing partnerships and pulling resources with other health agencies," she said, "making sure also that we don't duplicate services."

Being prepared for emergencies, such as turnadoes and hurricanes, is also a top health pri-

'Jenny' leaves Sanford for bright lights



the opportunity to see the boat while it was being restored.


Kathy Burns, Planet Hollywood Public Relations Manager said it only required approximately \$2,500 worth of repairs to get the shrimp

by the Pistons on March 9. He averaged 6.4 points, 4.5 rebounds and 19.6 minutes in 17 games with Washington.

Originally selected by Detroit in the second round (58th overall) in the 1995 NBA Draft, Reid has appeared in 269 NBA regular season games. He has averaged 3.8 points and 2.8 rebounds in 14.4 minutes per game during that span.

His best pro season came in 1998-99, where he averaged 5.1 points and 3.6 rebounds in 47 outings with Detroit. Reid led the Pistons in field goal percentage, shooting .557 from the floor.

Reid played in 122 career collegiate games for Georgetown University. He recorded 122 blocked shots during his career, despite only averaging 15.9 minutes per game. Reld had 60 blocked shots in 31 games in 1994-95, while averaging 7.2 points and 5.7 rebounds. He also served as the Hoyas' team captain during his senior season.

Reid gives the Magic some added muscle on the front line which they will need to battle the likes of the Miami Heat and New York Knicks if they want to contend for the Eastern Conference title this coming season.




