





We refer to "Community Antenna Television." In considering this facility it is essential that no one confuses it with the controversial subject of "Pay Television." They are not the same.

CATV is a means by which television programs from 12 stations are brought into a city with quality pictures guaranteed to all subscribers. Those who have seen CATV in action report that black-and-white reception is improved and color TV almost unbelievably perfect.

Here is what happens. Under a carefully prepared "ordinace" Sanford would grant a nonexclusive franchise to a private company to erect the master antenna, pipe in the programs and offer CATV to those who would want to sub-

Under a proposed franchise the cost to subscribers would be \$10 for one connection and \$1 each for additional sets in the same house. Quality picture reception would be guaranteed at

There would be no cost to the city or to taxpayers as such. In fact the city would receive six per cent of the gross and, in addition would have tax receipts coming from the CATV company's equipment. It would allow educational TV to come into


