**OPA Says Meat Price List Gives Housewife Black Market Weapon**

The new meat price list gives the housewife her strongest weapon against the black market in meat, OPA District Director Roy M. Coffey in Jacksonville said yesterday.

"There's only one force that keeps a black market in business, and that's customers," he added. "If shoppers will check these list and never pay a penny above the legal price, illegal markets will dry up almost overnight."

A. B. Peterson, chairman of the local War Price and Rationing Board, said yesterday that a limited number of copies of the new meat price list, in a convenient size for folding into purses or ration books, are now available at the Board office on a first come, first served basis. The list giving top prices permissible for all major cuts and types of meat, is a dose of "printed poison" in OPA's continuing fight against meat black markets. With it, the home town housewife can help achieve fairer distribution of our available meat supplies, Chairman Peterson said.

**MORE CANNED MILK**—Meat to make more canned milk available for infants, invalids and others who require it in essential diets, OPA has reduced the amount currently used by industrial and institutional users.

Restaurants, prisons, and manufacturers of various products, will not be allowed in the future to use their red points for purchasing canned milk, OPA said. It means where flight, or other substitutes are used, a double, however, the amount of milk permitted for industrial use will be reduced.

**LIQUOR HOLIDAY**—ANTY SUGAR The July "Liquor Holiday" during which distilleries may temporarily resume production of beverage alcohol, will not be in effect until August 1, OPA officials said yesterday. The actual need for the military supplies, OPA District Director Roy M. Coffey said in Jacksonville today.

No sugar is being allocated for the making of beverage alcohol for sale, OPA said. The amount of sugar available for industrial alcohol, which will be used for the purpose of coffee added.

**FARMS LAUGHTERERS**—Farm slaughterers here in Seminole County were reminded this week by the OPA district office of the July 1 deadline for registration. All farmers who slaughter, or have slaughtered for them, as much as 400 pounds a year, but less than 6,000 pounds, must apply for a slaughtering permit by July 1 or they will be prohibited from such slaughter for the balance of the year, said the OPA release.

Permits may be obtained from the local War Price and Rationing Board, Chairman Peterson said today. The permit entitles the farmer to do the same amount of slaughtering as in the corresponding period last year.

Mr. Peterson also stressed the fact that farmers who sell meat must collect the point of record on the official point-card provided by the Board, and must agree to hold all prices within the legal ceiling.

**TIRE DEALERS' RECORDS**—Stewart C. Maxey, OPA District Rationing Executive, yesterday urged tire dealers to maintain accurate records of all tire transactions, in preparation of the inventory they must make on June 30.

This inventory, accounting for all rationed tires and Parts B, must be filed by July 10. Dealers not filing by that date will not be allowed to deal in rationed tires until the filing has been made, Maxey said. These new records and inventories are the latest step in OPA's strengthened controls over the distribution of tires, Maxey said. "We are still critically short on tires, and we must make absolutely sure that every single tire reaches a legitimate, essential user," he added.

**USED CAR PRICES DOWN**—Used car prices all over America will take a four percent drop on July 1, the Office of Price Administration announced this week in Washington. The move affects cars sold either by regular dealers or private owners. The price cut is in accordance with used car pricing regulations which provide for normal depreciation, OPA officials said, adding that four per cent would also be deducted from charged allowed for extra equipment, such as heaters and radios. This price drop should not only prove a stimulant to used car sales, said an OPA spokesman, but will also provide additional low-cost transportation to essential workers.

**EXTRA GAS**—Additional gasoline will now be available for farmers' representatives who market fresh fruit and vegetables,

the local War Price and Rationing Board, presenting both his temporary duty orders and the rationing record for the car he will be using, the announcement said. The amount of the ration remains the same, one gallon of gasoline for each day of the furlough, with a maximum of 30 gallons, OPA officials said.

**USO Shows Play For Boys On Okinawa**

NEW YORK CITY, June 20. (Special)—Less than eight hours after they were wounded on Okinawa, American troops are getting the best possible medicine—news of home from USO-Camp Shows acts at the evacuation hospital on Saipan.

USO-Camp Shows, National War Fund, designed to bring entertainment to the troops, is in operation right behind the fighting lines in the Pacific, according to a report just received from Moss Hart by (named of local chairman), Hart, author of Winged Victory, just returned from the Pacific front after appearing in his own play The Man Who Came To Dinner on Kwaleien, Tinsan, Guam, Saipan and the cotton and Hawaiian Islands.

The Man Who Came To Dinner company arrived at Maui in the Hawaiian two days after the return there of the Marines who had won Iwo Jima. Veterans of

the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Marine division campaigns, the Leathernecks had not seen live entertainment for two years and they crowded the show for all fourteen performances on the island, Hart said.

Okinawa casualties arriving in Saipan were not able to watch the play, but the troupe members spent the mornings and afternoons before performances visiting from bed to bed in the wards. Hart indicated that this hospital work is one of the most important jobs of USO-Camp Shows actors. The men prefer talking to civilians and writing from home even to seeing a show, he said.
