Rocky's Children: We're Satisfied With All Efforts

NEW YORK (UPI) - Nelson Rockefeller's four eldest children, hoping to put an end to the growing controversy over his death, have issued a statement saying they are satisfied everything was done to try to save their

In a joint statement, which they called their final public comment on the matter, the children said they believe Megan Marshack, the 25-year-old aide who was with Rockefeller when he died, "acted responsibly" in seeking medical help.

Sluggish Rise In Industry

WASHINGTON (UPI) The nation's industrial output, a key economic indicator. inched upward by 0.1 percent in January for the most sluggish performance in a year, the Federal Reserve Board said today. The newest report on the economy said that overall production was adversely affected by poor weather last month as automobile output fell sharply and consumer durable goods declined for the second month in a row.

3 Cubans Guilty In Slaying

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Three Cuban exiles have been found guilty of all charges connected with the 1976 assassination of Chilean diplomat Orlando Letelier by blowing up his car on Washington's Embassy Row with a remote-controlled bomb. The Cubans, members of the militant anti-Castro Cuban Nationalist Movement, will be given a sentencing date after U. S. District Judge Barrington Parker receives pre-sentencing reports from the U.S. Marshals Service.

Trio Arrested In Pot Haul

NEW ORLEANS (UPI)— Three Florida men have been arrested in what Customs agents said was the largest seizure of marijuana in gulf coast history. Customs officials said they seized 36,000 pounds of high in a four-engine airplane forced down in Panama City, Fla.

Grecian Marble Head Found

NEW YORK (UPI)— Detectives checking out a telephone tip found the \$150,000 Grecian marble head stolen from the Metropolitan Museum of Art last week. The 20-pound, bearded head of a Greek god was recovered from a locker in Grand Central Terminal Wednesday night, police said. Its theft was said to be the largest in the museum's history.

Graham Won't Drop Coed As Nominee For Regents

Gov. Bob Graham plans to stick by his appointment of University of Florida senior Julie Jett to the Board of Regents. Graham said Wednesday he believes Miss Jett when she says she's a resident of Lee County, even though her parents reside in Broward.

The Florida Flambeau, a student-oriented newspaper at Florida State University, said Miss Jett only registered to vote in Lee County a few days before applying to the BOR. If she lived in Broward, she would be unable to serve on the BOR because Chairman James Gardener resides in Fort Lauderdale and state law forbids two regents from the same county. The appointment goes to the Cabinet for approval on Tuesday.

Bilandic: Christ Or Shah?

Chicago Mayor Michael Bilandic couldn't seem to decide if he's more like Jesus Christ or the shah of Iran, so he mixed both in his metaphors Wednesday. In a podium-pounding speech rallying 500 Democratic precinct captains to his re-election cause, a beleaguered Bilandic shouted, "In the early history of Christianity, you see a leader starting with 12 disciples. They crucified the leader and made martyrs of the disciples." Minutes later, he likened criticism of his administration to problems besetting the shah, saying, "The same seeds of subversion are being planted in Chicago ... the same attempts are being made to destroy." The primary test comes Feb. 27.

'He Didn't Know The Gun Was Loaded'

The 12-year-old Sanford boy who shot and killed a twoand-one-half-year-old Lake Mary boy in a rural Sanford trailer Thursday did not know the .30 caliber rifle he used was loaded, according to his father Jesse J. Lee, 42, Lot 11 Pinecrest Trailer Park, Sanford.

Lee said today his son had taken the loaded rifle from a gun rack in the master bedroom of his home. The master bedroom, where the rifle was kept on a walltype gun rack, is next to the bathroom where Michael Eric Smith, son of Mrs. Steven Bauder, 457 Crystal Lake Ave...

The 25-year-old father is a refrigeration serviceman at Bauder Associates in Sanford. The mother, Delores, 24, is a bookkeeper at Northgate Tire Center in Orlando. Seminole County Medical Examiner Dr. G. V. Garay ruled today the cause of death was due to external

possibility of his son loading the gun. "Apparently it had to have been loaded, he would not have had time to load the gun," Lee said of his son.

Lee said his son is in a "dazed condition." "I don't think he can believe it happened," said Lee. The 12-year-old Lee youth was staying home from Liberty Christian School, 2626 Palmetto Ave., Sanford,

because of classroom problems, said his father. "It wasn't that he was being bad or anything, he just wasn't paying attention to his school work," Lee said of his son's dismissal from classes.

Lee described Eric, as the Smith boy was known, "one in a million." "He was just like a member of the family to all of us."




