The Political Uses Of JFK's Killing

By JEFFREY ST. JOHN Copley News Service

NEW YORK-"Who controls the past controls the future," George Orwell wrote in his novel "1984." "Who controls the present controls

Orwell understood from first-hand knowledge and experience how history could be distorted and used as a political weapon. In the four volumes of his collected essays, for example, he provided the contemporary reader with a rich source of material on how the political left not only distorted history but used and manipulated the arts for the purposes of progaganda.

"Between 1935 and 1939 the Communist Party had almost irresistible fascination for any writer under forty," Orwell observed in 1940. "...For about three years, in fact, the central

stream of English literature was more or less

directly under Communist control." The consequences of this left-wing ideological dominance of literature manifested itself in the motion picture industry in America in the 1940's, particularly since most Hollywood screenplays relied heavily on English literary output. "The Hollywood Ten" furor that erupted during a congressional committee investigation in the early 1950s was caused, essentially, by a group of writers and producers who either were active Communist Party members or sympathetic to its cause. At the time, all ten insisted they were victims of political persecution and refused to confirm or deny they were members of the Communist Party.

Some 20 years after the famous "Hollywood Ten" case, one of those celebrated ten, screenwriter Dalton Trumbo, admitted to this columnist on a 1972 Chicago TV program that, indeed, he had been a Communist as charged by a congressional committee.

Today Trumbo, in concert with others from the Old and New Left, has helped produce a motion picture based on the assassination of John F. Kennedy, "Executive Action," which had its premere here and stars Burt Lancaster



There is a danger that

Congress will do just that. The House Ways and Means Committee has approved a Democrat-sponsored bill for an 11 per cent, two-step increase in Social Security benefits next year. A parallel increase in payroll taxes is not great enough to cover it. The result would be to add \$900 million to the deficit in the current federal budget. The administration wants to avoid this by raising benefits 10 per cent at the middle of the year.

If the Democrats have an eye on the votes of senior citizens when they call for an earlier increase in benefits, they may have an eye on another group of voters when they are reluctant to ask wage-earners to pay for





Justice Dies

KANSAS CITY (AP) - Former U.S. Justice Charles Evans Whittaker has died at 72. He entered St. Luke's hospital Nov. 21, and his death there on Monday was attributed to a "ruptured abdominal aneurism." Whittaker was appointed to the Supreme Court in 1957 by another Kansan, the late President Dwight D. Eisenhower. He left the high court in 1962 because of physical exhaustion.

Slaying Suspect

WALPOLE, Mass. (AP) - Officials say

hey have a suspect in the slaying of Albert DeSalvo, the self-professed Boston Strangler, in his cell at Walpole State Prison. Norfolk County Dist. Atty. George G. Burke declined to identify the suspect but said DeSalvo's killing may have been related to prison drug trafficking. De-Salvo, who was found stabbed on Monday, was serving a life sentence imposed in 1967 for sexual assaults on four women. DeSalvo once confessed to slaying 13 women in the Boston area between June

Air Pollution

LOS ANGELES (AP) - A federal judge has ruled that antitrust laws cannot be used to force auto makers to clean up the air that automobiles have polluted. U.S. District Court Judge Manuel Real criticized the auto industry for a "less than spectacular" effort to fight pollution on its own, but he dismissed 34 of 38 lawsuits against the nation's auto manufacturers. He said antitrust laws gave him no power to force the companies to provide cities and counties - had asked for such relief. NASSAU, Bahamas (AP) - Attorneys ighting to prevent extradition of Robert Vesco have charged the U.S. government Vesco's lawyers were scheduled to

present arguments for the second day today before Bahamian Magistrate Emmanuel Osadebay. Chief defense attorney Eugene Dupuch

argued that Vesco could not be extradited because the crime he is charged with is not covered under the extradition treaty between the Bahamas and the United

Vesco is charged with defrauding a New Jersey firm he once headed of \$50,000. Dupuch also charged that government attorneys, who ended their arguments Thursday, had failed to prove a case against Vesco.

Dupuch said the U.S. case was based on hearsay and "sweeping generalities." "The heavy burden of proof rests upon the government of the United States, and they wholly failed that burden," Dupuch

Vesco, along with former U.S. Atty. Gen. John Mitchell and former Commerce Secretary Maurice Stans, is also charged in the United States in connection with an alleged \$200,000 secret contribution to President Nixon's re-election effort. That charge does not figure in the Bahamian extradition proceedings.
