New U.S. Nuclear Weapons **Dutch Parliament Rejects**

THE HAGUE, Netherlands (UPI) - The Dutch Parliament has rejected a controversial U.S. plan to deploy new intermediate-range nuclear weapons in Western Europe, dashing hopes for unanimous approval by the NATO allies.

Shortly before midnight, Parliament voted, 76-69, for a motion that rejects outright the production and deployment in Western Europe of 572 Pershing 2 intermediate-range nuclear missiles and calls for immediate negotiation with the Soviet Union on the reduction of nuclear arms.

Prime Minister Dries Van Agt's center-right coalition government lost the confrontation with the Labor and Democrats 66 opposition when 10 dissidents in his own party broke ranks to vote with the left wing against the U.S. nuclear modernization plan for NATO.

LONDON (UPI) - Lord Soames, 59, a senior diplomat, government minister and son-in-law of the late Sir Winston Churchill, today was named interim governor of Zimbabwe-Rhodesia to serve until new

Deputy Foreign Secretary Sir Ian Gilmour made the announcement in the House of Commons, confirming predictions by sources close to the Rhodesia conference now in its final stages at Lancaster House. Gilmour said Soames will arrive in the Rhodesian capital of Salisbury "in the course of next week."

Americans Hurt In Cuba

MIAMI (UPI) — A group of Americans jailed in a Cuban prison was attacked last week by Cuban prisoners wielding knives and bottles, the U.S. State Department said Thursday.

A letter detailing the Nov. 29 attack was written by del Este prison. It was delivered to Karen Bennett of Miami, whose husband Bob Bennett, 30, is serving a two-year sentence for violating Cuban air space.
"An attack by six or seven Cuban prisoners started with knives and bottles on our cell with the deliberate purpose to seriously injure or kill the prisoners in our cell," the letter said.

Porno Ordinances Needed Here, Now

Seminole County cannot afford to take lightly Sheriff John Polk's latest offers to prevent an influx of pornography-related activity he says is headed for this county because of a crackdown in Orange and other nearby counties.

Sheriff Polk is proposing the county adopt a series of ordinances designed to control and regulate topless dancing, massage parlors, adult bookstores and mini-theaters and prostitution.

Because, according to Polk, police intelligence indicates those involved in such business in area counties have their eyes on Seminole County as the place to go since they are being fought tooth and nail by public officials and citizens' groups in

Why Seminole County? Because this county has no ordinances regulating such activity. There already are three topless dancing establishments in Seminole County; two in the unincorporated area at Fern Park, and one within the Casselberry city limits. And Casselberry itself has no ordinance regulating topless dancing

Sheriff Polk's main reason for wanting such activity regulated here is precisely what has caused the battle to close down those businesses in Orange and other counties. Namely, with topless dancing establishments, massage parlors and adult mini-theaters there often comes prostitution

Lap dancing already has hit the scene in Seminole in at least two of the topless clubs. And, according to the owner of one of those establishments who said he opposes lap dancing, a lot of dancing girls who are out of work from Orange seek access to Mexican oil and partnerships County because of the crackdown there, are in a wide variety of industrial and business looking for work here. He said they told him they earned \$200 to \$300 a night in Orange County. He astutely pointed out his dancers earn \$400 to \$500 a week and that anyone who made \$200 to \$300 a

night probably was doing more than dancing.

And with the massage parlors and minitheaters that could locate in Seminole County comes prostitution and drug use, according to police intelligence. Law enforcement officials have said repeatedly many people involved in such activity have underworld affiliation.

Seminole County doesn't need to become another S. Orange Blossom Trail. And the way to prevent that from happening is to establish tight laws before such activity moves into the area. Itcounter difficulty in locating here, rather than the county having to do something about it after they've been here awhile. It's much tougher then.




