**REPORT CURRENT THAT JACK, GENE TO MEET IN FALL**

**Tex Rickard Plans To Have Fair Fight For Championship Regardless Of Outcome Of Elimination Tournament**

NEW YORK, March 10.—Back since the time of the

The big here is that Maloney and Sharkey, lacking a real punch, naturally, will flounder through 15 rounds, causing the populace to become very distrustful. In consequence it will go away from there, thinking of Dempsey as the man he once was and everything will be all to the altar of roses.

Off hand, I would say that, if Rickard ever entertained any plan of this kind he was taking plenty

for granted and that sort of thing is not the old boy's motif. Suppose for example, Sharkey knocked Maloney over in the first minute of play, or vice versa, Rickard then would have first class challenger on his hands and all his alleged plans for Dempsey couldn't get rid of the gent.

Rickard today was in receipt of a telegram from Dempsey in which the ex-champion stated that he no longer was troubled by blood poisoning in his arm and that he would "get to work right away."

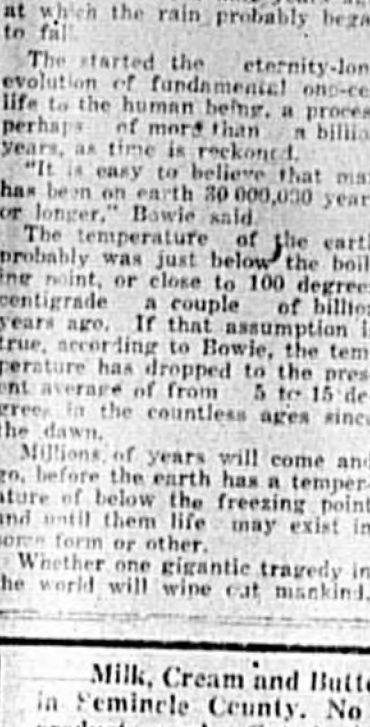

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### ROME WANTS TO SEE AL SMITH AS CHIEF EXECUTIVE

#### Vatican Investigator Tells Cardinals Governor Of New York Is Probable Choice For Next President Of U. S.

ROME, ITALY, Mar. 11.—The Roman Curia, well represented by cardinals, bishops and lesser dignitaries, listened yesterday to a long report on religious and political conditions in the United States and on Romanist prospects for the future. The report was made in the form of a lecture by one Comendatore Silvio D'Amico, who had been sent to the United States as a special observer of the pope on the occasion of the so-called Eucharistic Congress at Chicago.

This man lingered several months after the exhibition in Chicago had come to an end, gathering a lot of supposedly valuable information. He painted a rosy picture of the outlook for Romanism in America, which was greatly relished by the audience.

When he spoke in terms of fervent hope about the chances of "Al" Smith to become the first Catholic President of the United States his listeners cheered wildly. Here is the literal text of the speaker's remarks on the subject "Al" Smith and the coming Presidential election:

"I ask you members of my most distinguished audience to consider what profound change has taken place in the power and standing of our co-religionists in the United States since the days of Monsignor Carroll, the first bishop of Baltimore. Then there were in the United States about 20,000 Catholics. Today Catholicism in that country is entrenched with 20,000,000 members, 100 bishops, 400 parishes, 18,000 churches, 6,000 parochial schools, 1,500 Catholic high schools, 20 universities, 120 seminaries, with organizations of great numbers and corresponding power such as the Knights of Columbus and the Holy Name Society.

"The Mayors of New York and Chicago are Catholics, and now there is in plain view before us a probable Catholic President in the person of Al Smith. He is surely standing on the threshold of the White House.

It was this utterance coming as a climax to the eloquent description, which brought the stormy outburst of the approval led by Cardinal Bonaventura Corretti who has had more or less official experience in the United States where as legate and emissary he served the pope for ten full years. When the applause had died down a little the speaker launched into a description of the American Protestantism which as might be expected was far from flattering.

RALEIGH, N. C., March 11.—(INS)—Swollen streams of eastern North Carolina, fed by last week's two-foot snow and augmented during the past two days by spasmodic rains, today overflowed their banks.

The flood is expected to reach its crest soon weather officials said, and will begin to begin to fall. The Cape Fear River at Elizabethtown, N. C., was reported by the weather bureau here to be five feet above flood stage.

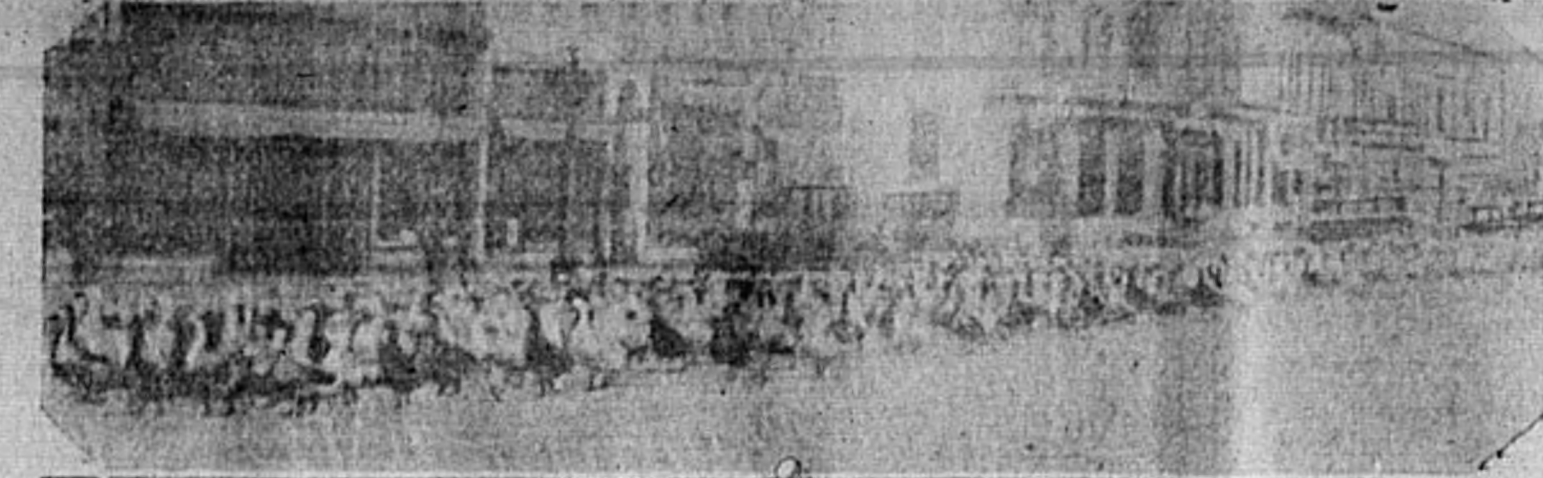

### Plans Are Made To Float Loans For Veterans Of War

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11. (INS)—War veterans who want to borrow on their adjusted compensation certificates are to be accommodated despite Congress' failure to appropriate money for the loans. Gen. Frank T. Hines, director of the Veterans Bureau, reported to President Coolidge today.

Gen. Hines said all arrangements had been completed for financing veterans' loans from existing bureau funds. Premium money on the government insurance policies will provide about 60 per cent of the necessary funds, and the other 40 per cent will be provided through sale of government securities now held by the veterans bureau.

He estimated that loans will be made at the rate of about \$5,000,000 a month.

"We are going to discourage veterans borrowing on their certificates," said Hines, "but if they want the money they can have it."

### U. S. Suggests Naval Pact With 2 Nations

WASHINGTON, March 11.—(INS)—Formal invitations from the United States to Great Britain and Japan to participate in discussion of a three-power naval agreement at Geneva next June probably will go forward from Washington within the next 48 hours, Sir Esmé Howard, the British Ambassador, called at the state department today and is understood to have informed under secretary Grew of Britain's willingness to entertain a formal invitation. Japanese acquiescence, already has been forecast.

### Weather Observer Sees Cold Summer

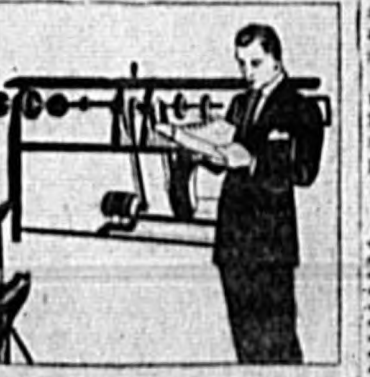
