1 Thessalonians 4:18 reminds us that we are to comfort one another. This is by no means the only place in the Bible that directs us to help bring comfort to our fellow man. The Scripture references are numerous, indeed. We like to think of ourselves as being self-sufficient but we know so well that this is not true. We point to our success in material comforts when we try to prove our point, however, it is about the only direction that we find very convincing. The difficulty is that when we look in other directions we know that there is far too much evidence that we are not up to life and that life will invariably tumble in if we have no more than our creature comforts to bring us peace. One can take only so many tranquilizers before knowing that they may be good for "stop-gaps" purpose, but to live on and on filled with artificial peace is to live a futile life. The hospitals continue to be filled with people who are there for "stress" reasons even though the next few years seem to offer freedom from the threats of lack of food, clothing, shelter, and now the many other things that seemed formerly to be luxuries which are now classified necessities. The old, old story is still true that if we are to have comfort that it must be from God. This is the proven way and should not be resisted. When we are in reflective moods we are almost forced to ask why we do not look and find comfort in Him. The testimony of people through the ages has been that they tried diligently but failed to find freedom from the anxiety scourge until they turned to God. Surely we can agree with Saint Augustine who sought the answer to life in many ways, that are being tried today, only to conclude finally that one could find no rest until he finds it in God. So often we have people tell us that they do not think that it is vital that comfort be sought while so many people are suffering from many deficiencies in their lives. Of course, we do not want to escape in some false security, but the security that people have found effective throughout the years, in our affluent society, has still been in God. What a great help it is to realize that God speaks to us through the Bible. If one has such faith he can then turn to the 23rd Psalm and read it with such healing effect that words fail in describing the result. Even the panic of death is held at bay as one

Hebrew Christian Minister To Be At Sanford Alliance

Dr. A. U. By Harry Johnson Repaving and widening of the controversial Bear Lake Road is expected to be completed in three or four months, depending on the weather, a county official reported today.

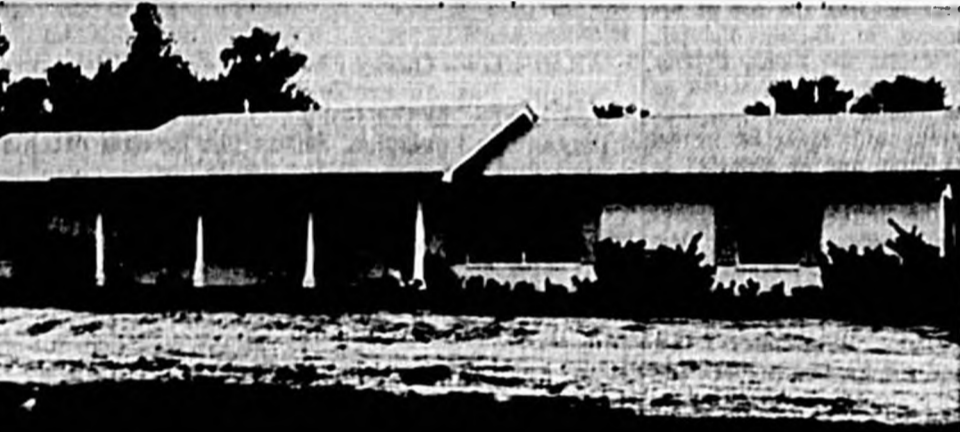

Catron family of 1624 South Bear Lake Road reports they bought their land last year and find 18 inches difference in the survey. The Catrons say they want to build onto their home but cannot meet the requirements of 25 feet from the road due to the new survey.

In it she said: "Unfortunately, the people most generally heard from are those who fall into this category at one time or another. 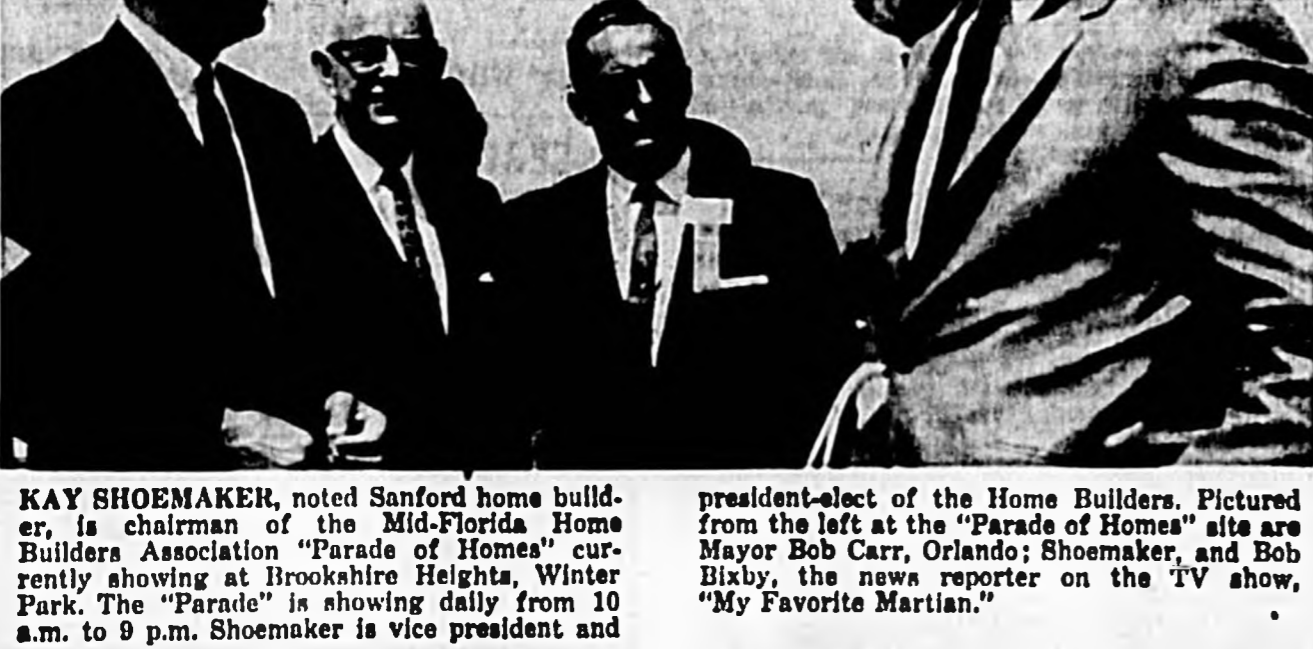

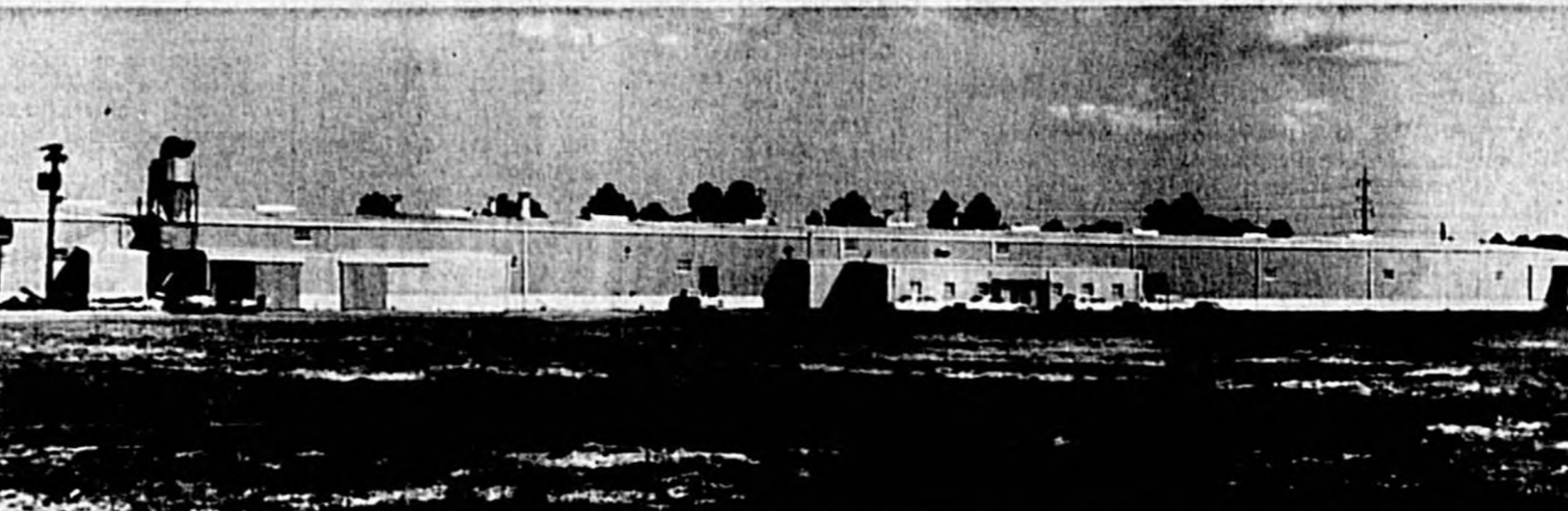
