Acheson did so at the request of members of the House Foreign Affairs Committee. The committee is considering President Truman's proposal to use \$400,000,000 plus military advice and materiel to bolster Greece and Turkey against communist aggression.

Rescue on the High Seas

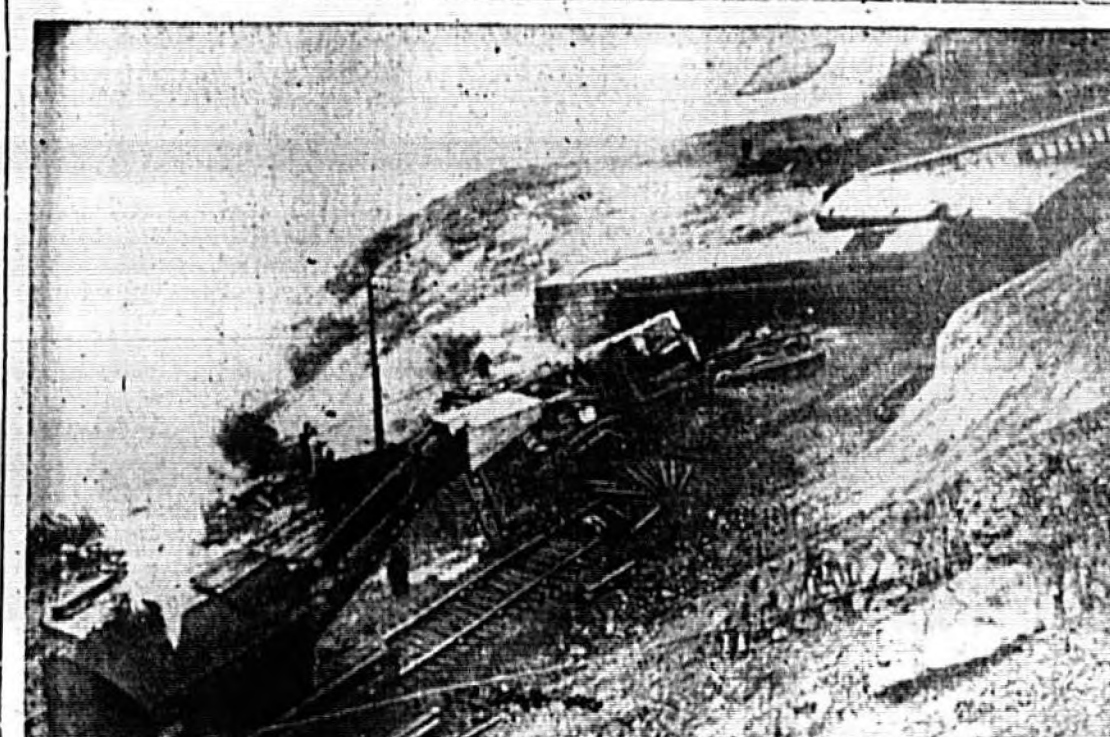

Philippines Sign Military Pact With U.S.

MANILA, Mar. 21—A five-year military assistance pact was signed today between the Philippine government and the United States. The agreement makes American arms, munitions, technical advice and training available to the Philippines and completes a recent pact providing American bases in the islands. In effect, the military pact provides for a permanent United States' defense plans in the Western Pacific.

Plan Given By Marshall For German State

Proposals for a German state, Secretary of State Marshall today called on the council of foreign ministers to start work at once on plans for the creation of a German government. Both Marshall and British Foreign Secretary Bevin presented plans for the organization of a federalized German nation. The proposals visualize a federalized government for Germany which is intended to make it a self-governing, democratic state, Bevin asked for the creation of a two-house legislature similar to the United States Congress, a president without executive powers and strong state rights. Russia is expected to oppose the plan, as the Soviet Union has been working for a central government in Germany.

Report Reveals Guerrillas Aiming To Split Greece

NEW YORK, Mar. 21—The aim of communist bands in Greece is to split Greece proper in half, according to an account by the New York Times of an "authentic report" received in Washington yesterday. The Times did not list the source of the report, which is said also to have placed the strength of armed Greek communist bands at 13,000.

CIO Union Asks Pay Increase At General Motors

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Mar. 21—The CIO Auto Workers Union today formally asked General Motors for a pay raise of 25 and half cents an hour for about 225,000 GM production workers. According to the union, the proposed increase would bring the average wage of production workers to \$1.56 and a half cents an hour and it would cost the corporation about \$2,115,000 a week.

House Committee Approves Bill To Cut Income Taxes

WASHINGTON, Mar. 21—The House today completed legislation on a resolution to cut income taxes. The measure approved by the committee calls for a 30-per cent reduction for small taxpayers and a 20 per cent cut for most others. The bill has been approved by the House Republican Steering Committee. It is a companion of the original bill introduced by Knott, which would have given a straight 20 percent tax reduction on all incomes up to \$30,000.

Speed Boat Racer Is Pilot Of Cruiser At Sanford Dock

The 62-foot cruiser Roman recently docked at the Municipal Pier at Sanford, Fla., today. The vessel, which was piloted by John R. Ryan, was on its way to the United States Coast Guard cutter, the USSC-100, which was on duty at the pier. The Roman was piloted by Ryan, who is a well-known speed boat racer.
