





I have an old poultry yard 50x50 in the back of my lot. It has a heavy growth of castor beans and other vegetation. Is a dark gray sand. Last year I planted beans on it, but they were a failure. I have city water, but the soil doesn't seem to hold moisture at all. Can you tell me how to treat the land so I can raise potatoes, on ions and other home vegetables?

ANSWER: We should suppose by your description that you could raise any kind of home garden vegetables, though you could not expect maximum crop of potatoes, onions or cabbage from such sandy soil. Sandy soils. however, are especially good for beans other than the soil itself. We would deep. In digging down you will note that the upper layer of soil is a darker color than a layer that comes beneath which we call the sub-soil. 




