### Exotic Fruit Freeze Heads Toward Market

NEW YORK, (AP)—Exotic fruits, which formerly only the very wealthy could afford to grow for eating fresh, will soon be available to the average American, says Theodore U. Nelson, head of Southland Product Company.

The only difference there will be between the "millionaire" fruits and the average American's is that the latter will be quick-frozen, Nelson says. Research is well under way on the company's 800 acres of experimental farms in Florida in growing and quick-freezing varieties of fruits that could never be shipped fresh because they are too delicate to stand long hauls.

The Agricultural School at the University of Florida is cooperating.

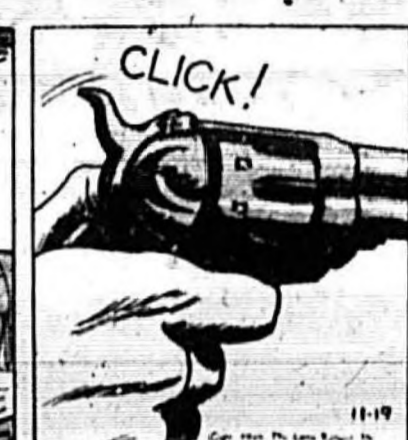

### CIO Calls For Substantial Wage Hike

#### Murray Declares CIO Is Not Threatening Strikes But Wants Clean Bargaining

ATLANTIC CITY, Nov. 21.—(AP)—The CIO convention today unanimously adopted a resolution calling for substantial wage increases—but no exact figures were named.

The move came after Walter Reuther, fiery leader of the auto workers, said that the purchasing power of American worker earnings had been cut 20 percent since January, 1946. Later Reuther said he did not mean to imply that 20 percent would be the amount of the wage increase which his union will demand this winter.

### Chinese Join U. S., Russia For Troop Reports

#### Delegates Tell U. N. Americans Are In Chinese Territory At China's Request

LAKE SUCCESS, Nov. 21, (AP)—The British this afternoon turned thumbs down to a Russian proposal for reports to the United Nations on the disposal of troops on foreign soil. British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin told the U. N. Assembly today that he could not accept the Soviet proposal, as it, Bevin said, would be amended to cover forces on domestic fronts and the whole broad picture of disarmament.

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Nov. 21, (AP)—China declared today it will go along with Russia in the proposal for reports to the United Nations on the disposition of all troops outside home borders.

Koo spoke in the presence of Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov who yesterday indicated the failure of United States troops to leave China is a cause of anxiety.

### More Sugar In '47 Is Predicted Today

MIAMI, Nov. 21, (AP)—The director of the sugar branch of the Agricultural Department, James Marshall, predicted today that there will be more of the sweet stuff available next year.

Marshall said in Miami that consumers may get five pounds more sugar in 1947 than is being rationed to them this year. The 1946 ration entitles everyone to 25 pounds, and includes a 10-pound canning allowance—if you can find it.

### Miami Proposes New Tax On Newspapers

MIAMI, Nov. 21, (AP)—City commissioner H. C. Gardner of Miami today proposed levies on newspapers and magazines, checking accounts and hotel rooms.

Gardner would tax reading matter from one to three cents and he would levy a five-percent tax on hotel bills and an open-end tax on each check in banking transactions.

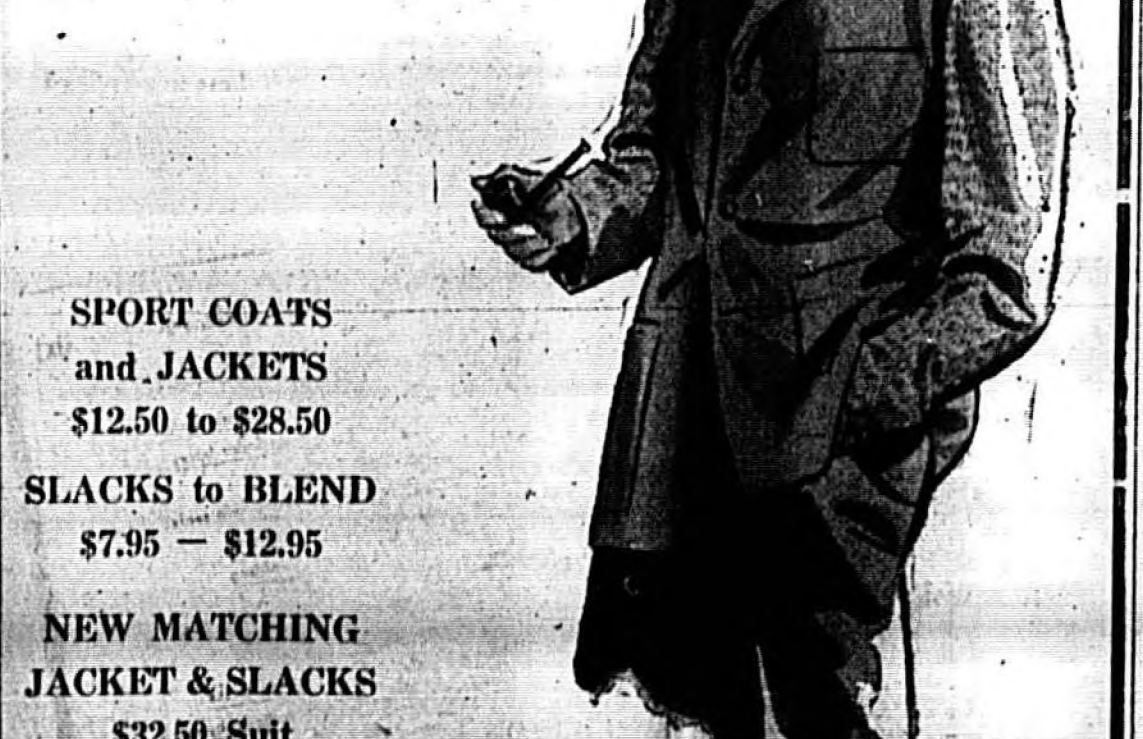

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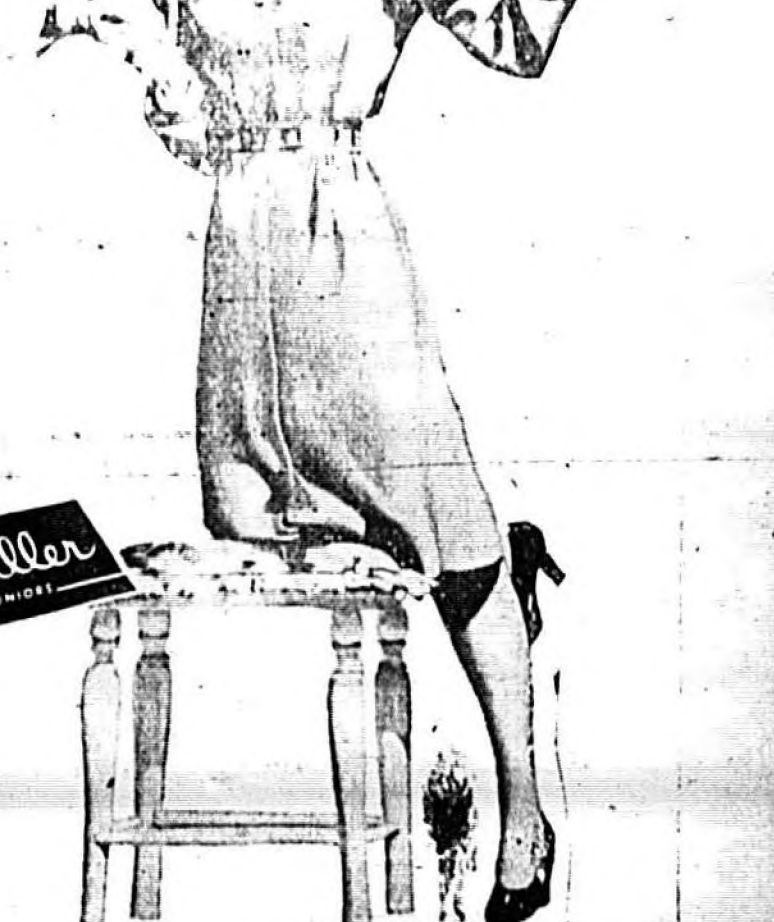

## Willis Anderson To Continue Bid For State Honors

### Leg Injury Makes Piercy Doubtful Starter For Tilt

Willis Anderson, Seminole High's 200 pound flash bidding for all-state recognition will likely lead the Celery Feds in action against the powerful Seabreeze High School Sand Crabs in Daytona Beach tomorrow night.

Coch "Goose" Kettle's Feds have trounced opponents this year while losing two contests by slim margins to East-Central Florida Conference foes, Eustis having turned them back by a razor thin victory, 7 to 6. St. Augustin also dropped the Sanford aggregation by a narrow margin in a bitterly contested battle by a score of 21 to 20.

Anderson scored five times and added three extra points against the weary New Smyrna Barracudas on a rain-soaked field last night to lead the Feds to victory over the second Volusia County eleven this year. Sanford humbled DeLand by a 27 to 19 margin earlier this season.

The fleet Celery Fed halfback, Holly Piercy, is a doubtful starter for the contest against the Crabs since he received a painful knee injury in the clash with New Smyrna. In the event Piercy cannot participate in the battle it is likely that Kettle will start Jan Jenkinson in the left halfback position.

In their practices sessions this week the Feds have engaged in short, offensive and defensive scrimmages, and have trotted through signal drills in an attempt to keep well polished on offensive tactics.

The Fed starting lineup will likely include Kastner and Hardin at the end posts, Ludwig and Jenkinson in the tackle slots, Trapp and Jensen at the guard spots and Reel in the center of the forward wall. Backs will likely include Grantman at the blocking back post, Hut and Piercy in the halfback positions and Anderson at the fullback post.

## Pitchfork And Shovel On Way Out

CHICAGO—Almost lost in news of more world-shaking events during the war years was the decline and fall of the time-honored scow shovel and pitchfork on American farms.

They're still holding on by grace of shortages in power loading and unloading machinery, but many farm experts are agreed these hand tools soon may be as nearly extinct as the whooping crane.

The earliest written record of scow shovels appeared in a book on farming published in England in 1844. A farm adviser of the time suggested a scow shovel was a handy thing to have around a grain bin. The scoops later were made of metal for greater durability when use of the tool spread to the United States.

Shovel production last year hit one of the highest levels in history, but wholesale hardware dealers say that was mostly a result of "catching up" with the lower production during the war.

In 1943 fewer than 5,000,000 shovels and spades were turned out, but in '44 this number more than doubled to better than 11,000,000 and last year it went above 11,640,000 a U. S. census of manufacturers reported.

But now as fast as farm machinery can fill the demand, use of the old callous-makers is expected to fall as rapidly as the change is to be found in farm economics, however, rather than in any disinclination for backbreaking work on the part of the nation's farmers.

A harvesting rig may cost a farmer \$2,500 and a scow shovel \$2.50, but he doesn't see much sense in letting expensive equipment stand idle while he shovels grain by hand. Neither does he want the shovel to create a bottleneck in the speedy grain movement made possible by machines. He applies the same logic to his haymaking activities.

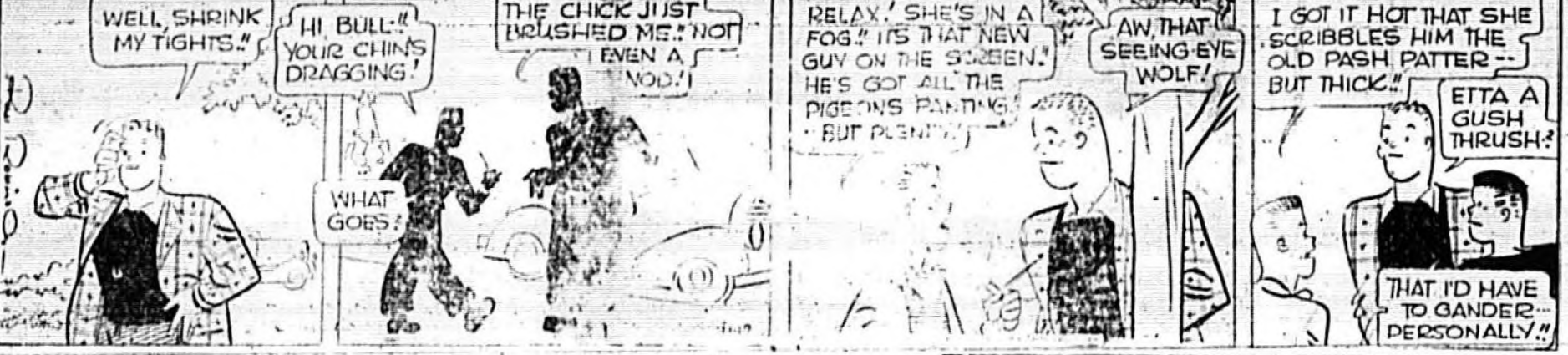

## Murray Re-Elected President Of C.I.O.

### PAC Serves Notice It Will Enter All Important Elections During Year 1947

ATLANTIC CITY, Nov. 22.—(AP)—Philip Murray was re-elected president of the C. I. O. this afternoon at the convention in Atlantic City. The election of Murray was by acclamation.

The C. I. O. winding up its convention today, has adopted a foreign policy resolution which calls for world disarmament and opposes stock-piling of atomic bombs.

There was a slight ripple of excitement in the otherwise unusually placid convention when the foreign policy point came up. In contrast to other resolutions a considerable number of "no" votes were cast.

The vice president of the wholesale and retail employees union, Jack Altman, sought to amend the resolution to read that dictatorship — not merely fascism — should be condemned. He maintained that all the United Nations, not just the United States, should be urged to break relations with Spain and Argentina.

Altman argued "Soviet Russia made a pact with Hitler once. How do we know it won't make a pact with Franco?"

His suggestions were turned aside and there was no further debate on the question.

On this final day of a four-day meeting, the convention also continued the CIO Political Action Committee. It served notice that the PAC will enter every important city and state election in 1947.

## Britain Is Not Satisfied With Roumanian Poll

### Russia, Meanwhile Hails Result As Win For Democracy

LONDON, Nov. 22, (AP)—A British Foreign Office spokesman charged today that the Roumanian election in Bucharest was neither fair nor free. He added that the question of British relations with Roumania now is under consideration. The spokesman was asked whether the withdrawal of British recognition would affect the signing of the peace treaty with Roumania. He replied that the British government aimed at concluding peace treaties only with recognized governments.

Meanwhile, the election in which the Communist emerged victorious was hailed in Moscow as a victory for Roumanian democracy. Soviet news dispatches from Bucharest claimed that the result showed the Roumanian people's approval of their nation's foreign policy.

## Wreckage Of U. S. Plane Is Sighted

PARIS, Nov. 22, (AP)—It was announced officially this afternoon that the wreckage of a lost American Army transport plane has been found in the Swiss Alps. The announcement by Orly Field officials said that all 11 persons that went down with the plane are alive.

The wreckage was sighted 12 miles southeast of Interlaken, Switzerland. Supplies have been dropped and planes are circling the area to mark the spot.

Word reaching Grenoble, France, said that a United States patrol plane crashed on a mountain peak. The plane may have been one of those which had been searching for the wreckage of the transport plane in the Swiss Alps.
