Fishing Adventure May Be Last

Mrs. Dorothy Jordan, 72, of Winter Park, got her first "plane" ride just before midnight Saturday and it's one ride she won't forget Mrs. Jordan and her 84-year-old fishing companion, John E. Smith, also of Winter

Park, were plucked by a rescue helicopter from their 16-foot boat marooned in a mass of water hyacinths on Lake Jessup near Black Hammock Fish Camp.

Both retirees told sheriff's deputies and Oviedo emergency unit crewmen they 'weren't scared" when they found their boat blocked by the wind-whipped hyacinths about 5 p.m. when they tried to head for the fish camp with their catch of four speckled perch. Fishermen on shore 100 yards away heard the pair's calls for help but were unable to get to their boat with an airboat because of the tightly packed hyacinths.

The Sheriff's Department was notified and during next six hours rescuers tried to pull the boat to shore with a winch but a rope that they had attached to the boat became dangerously

policeman Kelly Fore was dropped into the ishing boat with a portable radio from the hovering Orange County Sheriff's Department Rescue One helicopter and as the temperature dropped into the mid-50s on the wind-swept lake, the anglers were hoisted into the 'copter in a basket-type stretcher and ferred to shore. Seated in an emergency van after the rescue, Mrs. Jordan told officers, "We had

wrapped up for the night." Using a sheet of plastic and a beach umbrella to shield them from the wind, the elderly fishermen had esigned themselves to a night on the water. As she returned Polk's jacket, also dropped from the 'copter, and gulped down a cup of hot coffee Mrs. Jordan commented on her "first plane ride" and noted that in her 15 years of ishing in the area she had been blocked in by hyacinths once before. 

Ford, Echeverria Meet

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Ford left here at dawn today enroute to his first visit outside the United States since becoming the nation's chief executive. With oil and economic problems promising to dominate their talks, Ford set aside eight hours for his first handsacrossthe-border meeting with Mexican President Luis

Ford was flying to Nogales, Ariz., from Washington to meet Echeverria before embarking on a lengthy round of substantive discussions at meeting sites in both countries.

Kent State Jury Selection

CLEVELAND, Ohio (AP) - Jury selection begins today in the trial of eight former Ohio National Guardsmen charged with civil rights violations in the 1970 Kent State University shootings. The eight were indicted by a federal grand jury last March 29. They are accused of violating the civil rights of four students who were killed and nine others who were wounded when Guardsmen opened fire on campus demonstrators May 4, 1970, U.S. District Court officials summoned 125 prospective jurors to appear today and said more will be called if necessary.

Watergate Cases Closing

WASHINGTON (AP) - With attention focused on the Watergate cover-up trial, the special prosecutor's office is quietly winding up its business and preparing to close its doors by next spring. Additional charges probably will be brought, particularly for violations of campaign contributions laws, and there will be a final report, but the cover-up trial clearly represents the climax of the work of the unique office created to deal with the Watergate scan-

Ford Backs Rocky

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford is standing by his nomination of Nelson A. Rockefeller, declaring, "I'm still convinced he would make a good vice president."

Ford, fielding questions from five newsmen aboard Air Force One late Saturday, was asked whether any conservative Republicans had urged him to withdraw the increasingly controversial nomination. "I wouldn't say anybody se-

riously," the President responded, implying that such advice had been received. Standing in shirtsleeves in the aisle of the plane as it brought him home from a campaign trip to Louisville, Ky., Ford held news conference.

Ford said he expected Rockefeller's nomination to be confirmed before the President's planned trip to Japan next month. This would seem to be out of the question since Ford tentatively plans to leave the country Nov. 17 and Congress does not return from its election recess until the following day. Meanwhile, Rockefeller was described by a prominent Senate Democrat as "a man who has great experience, tre-


