

# Galabow And Minor To Hook Up In Real Duel Tomorrow; Feds Lose To Leesburg, 3-1

One of the season's best pitching duels involving Sam Galabow of the Sanford Celeryfeds and The Minor of the Cocoa Indians is in prospect for local fans who visit Municipal Park tomorrow afternoon.

These two youngsters will be pitted against each other in a Central Florida Baseball League game that is scheduled to start at 7:30 o'clock.

For the Indians, it will be another opportunity to advance further toward the league lead and at least keep abreast with the Leesburg Islanders, with whom they were tied for second place today.

For the Feds, it will be a test of the five new players who arrived Monday and an opportunity for the fans to size up their talents with the view to getting a line on what may be expected for the remainder of the first half.

Manager Bill Cobb, victim of two errors and a ball game at Leesburg yesterday is ready to give the new men every opportunity to produce. In yesterday's game at Leesburg, four of the five had their chance, with some fans declaring that they will fill the slot without trouble just as soon as they get their bearings.

Since Manager Cobb has released Ed Levey, Walter Yowell and Jim Mabley, and because Joe Barnes still is on the ailing list with a throat infection, the starting line-up tomorrow probably

will be as follows:  
Askew 2b, Burch cf, Cates 3b, Burkhardt c, Mason 1b, Reed lf, Caldwell cf, Walker ss, and Galabow p.

Fans are loud in their praise of the work yesterday of Burch, outfielder who may be called back to Mississippi any day. He rapped out two hits in four tries and hit two line drives that were caught by Baresi on his other trips. In the field, he is credited with one error but it was on a ball which some observers say should have been scooped up by the shortstop before it got into center field.

Jack Reed promises to lead the Feds to a victory tomorrow. The veteran, labeled "Evolution" by his fan followers, is just about in shape after a season of teaching at Ocoee and, since he taught Tige almost all he knows about pitching, there is a possibility that Jack will be able to smack the youngsters offerings in every direction to lead the Feds to that long sought victory.

While the Feds and Indians are playing here, the Leesburg Islanders will be at DeLand with the Reds. Jack Hogan, former umpire, has been signed by DeLand to replace Lacrot in the outfield. Lacrot will do the catching from now on. Gene Connell having been released.

Unfair To The Taxpayer

Mr. Frank Evans' disclosure at the City Commission meeting Monday night that certain important business properties are escaping taxation is indicative of a condition which has existed in this city since the closing days of the boom, steadily growing worse until the time has come when it must be corrected if any taxes at all are to be collected hereafter, in this city.

It seems that at least four of the most important business properties on First Street having both stores and offices for rent, have paid no taxes, either to the city, or to the state and county, since 1929 or 1927. One of them is reported as owing \$28,462.48 in delinquent taxes. Another one is \$13,580.61 in arrears; another one \$17,851.22 behind; and still another, \$11,095.93 behind. Not only have the owners of these buildings paid no taxes for the past eight or nine years, but they apparently are making no effort to settle their delinquencies or to pay up in the future.

Meanwhile, other stores and office buildings have been paying their taxes and doing their full part toward the maintenance of the schools, fire and police departments, and the operation of the other departments of the city and county governments. At the same time they have been forced to compete for tenants with buildings on which no taxes are being paid. Plainly enough, any building which pays no taxes at all can well afford to rent its space to tenants at considerably less than another building having to pay four or five thousand dollars a year to the city and county governments.

It seems reasonable to assume that the ultimate result of this situation will be that every other business property will stop paying taxes. Either property owners, still paying taxes, will come to the conclusion that there is no reason why they should pay taxes if nothing is going to be done about it for not paying. Or all their tenants will finally move out, going into the non-taxing buildings where rents are cheaper, and making it impossible for those who would pay taxes, to do so.

It is perfectly clear that the taxpayer is being discriminated against in favor of the tax-dodger. This is a situation which should be taken cognizance of at the earliest possible moment and some means found either of forcing tax payment, or of closing buildings on which taxes are no longer paid. It is not fair that the tax-dodger should be favored at the sacrifice of the taxpayer.

Easy Money
