

Gurney Hits Demos; Claims He's Innocent

Tuesday, April 30, 1974—Sanford, Florida 32771

Fla., says his indictment on a charge of failing to report campaign contributions resulted from a "political Pearl Harbor attack" by Democrats.

"I am absolutely innocent," Gurney, 60, said in a Monday statement in which he confirmed published reports that a Leon County grand jury had voted to indict him for allegedly violating a Florida election law. "This is deliberate political harassment of the basest sort." Gurney's Florida attorney, C. Harris Dittmar of Jacksonville. was to pick up the indictment on the misdemeanor charge today





Mrs. Eisenhower said Monday the acquittal of former Cabinet members John N. Mitchell and Maurice H. Stans has tarnished Dean's credibility. Dean, who testified that he had had conversations with President Nixon about the Watergate cover-up, was a prosecution witness at the Mitchell-Stans trial.

Bicentennial is celebrated in special tax breaks for the movie industry, which his campaign 1976, one stalwart figure of the aides used to squeeze political support from Hollywood stars in This is strongly suggested in confidential campaign memos, which we have just uncovered

> The memos also speak of using actress Ali MacGraw to lure Henry Kissinger to Hollywood, where he might be persuaded to whisper pro-Nixon sentiments into the ears of film celebrities. "We should ask Henry," suggested one memo, "to say something like, 'It would make me very happy if you could see your way clear to help re-elect President Nixon. I have great faith in Richard Nixon and I know you do, too.!"

As it happened, Kissinger flew off to Peking instead of Hollywood, and Pat Nixon rushed in the last minute to woo the film folks. But the tax benefits, apparently, had the best effect. The scenario that the Nixon forces wrote for the political onquest of Hollywood is revealed in confidential memos that were shuffled between ex-Attorney General John Mitchell, ex-White House staff chief H.R. Haldeman and campaign aides Jeb Magruder, Herbert Porter and Fred LaRue.

The memos begin on Oct. 18, 1971, with a complaint from Porter to Mitchell that the campaign was "short of lists of celebrities." Porter suggested seeking celebrities from the movie industry which, he confided, was deeply in Nixon's debt.

He explained that the President had met in San Clemente with the industry's top brass on April 5, 1971. They had pleaded...for some sort of tax relief," related Porter. The President obligingly had promised "he would take a look at the 'Shortly thereafter," triumphantly reported Porter, "the

Then Mitchell was supposed to ask the movie producers, as a uid pro quo, how to "maximize celebrity participation in the 1972

Every precaution was taken to keep the meeting secret. not fear any unfavorable publicity from such a gathering." Attending were Warner Brothers' Dick Zanuck, MCA's Mike Maitland, Universal's Taft Schreiber, and Universal Television's Frank Price, Columbia's Peter Guber and Stu Irwin Jr. Zanuck was named chairman of the group.


It was agreed that Henry Kissinger would be the best drawing card to attract movie stars to a political affair. Because Kissinger had once dated Ali MacGraw and was still close to the actress and her then-husband, Paramount's Bob Evans, Porter suggested using "Evans' and MacGraw's friendship with Henry Kissinger" to bring the foreign policy czar to Hollywood.

But there was one problem. "Teddy Kennedy asked (Evans) at a cocktail party recently if he could count on Evans' support if Teddy made a run for the Presidency." Porter wrote to Haldeman and Magruder. "Evans committed his support to Kennedy," Nevertheless, Porter thought the Hollywood moguls might bring Evans "into our camp."

Kissinger finally agreed to put in an appearance in Hollywood on June 17, 1972. Porter wrote Mitchell enthusiastically that "if Kissinger could be persuaded to stay an extra day, it would be additional icing on the cake."

The grand soiree was held at Taft Schreiber's luxurious Beverly Hills home. Among the 150 guests, one of those present told us, were 130 major celebrities. They included John Wayne, Art Linkletter, Jack Benny, Charlton Heston, Ronald Regan, Fred MacMurray, Irene Dunn, Jimmy Stewart, Edgar Bergen and Clint Eastwood, to name a few. McCarty Claims Self-Defense FORT PIERCE, Fla. (AP) - Daniel Thomas McCarty III, son of a former Florida governor, says he fired a pistol at a friend in self-defense during a scuffle. "I was afraid of him," McCarty testified Monday dur-

ing his second-degree murder trial in the shooting of Paul Soloway, 34, was found dead Jan. 24 in the living room of McCarty's home. McCarty, 32, said he was about to go to sleep when Solo-

way came to his house about 5 a.m. and wanted to talk. He said the two talked about ten minutes. McCarty said he was ushering Soloway to the door when he grabbed McCarty around the neck and threatened: "I'm going to kill you."

In the scuffle, McCarty said his glasses were knocked askew and he couldn't see properly so he grabbed for the pistol in the pocket of his pants. "I just shot until the gun was empty," McCarty said.

Soviet Jet Lands Secretly

MIAMI (AP) - Under a shroud of secrecy designed to avert protests, a Soviet jetliner slipped in and out of Miami International Airport late Sunday night. The four-engine Aeroflot Ilyushin 62 picked up 162 members of two Florida professional groups on a charter flight for a week-long visit in the Soviet Union.

An airport spokesman said the "very low profile" of the visit was kept to avoid antagonizing the Miami Cuban community. Miami Cubans have picketed visiting Soviet ships in the past. It was the first visit to Miami by a Soviet commercial

Yankeetown and Inglis. The blasting operations, continuing from morning until night, were causing residents to lose sleep and had caused severe damage to homes and property including cracks in concrete block walls, house foundations and windows, the suit charged. Shevin also said that the blasting operations had damaged wells in the area and affected water quality.







Most teams don't run the way Boston does. Most of them don't even want to try. They have too many superstars who have to get their points on the board before they can think of winning a game.

It's a case of five good men being able to beat two great men. A little simple mathematics says it's so. Not always, but I'll wager the percentage is something better than four out of seven times, which is exactly what it takes to put the NBA Championship back in Boston.





EPA Still Witholding Sewer Grant

LONGWOOD-The U.S Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) still has not released the promised federal grants of \$5.32 million for the city's proposed 7.5 million gallon daily capacity regional sewer plant and interceptor system, Mayor Norman Floyd said today.

Floyd said \$3.4 million of the grant was to pay for 75 per cent of the sewer plant expansion from its current 1.2 million gallons daily capacity and \$1,917,000 is for the planned interceptors on Montgomery Road to the plant.

Also held up in the EPA Washington office is an \$813,000 federal grant for a Longwood interceptor to connect with the Altamonte Montgomery Road

The interceptor grants may be increased with rising prices, Floyd said, while the sewer plant grant is for the fixed amount.

Most of the balance in construction costs in Altamonte Springs is to be financed through federal loans.

Under construction currently are sewer lines in the northern section of Altamonte Springs.
