WASHINGTON (AP) - House Democrats will try to override President Ford's veto of a \$45-billion laborhealth, education and welfare bill that would provide funds to numerous social programs, including the remnants of President Lyndon Johnson's war on poverty

Ford vetoed the bill on Dec. 19, saying it would exceed his budget by nearly \$1 billion and claiming the measure would "add significantly to the already burdensome

The House override vote today was regarded as a major test of Democratic ability to overcome Ford's insistence on tighter budgets

Democratic strategists predicted Monday they would need 30 Republican votes in order to get the two-thirds needed to override the veto.

Colby has acknowledged that he too was once an anonymous source for a newspaper story exposing CIA Colby and other Ford administration officials accused

the House panel Monday of violating its oath by disclosing topsecret intelligence operations contained in the committee's final report which was to be released this Friday but which was leaked to the news media over the

"The committee seems neither able to keep secrets nor its agreement," Colby told a news conference in one of his last official acts as head of the CIA.

### Arrest Rulings May Differ

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two Supreme Court justices who joined in upholding the right of police to make arrests without warrants in public places have indicated their view may be different when the court considers an arrest made inside a home. Justices Lewis F. Powell Jr. and Potter Stewart filed

separate concurring opinions when the court ruled 6 to 2 on Monday that police may make a warrantless arrest in public if they have reasonable grounds. Both Powell and Stewart said specifically that they were not ruling on whether an officer must obtain a warrant before he can enter a private place to make an arrest. That question will be presented to the court later this term when the justices review a decision of the U.S. Circuit Court in Philadelphia.

### **PLO Threatens Escalation** After U.S. Palestine Veto

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The Palestine Liberation Organization threatened to intensify its armed struggle against Israel following an American veto of a U.N. Security Council resolution calling for an independent state in Palestine for the Palestinians and Israeli withdrawal from all territory it occupied in the 1967 Six-Day War.

The 15-nation council ended a two-week debate on the Arab-Israeli dispute Monday night with a 9 to 1 vote in favor of the resolution. But the lone negative vote was cast by the United States, as expected, and constituted a veto. Britain, Sweden and Italy abstained, while China and Libya did not participate in the voting on the ground that he resolution was not hard enough on Israel. Voting for he resolution were France, Japan, the Soviet Union and the six cosponsors: Guyana, Pakistan, Panama, Romania, Tanzania and Benin (Dahomey).

Immediately after the vote, the United States dispel any idea that a new Middle East crisis was imminent. They pledged continuing efforts to achieve an

### Foreign Aid Needed To Curb Drugs

President Ford is wheeling out bigger guns in the fight against illicit drug traffic. The program he announced recently will require some new legislation which he will propose to Congress early this year, but he has already made some moves on his own which could open a new front in this long-

Mr. Ford says he has told leaders of Mexico, Colombia and Turkey that the solution to our drug problem is going to require their cooperation. The link between U.S. foreign policy and the narcotics traffic on American street-corners deserves more,

Heroin traffic in New York City dropped off noticeably when the Turkish government invoked a ban in 1973 on the growing of opium poppies. The fact that Turkey is now permitting opium production again - for economic if not political reasons - has raised the certainty that Turkish opium refined into heroin will once again appear on the drug scene here.

Meanwhile, however, the dearth of Turkish opium has created a new illicit drug industry in Mexico. Where in 1972 Mexican heroin accounted for only 20 per cent of the drug seized in the United States, it makes up 70 per cent of the seizures today, and after a brief respite heroin use in our population is once more on the rise. It is no secret amounts which are considerably less than their that the Mexican state of Sinaloa has become a major source of heroin now entering our country Mexico also remains a chief source of amphetamines and barbiturates manufactured under a cloak of legality but intended for illicit markets.

The United States has only itself to blame for the fact that parcotics, when available, will find a ready demand on our streets. As Mr. Ford recognizes, the administration of our own drug enforcement programs needs reform, and our laws need to threaten drug traffickers with the certainty of stiffer penalties. However, we cannot neglect the fact that the drug traffic is an international affair.

Mexican border cities felt an immediate economic pinch when the U.S. government conducted the brief "Operation Intercept" in 1969, subjecting everyone who crossed the border from Mexico to intensive search for smuggled drugs. Such tactics are exasperating as well as costly, but they demonstrate how the persistence of narcctic smuggling invites measures which would not be necessary if drugs were not reaching the border in even longer to be closed.

U.S. relations with Turkey are still strained as a result of the dispute over Cyprus, which may or may not affect the willingness of the Turks to monitor their opium production more closely. There is always the hope that detente diplomacy can lead the Chinese Communists to do more about drugs flowing from the "Golden Triangle" of Asia. However, Mexico has more to lose than any other nation from allowing drug-smuggling to impede relations with the United States.


Operation Intercept gave way to a program called Operation Cooperation, linking U.S. and Mexican enforcement efforts. The growing presence of "Mexican brown" on the back-alley heroin market suggests that President Ford is on the right track in reminding Mexico of what cooperation really means.

And Mr. Alexander is not apologizing, either. It's not his fault, he says. Between them, Congress and the IRS are making a good case for junking the whole system and starting over.
